**WEATHER/CLIMATOLOGY DISCUSSION:** An extremely dry winter and spring has led to mid-summer conditions in May. Large diameter fuel moisture levels are typical of what you would see in August. Energy Release Component of the National Fire Danger Rating System will return to historic high levels for mid May and at the 75th percentile for all the ERC's recorded for this area. The weather trend for the next 5 days is for warming and drying, which will return burning conditions to mid-summer levels despite the last few days of cloudiness and high humidity.

**FIRE BEHAVIOR DISCUSSION:**  
Short Range (Today, Tomorrow):

Today will be the beginning of a warming trend, the fuels will be in sunlight for the first time and the fine fuels will begin the drying process. There will be little change in the heavier down and dead fuels as the moisture over the last few days will not register any change in either direction over the period. These 1000 hour and 10,000 hour fuels are at mid-summer levels and will contribute to combustion at the head of an advancing fire.

Medium Range (3-7 Days): Below is the 10- hour timelag fuel moisture forecast for the next 7 days.

The downward trend in 10 hour fuels 1/4"-1" in diameter is clear. They will have recovered most of the dryness that was the cause of the day 1 Panther fire run. The Climate Prediction Center is showing a 50% chance for temperatures to be above normal through the period and for precipitation to be near normal (which is to say none).

**Long Range/Seasonal (8+ Days):** The outlook for 8-14 days from CPC is for temperatures to be above normal and precipitation to be normal (none). Fuels in the 10 and 100-hour category 1/4"-3" will dry significantly during this period due to lower relative humidity and extended periods of sunlight, especially on south and southwest facing slopes. Long distance spotting and single tree torching will accompany any new start. Normal upslope up-canyon winds will threaten the upper Cement Creek, Dead Horse Creek, Panther Creek and Deer Creek drainages, especially on south and west aspects.

**Smoke Concerns:**  
No smoke problems are anticipated.

**Reassessment Criteria:**  
If any strong winds appear in the forecast period this assessment will have to be re-examined. The amount of heat still inside the burn will be a threat to the line for several weeks.

### SAFETY

- Obtain a spot weather forecast either by phone or by internet web page from the National Weather Service Forecast Office in Sacramento each day. Fire Weather desk (916)-979-3045.
- Post a fire weather watch and verify that observed conditions match the forecast. If not contact the NWS Sacramento office for an updated forecast.
- Observe and monitor surrounding areas for initial attack activity. When IA activity picks up, anticipate greater fire activity in the Panther Fire area as well.
