



INPUTS

WEATHER SUMMARY:

The weather will start to increase in temperature and dropping in humidity levels. The temperatures will be 72-80 degrees in the daytime and 52-60 degrees overnight. The minimum humidity will be 20-29% during the day and 30-37% overnight. **Winds will change from the past several days and will be from north to northwest.** The slopes and valleys will be 4-9 mph and the ridges will be 7-14 mph during the day. Overnight the slope and valley winds will be northwest 4-7 mph becoming east 2-4 mph and ridge winds will be northwest 5-9 mph becoming north 4-7 mph.

OUTPUTS

FIRE BEHAVIOR

GENERAL:

The fuels have almost completely returned to the conditions they were before the cool moist weather we had the past several days. This will increase the fire activity especially in the islands of the fire. The smoldering fuels will actively burn as the afternoon temperatures increase and humidity drops. The lack of cloud cover will also increase the curing of the fuels. The wind will influence opposite slopes as it changes directions, having an influence on areas which have been sheltered the past several days. The areas of brush which had the understory burned may have torching as the smoldering material becomes more active. There is a Fuels and Fire Behavior Advisory out for this area and areas to the south about the critical fuel conditions.

SPECIFIC:

The wind will now influence different portions of the slope on the northeast portion of the fire, mainly on the ridges. There are several pockets of unburned fuels throughout the fire and they have the potential to become active. The east and south portions of the fire have unburned brush directly on the line, if this becomes active the spotting potential is high. The leaves of the brush carry well in the wind. If the fire develops a column it will increase the spotting distance from fire brands. The southeast portion of the fire will have the wind in alignment with several slopes, with established fire the fire spread will be rapid with medium to long distance spotting.

AIR OPERATIONS

There may be a weak inversion in the morning clearing early, having limited to no effect on air operations.

SAFETY

The fuel moisture recovery in the light fuels has already diminished, increasing the probability of ignition. Continue to monitor the changes in weather and take the time to calculate the probability of ignition for your area.

Fuels and Fire Behavior Advisory

Sierra Nevada Mountains and Foothills

September 9, 2015



Subject: Four years of drought has significantly increased the number of dead and dying conifers and oaks across portions of the Sierra Nevada and surrounding foothills. This has resulted in explosive fire behavior conditions and wildfire's resistance to control. Fire fighter safety is a major concern, as well as continued risk to the public in the affected forested areas.

Discussion: It is estimated that well over 5 million trees have died across the Sierra and Sequoia National Forests as well as in the nearby foothills. This is due to a combination of a multi-year drought and significant bark beetle infestation. This number is up from last year when approximately 300,000 trees had died. The deceased trees have immediately increased the amount of standing dead fuel load, which will contribute to extreme fire behavior in the affected areas. **Fire Managers/Firefighters should plan accordingly and be vigilant for flash fires through dead crowns.** Risk to ground suppression personnel and equipment from a greater likelihood of falling and/or weakened trees is also a major concern.

Departure from normal conditions: Normally, conifer forests across the southern and central Sierra experience something less than five percent mortality. In the last six months a substantial number of conifer stands have displayed a ten-fold increase in the number of dead and dying trees. It has been suggested that the current situation mimics the early stages of what occurred in the Southern California national forests between 2001 and 2005. The latest Energy Release Component (ERC) values are all near the 90th percentile for this time of year and are expected to increase further through the second week of September. **Recent fire behavior on the Rough Incident underscores the seriousness of the current situation.** Flash fires, long range spotting, and extreme rates of spread will continue to be common characteristics on new and existing incidents in the coming weeks.

Concerns to Firefighters and the Public:

- Fire Managers/Firefighters need to plan for and anticipate the potential for explosive fire behavior conditions in the affected areas **even during non-critical weather events.**
- Fire personnel and the public should be aware of the increased fall hazard and should seek to mitigate appropriately.


Mitigation Measures: At the onset of a wildfire event, history shows a quick and effective initial suppression response is the first best tool in suppressing unwanted wildfire.

- Fire Managers/ Firefighters should consider suppression options and safe access prior to an event.
- Agency Administrators need to ensure the concerns brought forward in this advisory are included in all suppression and or prescribed fire operations.




WATER USAGE PLAN

California Drought Emergency

The following shall be considered and implemented by all fire resources as a means to provide maximum efficiencies when utilizing water resources, while minimizing the impacts to private and public water supplies. Accountability shall be maintained for all water supplies that are utilized and care should be applied to ensure proper replacement and/or reimbursement to the supplier/ owner.

Fireline personnel- (During mop up operations)

- Use of Pencil Hose and Garden Nozzles with Shut-Offs.
- Use of Back pumps.
- Dry Mop-up and consolidation of heavy fuels to areas where they can burn out safely
- Locate/ Relocate Firelines to lighter fuels or natural barriers when safe.
- Set up and use portable tanks in anticipation of longer transport times for Water Tenders.
- Use of foams, gels and other water enhancers.
- Evaluate need to mop up in excess of 200 feet from fireline

Road Maintenance and Repair-

- Monitor and water roads only when and where needed.
- Water when most effective (evening and nights).
- Use chemical treatments when available (Magchloride, Omni bind ect).
- Consider use of tertiary or treated water (sp)

Aviation Operations-

- Use of Gels, Foams and Retardants. Set up portable plants.
- Consider Blivits and Pencil hose for interior mop up operations as opposed to numerous bucket drops.
- Establish and use pre-use agreements for existing and known water sources.
- Use large watershed dip sites when able. Minimize use of small, static ponds and lakes.
- Maintain accountability of water used and locations of dip sites.
- Evaluate need for interior bucket drops

Private Water Supplies-

- Notify property owner as early as possible.
- Minimize usage and develop alternative water supplies when and where appropriate.
- Track usage (meter, 214 form) and develop a plan to replace water.
- Make arrangements for reimbursement and damage claims if needed.

Public/ Municipal Water Supplies-

- Notify Agency as soon as possible and request a representative to the incident.
- Identify fill areas and request metering devices. Place on incident map.
- Use alternative or reclaimed water sources when available. Place on incident map.
- Make arrangements for reimbursement and damage claims if needed.

Management and Supervision-

- Use leaders intent and establish Water Conservation as an Management Objective.
- Consider complexity of water use on incidents. Establish a Water Supply Group Supervisor to coordinate additional resources to support the incident needs.
- Complete the Water Usage Report daily and turn in to Finance
- Review this check list and brief daily.

TRAINING SPECIALIST MESSAGE

A Training Specialist is available for trainees on the incident. We are now located in a trailer across from check in.

All federal, state and local government agency trainees working on position task books will need to register with the Incident Training Specialist in order to receive proper credit for your assignment.

We are now experiencing an increase in DEMOB'S with the incident. Please come by early to close out your training package and check out with us PRIOR to starting the DEMOB process.

To check out: bring your evaluation record, performance evaluation, qualification card and position task book.

GENERAL INFORMATION

The Demobilization Plan is developed to facilitate the orderly removal and checkout of resources on the incident. By definition, surplus personnel are available for release if they have rested for a minimum of 8 hours.

GENERAL GUIDELINES

- o **NO RESOURCES WILL LEAVE THE INCIDENT UNTIL AUTHORIZED TO DO SO BY THE DEMOB UNIT.**
- o DEMOB list will be posted around camp and also will be added to the CAL FIRE IMT 1 online folder. (Scan QR code to read DEMOB list or <http://calfire.box.com/calfireimt1>)
- o Efforts will be made to ensure that all released personnel arrive at their destination prior to 2200 hours.
- o All government and hired vehicles leaving the incident will have a safety inspection. If a vehicle is within 1,000 miles of a "B" service, it is the responsibility of the resource to contact Ground Support and have an oil change prior to their scheduled DEMOB time.
- o All trainees are to keep their time up to date and report to the Training Specialist with their task books and evaluations prior to completion of the demobilization process.
- o All strike team leaders are responsible to call North Ops at 1-800-237-3703 immediately upon being released from the incident.

RESPONSIBILITIES

Unit Leaders will declare resources excess to their **Section Chief**. **Section Chiefs** will declare excess resources to the Planning Section Chief through the **Resource Unit Leader**. This should be done 36 hours in advance of anticipated release. Use the **Declaration of Excess Resources** sheet or **General Message Form (ICS-213)** to list all excess resources. Include the resource name, request number, name of person, date and time of declared excess, and time in which the resource will be eligible to leave. Send to the **RESOURCE UNIT** where the resource will be determined to be surplus to the incident. Surplus resources will then be able to report to the **DEMOB UNIT**, receive a Demobilization Checkout Form (ICS 221), get the appropriate ICS 221 signatures, and then return the completed ICS 221 to the DEMOB UNIT prior to final release or reassignment.

RELEASE PRIORITIES

1. Organized fire departments
2. OES engines
3. Hired personnel and equipment
4. Other agencies (USFS, BLM, etc.)
5. Out of region Cal Fire forces
6. Within Region Cal Fire Forces
7. Unit CAL FIRE Forces

TRAVEL INFORMATION

All resources will meet agency specific requirements on hours of travel per day. For CAL FIRE hand crews, a full 24 hour reset period shall be adhered to before departing from the incident. After a crew's last operational period they shall begin the demobilization release procedure during their 24 hour off shift. In addition, they must use the following complete 24 hour period as reset time before they depart from the incident.

Document Number: for use as a local number system or when attached to a FC-40 document.

Location / Incident Name: Enter the CDF facility property is assigned to. If submitting to an incident base, enter the Incident Name.

Incident Number: Enter the appropriate incident number

Unit: Enter the Unit the property is assigned to. If submitting to an incident base, enter the request number of the person certifying damage example E-320, C-14 or O-355.

Region: Enter the CDF Region where the property was assigned. If submitting to an incident base, enter the CDF Region responsible for the incident.

Date: Enter the date the P.L. or D. was completed.

The following items were: Enter either 'Broken', 'Left on Line', 'Damaged' or other status of the property.

Reminder, this form cannot be used in place of the STD-152 to certify Lost, Stolen, Worn Out or Damaged beyond repair property.

Date of Occurrence: Enter the date the property was broken, left on line or damaged.

Quantity: Enter the quantity for the line item.

Unit of Measure: Enter the unit of measure for the line item (example ea = each).

CDF Stock Number: Enter the PIN or stock number.

Description: Enter the description of the line item, indicate size, make, model and type. Clearly describe the item and provide adequate data to effectively identify equipment or property.

Property Number: Enter the CDF property number assigned to the line item, Capitalized or sensitive property must have their property number entered here.

Location of Items: Where is the property now (example, left on Division B night shift 8/1/04, Drop Point 2). A GPS coordinate, Station 22 or Unit Service Center may also be used to describe Location.

Remarks: Enter specific remarks here, how was the property damaged, what specifically is wrong with it.

Signature of Person Certifying Occurrence as Described:

Signature: The CDF Employee certifying the occurrence must sign.

Printed Name: Enter the printed name of the signature.

Title: Enter the title of the signature.

Date: Enter the date of the signature.

Unit Supervisors Approval:

If submitted on an incident this section must be completed by the supervisor of the property custodian. This may be the Strike Team Leader, Division Supervisor, Receiving and Distribution Manager, Supply Unit Leader, Logistics Section Chief, Agency Representative or Incident Commander.

If submitted at the home Unit this section must also be completed by the supervisor of the property custodian. This may be a Battalion or Division Chief.

Comments: Supervisors may enter comments of approval or disapproval.

Signature of Unit Administrator: Signature of Unit Supervisor reviewing the certification described.

Title: Title of the signature.

Date: Date of the signature.

Notes:

This document is NOT required if exchanging property at an incident base with the exception of capitalized or sensitive property assigned a CDF property number.

This document is required as certification when submitting an MRT to your local Service Center for replacement of property.

An OF-315 (Incident Replacement Requisition) is required as authorization to purchase fire replacement items at your local Unit. This document is required when submitting an MRT to your local Service Center for fire replacement items. A CDF-101 and/or A STD-152 are required for the certification of the status of property being requisitioned for replacement.






