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



INPUTS

WEATHER SUMMARY:

The weather will continue to moderate with cooling temperatures and rising humidity. The temperature will be 70-78 during the day and 45-53 overnight. Relative humidity will be 28-35 percent during the daytime and 50-58 percent. There is a slight chance of rain, but it will not be a wetting rain. **Winds will be southwest 10-15 mph with gusts to 25 mph in the valleys and slopes and 15-20 mph with gusts to 30 mph on the ridges.**

OUTPUTS

FIRE BEHAVIOR

GENERAL:

The decrease in temperature and increase in humidity today will do little to moderate the fire activity. The grass and light fuels will be affected by slightly decreasing their receptiveness to fire brands and the rate of spread. The lag time for larger fuels is longer than the effect of the increased humidity and will still readily burn. Due to the drought the brush and trees are at critical fuel moisture levels and will produce large number of fire brands when actively burning. This high number of fire brands will increase the potential for spotting in the lighter fuels, even with higher humidity levels. The fuels and winds have been the main carrier of fire and with the increase in wind the fire has potential to grow to the northeast. Watch for trees near the fires edge for torching and casting embers across the line. Spotting from the brush will be over ¼ mile and from trees up to 1 mile. The wind can be affected locally by the terrain creating an eddy effect changing the direction of the wind over small areas.

SPECIFIC:

The northeast portion in the Mokelumne River drainage will be active with a strong southwest wind increasing spread to the east. The drainage splits into two main branches with a dominant ridge in-between. The fire has progressed to the east on the south side of the south fork of the Mokelumne River. There is a high potential for spot fires on the ridge dividing the south fork and the middle fork of the Mokelumne River, with spread into the drainage of the north fork of the Mokelumne River. The east side of the fire has transition areas from trees and brush into grass fields. Spotting into these fields is a strong possibility with the increasing wind. These spots will have a moderate to rapid rate of spread and will transition again into brush and timber. The south portion of the fire is in the grass oak woodland, which has the high potential for spot fires, however the wind should be more favorable for control efforts. There is still potential for a spot to cross the line with the increasing wind and get into the San Antonio Creek drainage. The east side of the fire is also in the grass oak woodland and will have favorable winds during and changing directions across the line in the overnight hours. Spotting potential will be reduced in the overnight hours but is still a strong possibility.

AIR OPERATIONS

Air operations will be limited until the smoke lifts out of the area.

SAFETY

The cooler weather will not have a dramatic change in the fire behavior due to the lag time in the heavier fuels. Continue to monitor your surroundings for spot fires. Continually monitor the unburned areas for spot fires.

Fuels and Fire Behavior Advisory

Sierra Nevada Mountains and Foothills

September 9, 2015



Subject: Four years of drought has significantly increased the number of dead and dying conifers and oaks across portions of the Sierra Nevada and surrounding foothills. This has resulted in explosive fire behavior conditions and wildfire's resistance to control. Fire fighter safety is a major concern, as well as continued risk to the public in the affected forested areas.

Discussion: It is estimated that well over 5 million trees have died across the Sierra and Sequoia National Forests as well as in the nearby foothills. This is due to a combination of a multi-year drought and significant bark beetle infestation. This number is up from last year when approximately 300,000 trees had died. The deceased trees have immediately increased the amount of standing dead fuel load, which will contribute to extreme fire behavior in the affected areas. **Fire Managers/Firefighters should plan accordingly and be vigilant for flash fires through dead crowns.** Risk to ground suppression personnel and equipment from a greater likelihood of falling and/or weakened trees is also a major concern.

Departure from normal conditions: Normally, conifer forests across the southern and central Sierra experience something less than five percent mortality. In the last six months a substantial number of conifer stands have displayed a ten-fold increase in the number of dead and dying trees. It has been suggested that the current situation mimics the early stages of what occurred in the Southern California national forests between 2001 and 2005. The latest Energy Release Component (ERC) values are all near the 90th percentile for this time of year and are expected to increase further through the second week of September. **Recent fire behavior on the Rough Incident underscores the seriousness of the current situation.** Flash fires, long range spotting, and extreme rates of spread will continue to be common characteristics on new and existing incidents in the coming weeks.

Concerns to Firefighters and the Public:

- Fire Managers/Firefighters need to plan for and anticipate the potential for explosive fire behavior conditions in the affected areas **even during non-critical weather events.**
- Fire personnel and the public should be aware of the increased fall hazard and should seek to mitigate appropriately.

Mitigation Measures: At the onset of a wildfire event, history shows a quick and effective initial suppression response is the first best tool in suppressing unwanted wildfire.

- Fire Managers/ Firefighters should consider suppression options and safe access prior to an event.
- Agency Administrators need to ensure the concerns brought forward in this advisory are included in all suppression and or prescribed fire operations.
- Review the most current [Southern California 7-day Significant Fire Potential](#) along with the [Monthly and Seasonal Outlooks](#).

CAL FIRE INCIDENT MANAGEMENT TEAM WATER USAGE PLAN

California Drought Emergency

The following shall be considered and implemented by all fire resources as a means to provide maximum efficiencies when utilizing water resources, while minimizing the impacts to private and public water supplies. Accountability shall be maintained for all water supplies that are utilized and care should be applied to ensure proper replacement and/or reimbursement to the supplier/ owner.

Fireline personnel- (During mop up operations)

- Use of Pencil Hose and Garden Nozzles with Shut-Offs.
- Use of Back pumps.
- Dry Mop-up and consolidation of heavy fuels to areas where they can burn out safely
- Locate/ Relocate Firelines to lighter fuels or natural barriers when safe.
- Set up and use portable tanks in anticipation of longer transport times for Water Tenders.
- Use of foams, gels and other water enhancers.
- Evaluate need to mop up in excess of 200 feet from fireline

Road Maintenance and Repair-

- Monitor and water roads only when and where needed.
- Water when most effective (evening and nights).
- Use chemical treatments when available (Magchloride, Omni bind ect).
- Consider use of tertiary or treated water (sp)

Aviation Operations-

- Use of Gels, Foams and Retardants. Set up portable plants.
- Consider Blivits and Pencil hose for interior mop up operations as opposed to numerous bucket drops.
- Establish and use pre-use agreements for existing and known water sources.
- Use large watershed dip sites when able. Minimize use of small, static ponds and lakes.
- Maintain accountability of water used and locations of dip sites.
- Evaluate need for interior bucket drops

Private Water Supplies-

- Notify property owner as early as possible.
- Minimize usage and develop alternative water supplies when and where appropriate.
- Track usage (meter, 214 form) and develop a plan to replace water.
- Make arrangements for reimbursement and damage claims if needed.

Public/ Municipal Water Supplies-

- Notify Agency as soon as possible and request a representative to the incident.
- Identify fill areas and request metering devices. Place on incident map.
- Use alternative or reclaimed water sources when available. Place on incident map.
- Make arrangements for reimbursement and damage claims if needed.

Management and Supervision-

- Use leaders intent and establish Water Conservation as an Management Objective.
- Consider complexity of water use on incidents. Establish a Water Supply Group Supervisor to coordinate additional resources to support the incident needs.
- Complete the Water Usage Report daily and turn in to Finance
- Review this check list and brief daily.

GENERAL INFORMATION

The Demobilization Plan is developed to facilitate the orderly removal and checkout of resources on the incident. By definition, surplus personnel are available for release if they have rested for a minimum of **8 hours**.

GENERAL GUIDELINES

- o **NO RESOURCES WILL LEAVE THE INCIDENT UNTIL AUTHORIZED TO DO SO BY THE DEMOB UNIT.**
- o DEMOB list will be posted around camp and also will be added to the CAL FIRE IMT 1 online folder: (Scan QR code to read DEMOB list or <http://calfire.box.com/calfireimt1>)
- o Efforts will be made to ensure that all released personnel arrive at their destination prior to 2200 hours.
- o All government and hired vehicles leaving the incident will have a safety inspection. If a vehicle is within 1,000 miles of a "B" service, it is the responsibility of the resource to contact Ground Support and have an oil change prior to their scheduled DEMOB time.
- o All trainees are to keep their time up to date and report to the Training Specialist with their task books and evaluations prior to completion of the demobilization process.
- o All strike team leaders are responsible to call North Ops at 1-800-237-3703 immediately upon being released from the incident.

RESPONSIBILITIES

Unit Leaders will declare resources excess to their **Section Chief**. **Section Chiefs** will declare excess resources to the Planning Section Chief through the **Resource Unit Leader**. This should be done 36 hours in advance of anticipated release. Use the **Declaration of Excess Resources sheet** or **General Message Form (ICS-213)** to list all excess resources. Include the resource name, request number, name of person, date and time of declared excess, and time in which the resource will be eligible to leave. Send to the **RESOURCE UNIT** where the resource will be determined to be surplus to the incident. Surplus resources will then be able to report to the **DEMOB UNIT**, receive a Demobilization Checkout Form (ICS 221), get the appropriate ICS 221 signatures, and then return the completed ICS 221 to the DEMOB UNIT prior to final release or reassignment.

1. Organized fire departments
2. OES engines
3. Hired personnel and equipment
4. Other agencies (USFS, BLM, etc.)
5. Out of region Cal Fire forces
6. Within Region Cal Fire Forces
7. Unit CAL FIRE Forces

TRAVEL INFORMATION

All resources will meet agency specific requirements on hours of travel per day. For CAL FIRE hand crews, a full 24 hour reset period shall be adhered to before departing from the incident. After a crew's last operational period they shall begin the demobilization release procedure during their 24 hour off shift. In addition, they must use the following complete 24 hour period as reset time before they depart from the incident.

TRAINING SPECIALIST MESSAGE

A Training Specialist is available for trainees on the incident. We are located with Check In.

All federal, state and local government agency trainees working on position task books will need to register with the Incident Training Specialist in order to receive proper credit for your assignment. Remember to register trainees early on and bring your task book with you.

Performance Evaluations will be required to complete the process.




