REHABILITATION RECOMMENDATIONS: Damages incurred as the result of suppression activities will be mitigated under this plan.

SPECIFIC REHABILITATION GUIDELINES

All private and public roads used for fire suppression: keep roads watered to reduce dust and maintain packed surface.

Remove berms on roads, dozer lines, and hand lines as needed to drain.

Waterbreak specifications (All Divisions)

Dozer & Hand lines: Space waterbreaks at approximately 50 feet on steep pitches (>50% gradient) and 75 to 100 feet for the remainder of the dozer and hand lines.

Roads: Break outside berms at natural drainages if berm created by suppression efforts.

*** ALL STATE RESOURCES WILL COMPLETE THEIR OWN EFC-33 ***

Supervisory personnel are to identify resources excess to the needs of the incident at the earliest opportunity. If possible, this should be done within 24 hours in advance of a proposed release.

The release priorities are:

1. Hire Equipment
2. Out of CAL FIRE region resources
3. Out of unit CAL FIRE resources

The needs of the incident and off incident issues may necessitate the modification of these priorities in certain cases.

Information concerning surplus resources will be forwarded to the Howard Forest Expanded. This information will include the resource name, request number the ETD and the ETA. Additionally, the availability of the resource for a new assignment will be provided.

The Demob process will be started and completed at Howard Forest Headquarters ECC Expanded. All equipment assigned to off road operations must be safety inspected and washed prior to release. Safety inspections and vehicle washing will be completed with the Ground Support Unit Leader, Donny Arms.

Supplies and PPE will be checked out and traded out at the Howard Forest warehouse prior to release from the North Incident.

The Demobilization process needs to be completed by each resource prior to release back to their Unit or home. The Finance Section will be the last stop in the Demob process at Howard Forest Expanded. Once the form ICS-221 has been completed and turned into to the Demob unit, the resource will be released, reassigned or held as determined by North Ops with the exception of hired equipment.

All resources will meet any agency specific and/or Department of Motor Vehicle requirements on travel per day or other requirements concerning travel and rest.

Any Agency resource encountering a delay traveling to their home unit will contact the appropriate home unit or incident and advise them of the day.




