WEATHER DISCUSSION: A weak upper low will be dropping southward through Norcal during the early morning hours Thursday. This will bring another round of breezy northeast winds to the higher elevations during the morning hours. The fires primarily lower southwest aspects should be fairly protected from these upper level winds but the offshore flow will keep the marine influence out of the fire area for the next couple of days. Thursday daytime will see a slight warming and drying with a turn to light onshore flow aloft and terrain driven winds on the fire. Overnight Thursday will see slightly less breezy offshore flow but again marine influence on the fire is unlikely. At this time...Friday looks slightly cooler as a weak trough approaches the Pacific Northwest coast bringing a slight increase in onshore marine flow.

WEATHER FORECAST:

WEATHER: Mostly Sunny.

TEMPERATURES: High temperatures 94 to 98.

HUMIDITY: Minimum humidity 15-19%.

20 FT WINDS:

RIDGETOP - (1000-2000 feet above the fire) East 5-9 mph with gusts as high as 20 mph in the morning hours through about 1000 becoming west to northwest 4-8 gusts to 18 mph.

SLOPE/VALLEY - Downslope 1-3 gusts to 5 mph through about 0900. Some occasional east gusts to 8 mph through 1000. Then upslope to upcanyon 2-4 gusts to 9 mph. Strongest winds in the late afternoon.

STABILITY/INVERSION: Fairly stable conditions. Marine layer about 1800 feet.

OUTLOOK FOR Thursday Night: Mostly clear. Minimum temperatures around 50. Good RH recovery 85-90%. Winds on the slopes, upslope to upcanyon 2-4 gusts to 9 mph becoming downslope 1-3 gusts to 5 mph after about 2100. Ridgetops above the fire...west to northwest 4-8 mph gusts to 18 mph becoming east after about 2100 4-7 gusts to 17 mph.

OUTLOOK FOR Friday: Mostly Sunny. Maximum temperatures 91-95. Minimum humidity 18-22%. Slope winds downslope 1-3 mph becoming upslope to upcanyon 2-5 gusts to 10 mph in the afternoon. Ridge winds above the fire east 4-7 gusts to 17 mph becoming west 5-10 gusts to 20 mph in the afternoon.

EXTENDED FORECAST: Saturday and Sunday. A little cooler with slightly higher RH. Light winds in the mornings with breezy west winds on the ridges in the afternoons.

Get weather reports.





Branch	HAZARDOUS ACTIONS / CONDITIONS	MITIGATIONS/WARNINGS/REMEDIES
ALL	FIRE AND DROUGHT WEAKENED TREES/SNAG HAZARDS	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Follow Hazard Tree Safety Guidelines (IRPG p. 22). Many of the trees within the fire area and along roadways are stressed due to prolonged drought conditions and extended burn times. Treat burning power poles as snag hazards.
ALL	DRIVING HAZARDS	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Drive defensively! Expect the unexpected. Watch for distracted drivers. Increase following distances. Slow down. Maintain Situational Awareness. Watch for debris on the roadways.
ALL	FATIGUE	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Be alert for signs of fatigue and take breaks as necessary. Adhere to the 2 to 1 work rest cycle. Monitor incoming resources for level of fatigue.
ALL	PERSONAL SAFETY	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> All personnel are responsible for their personal safety. Ensure that personal items and work related equipment are secure at all times. Immediately report any suspicious activity to your Supervisor.
ALL	HYDRATION	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Drinking water before, during and after each shift. Be alert for signs of heat stress in yourself and others.
ALL	HEAT RELATED ILLNESS	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Review "Specific Treatments" section of the IRPG (pg 103) for heat illnesses signs and treatment. Take frequent breaks as needed. Report any and all injuries to your Supervisor.
ALL	FIRE WEATHER	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Ensure LCES in place prior to engagement (IRPG p. 7). Be thoroughly familiar with weather predications and monitor conditions on the ground for changes. Watch for second burn period around 0000-0300.
ALL	HAZARDOUS STRUCTURES	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Follow Structure Size-up (IRPG p.13). Be aware of Propane Tank hazards. Generators may be utilized to back feed electrical to home in areas where commercial power is unavailable.
ALL	POWER LINES	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Follow Power Line safety guidelines (IRPG pg.24). Treat all downed power lines as energized.
ALL	ROLLING MATERIAL	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> With the steep terrain watch for rolling material when personnel are working around/above you. Call out rolling material.
ALL	COMMUNICATIONS	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Steep terrain may limit communications. Use human repeaters as needed.
ALL	BRIEFINGS	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Make sure everyone gets a briefing on the plan for the day (inside rear cover IRPG).


