**WEATHER DISCUSSION:** Mostly clear conditions are expected through this evening...then skies will become partly cloudy. There will be a slight chance of thunderstorms late Thursday night/early Friday morning...with any storms likely to be dry. So...new lightning starts and gusty/erratic winds will be possible late in the operational period. Otherwise...today will be hottest and driest day of the week.

On Friday...the slight chance of thunderstorms will continue across the complex through the evening. Any thunderstorms that develop on Friday will likely be on the dry side...although some wet storms cannot be ruled out in the afternoon/evening. Dry conditions and a cooling trend are anticipated this weekend.

  - Ensure personnel are adequately **hydrated**
    - Monitor the **wellness** of all line Personnel
    - Utilize work/rest cycles to **prevent Heat Illness**
    - **Stretch** your muscles before shift begins
  - Monitor Personnel for Fatigue – Maybe it’s time to **reset**
  - Maintain **Situational Awareness** at all times
    - During Mop-Up stay engaged, don’t allow **complacency** to set
- ✓ **Fire Weather Conditions- Know your fire weather and forecasts**
  - Be aware of battling or **shifting winds**
    - Post a **lookout** put eyes on the fire at all times
    - Be alert on **changing weather** patterns
    - **Communicate** all weather changes down to the last firefighter
- ✓ **Roads-Slow Down!!!!**
  - Several roads in on the incident are narrow and dusty maintain **Safe Speeds** and distances at all times to avoid range cattle and wild game
  - **Residents** are in the area
  - Ensure drivers are properly rested to safely operate their vehicles and always **drive defensively**
- ✓ **Topography**
  - Steep and Rocky
    - Beware of **rolling and falling debris** from above
    - Watch your **footing**
    - Identify **hazard trees** and communicate it up the line
  - Terrain may make escape to **Safety Zones** take longer than expected
  - Brief on **dozer safety** prior to starting the shift
  - Utilize **Lookouts** when necessary
- ✓ **Communications**
  - Ensure that Radios have been properly cloned
  - **Communicate** with your crew when aircraft are working in the area
  - Use the **firing plan check list** prior to the start of any firing operation

## Chipper Machine Safety Tips

Chipper machines cut tree limbs into small chips. Hazards arise when workers get too close to, or make contact with, the chipper. Contact with chipper operating components (blades, discs or knives) may result in amputation or death. Workers may also be injured by material thrown from the machine. To minimize these hazards, use appropriate engineering and work practice controls, including worker training.

### Hazards

- Workers making contact with or being pulled into the chipper.
- Hearing loss.
- Face, eye, head or hand injuries.

### Safe Work Practices

- **Never reach into a chipper while it is operating.**
- Do not wear loose-fitting clothing around a chipper.
- Always follow the manufacturer's guidelines and safety instructions.
- Use earplugs, safety glasses, hard hats and gloves.
- Workers should be trained on the safe operation of chipper machines. Always supervise new workers using a chipper to ensure that they work safely and never endanger themselves or others.
- Protect yourself from contacting operating chipper components by guarding the infeed and discharge ports, and preventing the opening of the access covers or doors until the drum or disc completely stops.
- Prevent detached trailer chippers from rolling or sliding on slopes by chocking the trailer wheels.
- Maintain a safe distance (i.e., two tree or log lengths) between chipper operations and other work/workers.
- When servicing and/or maintaining chipping equipment (i.e., unjamming ) use a lockout system to ensure that the equipment is de-energized.


