

WEATHER DISCUSSION:

A low pressure system will continue to provide a moderately unstable airmass across the region. Surface winds will vary from east to west but should remain around 10 mph with gusts to 20 mph during peak burning. High pressure will briefly build over the area on Wednesday for warmer and drier conditions. Late Thursday and Friday the Pacific low pressure system will move across the coast...bringing a chance of light showers to the fire area.

WEATHER: Partly cloudy early...Then increasing high clouds late in the morning.
 MAX TEMPERATURES: 83-88.
 MIN HUMIDITY 2000 ft: 21-26%...near 17% North and East Perimeter.

 2500 FT: East and Southeast 5 to 10 mph...Gusts to 15 mph until 1500 PDT. Wind then shifting to west and southwest 7 to 12 mph with gusts 15-20 mph through the evening.

 STABILITY / INVERSION: Moderately Unstable.
 SMOKE TRANSPORT WIND: South-Southwest 10-15 mph.



INPUTS

WEATHER SUMMARY: *** *Shifting Winds in the Afternoon* ***

Approaching low pressure will provide a moderately unstable airmass over the region. Anticipate winds shifting throughout the day. Winds will come from the East in the morning and change to Southwest by 1300. Expect West/Southwest winds with stronger gusts into the afternoon. In the past 5 burn periods, fire activity has closely correlated to these changing winds in the afternoon hours. Critical weather patterns have been occurring between 1400 and 1900 each day. Chance for High Cloud development in the afternoon.

Max. Temperatures - 87 to 92 degrees **Min. Humidity** - 20-25% (15% in the North and East divisions)

Winds(Eye Level)- *Morning:* East & Southeast 5-10, Gusts to 15mph
Afternoon: Slope/Valley West & Southwest 7-12, Gusts to 20 mph.
Ridgetops: West 7-12, Gusts to 20mph
Evening: West Northwest (down slope) 3-5 mph till sunrise

OUTPUTS

FIRE BEHAVIOR

GENERAL:

- Large amount of unburned islands continue to pose a threat to control lines in all Divisions.
- Watch weather trends throughout the day. Fire behavior has responded predictably with: **RH** (below 30%), **Temperature** (above 85 Degrees), and **Wind Speed** (above 5 mph at Eye Level)
- Fire will make runs when in alignment with wind, fuels, topography and exposed Southwest slopes.
- Fire is burning with intensity in the brush fields, but will slow in areas with light grasses.

SPECIFIC:

All Divisions: Spot fires outside established containment lines or new starts...

Flame Lengths- Up to 10 ft. in Grass, Up to 20 ft. in Brush, Up to 50ft from the tops of torching trees.

Rate of Spread- Up to 100 feet/minute in Grass, Up to 150 feet/minute in Brush

Spotting Distances- Up to .4 miles in Grass/Brush, Up to .3 miles in Torching Trees

Probability of Ignition- Unshaded Fuels **90%** at the peak of the burn period; *plan for spot fires*

AIR OPERATIONS:

Expect good smoke dispersal by 1100. Mixing heights will again rise to 5,000 AGL during peak daytime heating. Anticipate terrain induced turbulence in areas with complex terrain; especially during times of plume development.

Sunrise- 6:14 Sunset-8:21

SAFETY

Look for the "Next Big Change" in the Fire's Path.....
The potential for unburned islands to burn exists, don't get complacent, the reburn potential of the dirty islands is still very high.

Major Hazards and Risks: Complacency, Fatigue, Driving Hazards, Aircraft

Fire Behavior: Fuels are severely drought stricken and are receptive to fire spread. Situation that shouts watch out: temperatures above 85 degrees, relative humidity under 25%, and eye level winds greater than 5 mph at eye level !!!!

Complacency: ALL PPE must be worn, including shrouds, when working on the fire line. Mop up requires your situational awareness even without active fire. Unburnt fuels can reignite suddenly and turn against you.

Fatigue: Manage yourself and those around you for excessive fatigue; many have driven long distances or been redeployed from other incidents. Use the buddy system and take breaks as needed. As fatigue increase, injuries tend to increase also.

Hazard trees: Survey your work areas for hazard trees, flag and restrict access, use only qualified personnel for tree felling. Review and follow **Hazard Tree Safety**, pg. 22-23 in your IRPG.

Aircraft: Monitor Channel 15 Air to Ground – CDF Tac 14 at all times. Helco and Air Attack your eyes in the sky!!

Eat and drink fluids on a regular basis to maintain an appropriate energy level for any expected work assignment. Remember, you are the only one that knows your limitations.

Review your ICS 206 and follow the Line Emergency procedures.

Lookouts, Communication, Escape routes, Safety zones





- **LCES:** they are clear and made known to everyone








Be alert for thunderstorm activity. • Expect rapid rates of spread with long range spotting, have a contingency plan (PACE) with established decision points and safety zones.
ALL	AIRCRAFT OPERATIONS	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Keep personnel out of drop zones. • Use air-to-ground freq. to communicate with aircraft. • Use clear, concise statements when directing aircraft. Use clock directions from pilot's perspective. • Avoid "heli-mopping". Eliminate unnecessary pilot exposure.

MEDIA - The California State Penal Code Section 409.5(d) allows the news media to enter scenes of disaster, riot, or civil disturbance. Properly identified members of the news media should not be restricted from entering locations specified within the code. However, this does not include crime scenes, and does not imply that the news media may interfere with incident operations while they are in the areas of concern. If entering such a location that is hazardous, they should be advised; media access cannot be prevented for safety reasons unless their presence would impede CAL FIRE's mitigation of the incident or the disturbing of evidence.

- Nor is the Media permitted on private property without the property owners permission.
- If approached and questioned by the media and or the public, talk about your assignment or task at hand. If need be direct the questioning party to the incident PIO.
- Do not speculate or give opinions
- There is no such thing as an "off the record" comment.

CAL FIRE SOCIAL MEDIA POLICY, Social Media 0691 – Social Media is increasingly being used by public agencies, the media as well as the public. This form of communication continues to grow rapidly in order to supply the instant gratification needs of society. Therefore when on a CAL FIRE incident you will adhere to the CAL FIRE Social Media Policy, 0691. You can get further information about the CAL FIRE Social Media Policy from the Information Section.

There will be no posting of:

- Inappropriate information or materials
- No opinions
- No endorsements
- Do not post inappropriate pictures or videos
- If you are uncertain, question.

PICTURES AND VIDEO OF INCIDENT – We are in a new era of media. Media no longer means the news/broadcast industry but now refers to anyone that has the capability to shoot video and or photographs and post them onto social media in a matter of minutes. Unfortunately we have seen some instances of video or photographs that have depicted unsafe, unprofessional or embarrassing circumstances which are a serious breach of ethics. When this happens it reflects poorly on all that are attached to this incident. Posting an inappropriate video, photo or blog comment could have unwanted effects. It may be unsafe to shoot photos or video and a firefighter who is concentrating on a camera can't be looking up, down and all around.

LOST AND FOUND – The Information Section will manage Lost and Found items for the incident. If you have lost an item leave your contact information and what you have lost at the Information Section. **Archaeological and Historic Properties:
General Fire-line Guidance for the BLM Ukiah Field Office.**

**Do not compromise safety for the protection and preservation of archaeological and historic properties.
When possible and prudent:**

1. Be on the lookout for prehistoric and historic archaeological sites. These sites typically occur adjacent to streams and springs, confluences are often especially sensitive. However, sites can occur in other areas too. The most common indicators of prehistoric sites in this area (North Coast Ranges) are scatters of shiny black obsidian flakes from tool making activities and dark midden soils. Historic-era sites include homesteads that contain foundations, rock chimneys, and stone / brick-lined wells. Historic-era mining sites are possible as well.
2. Note, that much of the area has never been surveyed for archaeological resources and many sites out there have yet to be discovered.
3. If you observe archaeological resources, flagged or unflagged, attempt to avoid with ground disturbing activities altogether.
4. If avoidance is not possible, minimize ground disturbance. Use a hand crew rather than a dozer to remove fuels from control lines that must cross site areas if possible.
5. Leave all artifacts in place as some may have been intentionally placed for religious or ceremonial reasons.
6. Note locations of discovered resources on a map, better yet, take site coordinates with a GPS. Leave information for the archaeologist so that the sites can be relocated and protected during Fire Suppression Repair. Flag the site in red if possible.
7. If you encounter a burial or other human remains, cease work in that area and contact the archaeologist immediately.
