

WEATHER DISCUSSION:

Sprawling high pressure over the southwest will maintain hot and dry conditions into Tuesday. High pressure weakens on Tuesday with mid-level trough starting to develop over the west coast. Development of increased southwest flow allows for a gradual cooling and moistening trend through the week.



INPUTS

WEATHER SUMMARY:

The sky will be clear with high temperatures and low humidity again today. The temperature will be 88-95 degrees during the day and 62-73 degrees overnight. The humidity will be 7-14% during the day with a slight recovery to 20-27% overnight. Winds will be light from the west to northwest 4-7 mph slopes/valleys and 6-9 mph on the ridges during the day. Overnight winds will be northwest 3-6 mph becoming east 4-7 mph with gusts to 10 mph in the valleys and slopes, ridge winds will be northwest 4-7 mph becoming northeast 5-8 mph with gusts to 13 mph.

OUTPUTS

FIRE BEHAVIOR

GENERAL:

There was minimal to no humidity recovery the past 2 nights, keeping the light fuels at a low moisture level. This limited recovery will bring the Probability of Ignition to 90-100% early in the morning. Winds will begin to increase slightly over the next several days as a dry cold front comes through the area. The winds will increase spotting distance slightly. A new fire will be mainly influenced by the dry fuels and will have a slow rate of spread. Steeper terrain will increase the rate of spread. If a fire becomes plume dominated it will have rapid to extreme rates of spread due to the increasing spotting distance. The smoldering fuels will continue to burn and may become active in the heat of the day.

SPECIFIC:

The Mokelumne River portion of the fire may start to see more leaf and needle litter on the surface as the winds increase, creating more smoldering material. Post lookouts to watch for increases in fire activity which could cause ember cast. The east and south side of the fire will continue to have smoldering in the islands of unburned fuels, which will become active in the late morning to afternoon. On the south side of the fire watch for rolling material in the steeper sections of the islands. The rolling material may increase the fire activity allowing for short range spotting along Fricot City Road. Pay attention to the masticators along the road, the equipment has the potential to start a new fire in the dry conditions. The west side of the fire will continue to have smoldering material. Any area that has an understory burn with standing brush the leaves will start falling and creating a new surface layer with cured fuels. These leaves and needles will readily ignite when in contact from an ember or smoldering fuels.

AIR OPERATIONS

There should be no issues for aircraft during the operational period.

SAFETY

Continue to hydrate in the hot and dry conditions. When taking breaks take the weather and calculate the Probability of Ignition.

CAL FIRE INCIDENT MANAGEMENT TEAM WATER USAGE PLAN

California Drought Emergency

The following shall be considered and implemented by all fire resources as a means to provide maximum efficiencies when utilizing water resources, while minimizing the impacts to private and public water supplies. Accountability shall be maintained for all water supplies that are utilized and care should be applied to ensure proper replacement and/or reimbursement to the supplier/ owner.

Fireline personnel- (During mop up operations)

- Use of Pencil Hose and Garden Nozzles with Shut-Offs.
- Use of Back pumps.
- Dry Mop-up and consolidation of heavy fuels to areas where they can burn out safely
- Locate/ Relocate Firelines to lighter fuels or natural barriers when safe.
- Set up and use portable tanks in anticipation of longer transport times for Water Tenders.
- Use of foams, gels and other water enhancers.
- Evaluate need to mop up in excess of 200 feet from fireline

Road Maintenance and Repair-

- Monitor and water roads only when and where needed.
- Water when most effective (evening and nights).
- Use chemical treatments when available (Magchloride, Omni bind ect).
- Consider use of tertiary or treated water (sp)

Aviation Operations-

- Use of Gels, Foams and Retardants. Set up portable plants.
- Consider Blivits and Pencil hose for interior mop up operations as opposed to numerous bucket drops.
- Establish and use pre-use agreements for existing and known water sources.
- Use large watershed dip sites when able. Minimize use of small, static ponds and lakes.
- Maintain accountability of water used and locations of dip sites.
- Evaluate need for interior bucket drops

Private Water Supplies-

- Notify property owner as early as possible.
- Minimize usage and develop alternative water supplies when and where appropriate.
- Track usage (meter, 214 form) and develop a plan to replace water.
- Make arrangements for reimbursement and damage claims if needed.

Public/ Municipal Water Supplies-

- Notify Agency as soon as possible and request a representative to the incident.
- Identify fill areas and request metering devices. Place on incident map.
- Use alternative or reclaimed water sources when available. Place on incident map.
- Make arrangements for reimbursement and damage claims if needed.

Management and Supervision-

- Use leaders intent and establish Water Conservation as an Management Objective.
- Consider complexity of water use on incidents. Establish a Water Supply Group Supervisor to coordinate additional resources to support the incident needs.
- Complete the Water Usage Report daily and turn in to Finance
- Review this check list and brief daily.

The Demobilization Plan is developed to facilitate the orderly removal and checkout of resources on the incident. By definition, surplus personnel are available for release if they have rested for a minimum of 8 hours.

GENERAL GUIDELINES

- **NO RESOURCES WILL LEAVE THE INCIDENT UNTIL AUTHORIZED TO DO SO BY THE DEMOB UNIT.**
- DEMOB list will be posted around camp and also will be added to the CAL FIRE IMT 1 online folder. (Scan QR code to read DEMOB list or <http://calfire.box.com/calfireimt1>)
- Efforts will be made to ensure that all released personnel arrive at their destination prior to 2200 hours.
- All government and hired vehicles leaving the incident will have a safety inspection. If a vehicle is within 1,000 miles of a "B" service, it is the responsibility of the resource to contact Ground Support and have an oil change prior to their scheduled DEMOB time.
- All trainees are to keep their time up to date and report to the Training Specialist with their task books and evaluations prior to completion of the demobilization process.
- All strike team leaders are responsible to call North Ops at 1-800-237-3703 immediately upon being released from the incident.

RESPONSIBILITIES

Unit Leaders will declare resources excess to their **Section Chief**. **Section Chiefs** will declare excess resources to the Planning Section Chief through the **Resource Unit Leader**. This should be done 36 hours in advance of anticipated release. Use the **Declaration of Excess Resources sheet** or **General Message Form (ICS-213)** to list all excess resources. Include the resource name, request number, name of person, date and time of declared excess, and time in which the resource will be eligible to leave. Send to the **RESOURCE UNIT** where the resource will be determined to be surplus to the incident. Surplus resources will then be able to report to the **DEMOB UNIT**, receive a Demobilization Checkout Form (ICS 221), get the appropriate ICS 221 signatures, and then return the completed ICS 221 to the DEMOB UNIT prior to final release or reassignment.

RELEASE PRIORITIES

1. Organized fire departments
2. OES engines
3. Hired personnel and equipment
4. Other agencies (USFS, BLM, etc.)
5. Out of region Cal Fire forces
6. Within Region Cal Fire Forces
7. Unit CAL FIRE Forces

TRAVEL INFORMATION

All resources will meet agency specific requirements on hours of travel per day. For CAL FIRE hand crews, a full 24 hour reset period shall be adhered to before departing from the incident. After a crew's last operational period they shall begin the demobilization release procedure during their 24 hour off shift. In addition, they must use the following complete 24 hour period as reset time before they depart from the incident.




Transportation Map BUTTE INCIDENT CA-AEU-024918


