WEATHER DISCUSSION: The trough of low pressure will slowly move east today leaving the fire area under brisk northerly flow aloft as we sit in between a building ridge of high pressure and the exiting trough. Gusty north winds can be expected along higher elevations today and tonight. The north winds when aligned with north to south drainages will bring stronger up/down canyon winds as well. A gradual warming and drying trend will be observed today as the ridge of high pressure migrates toward the coast.

FORECAST FOR TODAY:

WEATHER: Sunny with light smoke. Smoke drifting north to south.

MAX TEMPERATURES:

Between 1500 – 3000 ft: 78 – 83 degrees.

Between 3000 – 4500 ft: 67 – 73 degrees.

Between 5500 – 6500 ft including higher ridgetops: 54 – 60.

MINIMUM RELATIVE HUMIDITY:

Between 1500 – 3500 ft: 16 – 20%.

Between 3500 – 5000 ft including higher ridgetops: 20 – 25%.

20 FT WINDS:

Upper Slopes/Ridge Tops: North and Northwest 8 to 12 mph...with gusts to 20 mph in the afternoon.

Lower Slopes / Drainage: Down slope / down canyon 3 to 5 mph...except for north-south orientated drainages where stronger northerly down slope winds will gust from 12 to 18 mph until 1100 PDT.

After 1100 PDT...winds will then become upslope / Up canyon 4 to 8 mph. Stronger up canyon winds along favored North to South drainages 6 to 10 mph in the afternoon with gusts ranging from 14 to 18 mph.

FORECAST FOR TONIGHT (Wednesday Night):

WEATHER: Clear with light smoke. Smoke drifting north to south.

MIN TEMPERATURES TONIGHT: 40 – 45.

MAXIMUM RELATIVE HUMIDITY RECOVERY TONIGHT: 60 to 70%.

20 FT WINDS TONIGHT:

Upper Slopes/Ridge Tops: North-Northwest 10 to 15 mph...with Gusts to 20 to 25 mph.

Lower Slopes / Drainage: Upslope / Upcanyon 6 to 9 mph until 2000 PDT. Then down slope / down canyon 3 to 5 mph...except for northerly aligned drainages where down slope winds will range from 6 to 10 mph with gusts to 15 mph.

STABILITY/INVERSION: Light to moderate morning inversions forming along lower valleys and in canyons around sunrise. Smoke lifting by late morning.

OUTLOOK FOR NEXT SHIFT (Thursday/Thursday Night): Moderately strong northerly flow continues across northwest California along higher elevations. A weak disturbance tracks south across the area on Thursday enhancing the northerly winds and brings a slight chance of shower activity to the fire area. Winds will begin to shift to the northeast late Thursday night into Friday morning. With the wind shift expect significant drying to begin Thursday night with much poorer recovery expected. (35-45%)

High temperatures in the upper 50's and lower 60's
Minimum Relative Humidity 20-25%
Ridgetop winds out of the northwest to north at 8-10 with gusts to 20
Upslope winds in sheltered locations

FIRE BEHAVIOR

GENERAL:

Fire behavior will increase today with drying conditions. North and Northwest winds will be favorable for containment operations.

SPECIFIC:

Division J: Fire will continue to back slowly down slope in timber fuels. Expect minimal rates of spread, generally less than 1 chain per hour, and flame lengths 2-3 feet. Torching should be minimal and restricted to isolated, single tree events. Upslope winds in Division J will be augmented by northerly general winds. This will cause increased potential for active upslope runs when spotting is caused by rolling fire brands.

Division K: Northwest winds could expose Division K to increased fire behavior near the Five Dollar Campsite. Fire will continue to progress toward Ray's Peak where fuels are available.

Division L: Active fire continues to progress toward Division L in the Grizzly Creek and Rattlesnake Creek Drainages. While fire activity in this area will increase as fuels dry, progression toward the line should not increase, but will continue to be dominated by the effects of terrain.

AIR OPERATIONS:

Visibility will likely be limited during the morning hours. Sunrise 06:58 Sunset 19:12

WEATHER SUMMARY: Sunny with gusty winds

Winds: Day, North to NW 8-12mph gusts to 20mph. Night, Down slope 3-5mph.

Temperatures: Day 78-83 Night 40-45

FIRE BEHAVIOR FORECAST

GENERAL FIRE BEHAVIOR:

This fire remains fuels and topography driven. Expect to see more active fire both interior and on the line. Fire progression will be primarily by active surface fire and spotting. Expect spot fires out to 1/2mile and from rollouts. Single and group tree torching will occur in dense stands where ladder fuels are present. Fire activity will decrease over night under the inversion, except in wind exposed areas.

Probability of Ignition is 70%

SPECIFIC:

Branch I

- Expect backing fire with the potential for rapid up hill runs towards the interior.
- Single and group tree torching is probable as the smoke clears out.
- Expect rates of 1-4 chains per hour in the Mazanita Crk Drainage.

Branch V

- The fire is not expected to impact the Branch during this burn period.
- With the NW winds any column developed in Branch VI could spread brands.

Branch VI

- Expect backing fire with the potential for short runs up hill back into the interior.
- Single and group tree torching will continue.
- Watch for spot fires from rolling material.
- Expect rates of spread of 1- 3 chains per hour.

Air Operations: Smoke in the drainages early, light smoke over the fire in the afternoon.

SAFETY:

Watch out #14: Conditions are becoming warmer and dryer.

This includes the Communications Plan, the Medical Plan, the LCES Analysis, and your specific fire assignment. Know who you are working for, who is working for you, and who is working adjacent to you. If you have any question about your assignment, ask and clarify prior to going to the fire line. Test your communication link.

HAZARDOUS TREES: Hazard trees, both green and dead, are a major hazard on the complex. Scout your work areas, flag known hazards and let others know of the hazard, have a lookout when working around the trees.

WEATHER CHANGES: We are once again in a changing weather pattern and winds are expected to increase. Pay attention to the Incident Weather Forecast and anticipate changes. Have a contingency plan for all changes.

INCIDENT TRANSPORTATION: Hwy 299 and Petersburg Road is busy and congested in both ICP-Base Camp areas. There are also pedestrians in both IAP/Base Camp areas. Some incident travel routes are narrow and/or dusty, travel distances are long, local residents continue to share the roads. Be alert for traffic, drive with your lights on, keep your speed down, and anticipate other drivers' actions. Watch for school busses stopping along roads.

HUNTERS: And citizens in the closure areas have been observed in the North Bar area. Heads up and direct them out of the closure to safety.

Thank you for continuing to make this a safe incident.




