5. General Control Objectives for the Incident (include alternatives) <u>Management Objectives</u> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Provide for Fire Fighter and Public Safety. 2. Support efforts to protect and rebuild infrastructure that include transportation routes, electrical transmission lines, and communications systems in the fire area. 3. Provide for positive community, tribal and public relations. 4. Minimize impacts to wilderness, cultural resources and fisheries through the use of Minimum Impact Suppression Tactics (MIST), and limit the spread of invasive plant species. 5. Identify and continue fire suppression rehabilitation needs. 6. Keep all incident operations and support functions cost effective. 7. Coordinate all incident operations and management decisions between North and South Bar Management Teams. <u>Control Objectives:</u> Keep the Bar Complex Fires: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • North of Highway 299; • East of a line from French Bar to Denny and New River/Slide Creek; • South of Slide Creek, Mary Blaine Meadow, Plummer Creek and south and west of the South Fork of the Salmon River; • West of the Little South Fork, Caesar Peak and Canyon Creek. Provide initial attack response within the TFR and fire resource support for the Shasta-Trinity and Klamath National Forests.												
8. Weather Forecast for Period Thursday: Early morning clouds and isolated light showers, becoming sunny and dry. Max temps 70-80. Min RH 30-40% below 3500' and 40-50% above 3500'. Winds upper slope/ridgetops 8-12 gusting to 22 mph afternoon; lower slopes and drainages downslope winds 8-12 mph until 1100 (stronger in North-South drainages), then upslope 4-8 (stronger in NW-SE drainages). Friday: RED FLAG WARNING thru Saturday for extremely low RHS and gusty E-NE winds. Saturday: Mostly clear. Highs upper 70s to mid 80s. Lows 30s to mid 40s.

EAST AND NORTHEAST WINDS IN EFFECT FOR FRIDAY AND SATURDAY *****

WEATHER DISCUSSION: An upper level disturbance will move south across the area early Thursday morning bringing a chance of light rain to the fire perimeter. This feature will also bring gusty north winds to the area along with high relative humidity values. By early Friday, however, the winds shift to the northeast giving way to rapid drying on Friday and Saturday. Red Flag Warning conditions will begin as early as Friday afternoon and lasting through late Saturday...and possibly Sunday. Extremely dry conditions will be observed during the afternoons along with very poor rh recovery during the night and early morning hours.

FORECAST FOR TODAY:

WEATHER: Early morning clouds and isolated light showers...becoming sunny and dry.

SMOKE TRANSPORT: Northwest to Southeast.

MAX TEMPERATURES:

Between 1500 – 3000 ft: 76 – 81 degrees.

Between 3000 – 4500 ft: 69 – 74 degrees.

Between 5500 – 6500 ft including higher ridge tops: 63 – 69.

MINIMUM RELATIVE HUMIDITY:

Between 1500 – 3500 ft: 30 – 40%.

Between 3500 – 5000 ft including higher ridge tops: 40 – 50%.

20 FT WINDS:

Upper Slopes/Ridge Tops: North and Northwest 8 to 12 mph...with gusts to 22 mph in the afternoon.

Lower Slopes / Drainage: Down slope / down canyon 3 to 5 mph...except for north-south orientated drainages where stronger northerly down slope winds will gust from 8 to 12 mph until 1100 PDT.

After 1100 PDT...winds will then become upslope / Up canyon 4 to 8 mph. Stronger up canyon winds along favored Northwest to Southeast drainages 6 to 10 mph in the afternoon with gusts ranging from 12 to 16 mph.

FORECAST FOR TONIGHT (Thursday Night):

WEATHER: Clear with light smoke. Smoke drifting northeast to southwest.

MIN TEMPERATURES TONIGHT: 40 – 45.

MAXIMUM RELATIVE HUMIDITY RECOVERY TONIGHT: 60 to 70% early...dropping to near 40% toward sunrise.

20 FT WINDS TONIGHT:

Upper Slopes/Ridge Tops: North 10 to 15 mph...with Gusts to 20 to 25 mph.

Lower Slopes / Drainage: Upslope / Up canyon 6 to 9 mph until 2000 PDT. Then down slope / down canyon 3 to 5 mph...except for northerly aligned drainages where down slope winds will range from 6 to 10 mph with gusts to 15 mph.

STABILITY/INVERSION: Light to moderate morning inversions forming along lower valleys and in canyons around sunrise. Smoke lifting by late morning.

OUTLOOK FOR NEXT SHIFT (Friday / Friday Night): Winds will shift to the east – northeast today bringing a very dry airmass to the region. Daytime RH's will fall to 10-15% with recovery at night to 25%. East and Northeast winds will range from 3 to 8 mph along exposed lower elevations. Higher elevation winds will mainly be out of the northeast and range from 6 to 12 mph with gusts to 20 mph.

WEATHER SUMMARY:

High temperatures in the mid to upper 60's
Minimum Relative Humidity 40-55%
Ridgetop winds out of the northwest to north at 8-12 with gusts to 22
Upslope winds in sheltered locations

FIRE BEHAVIOR

GENERAL:

Fire behavior should decrease today with an increase in moisture. North and northwest winds will continue to be favorable for containment operations.

SPECIFIC:

Division J: Fire will continue to back slowly down slope in timber fuels. Expect minimal rates of spread, generally less than 1 chain per hour, and flame lengths 1-2 feet. Torching is unlikely and, if present, should be restricted to isolated, single tree events. Upslope winds in Division J will be augmented by northerly general winds. This will cause increased potential for upslope spread when spotting is caused by rolling fire brands.

Division K: Northwest winds could expose Division K to increased fire behavior near the Five Dollar Campsite. Fire will continue to progress toward Ray's Peak where fuels are available.

Division L: Fire progression toward Division L in the Grizzly Creek and Rattlesnake Creek Drainages should continue to be monitored.

AIR OPERATIONS:

Visibility will likely be limited during the morning hours. Sunrise 06:59 Sunset 19:11

SAFETY

Continue to watch for rolling fire brands and fire progression toward indirect line. Don't take decreased fire behavior for granted. Remember that conditions can change suddenly, and red flag conditions are expected tomorrow. There are large pockets of heavy timber fuels between you and the fire.

FIRE BEHAVIOR FORECAST

GENERAL FIRE BEHAVIOR:

The fire remains fuels and topography driven. With the predicted weather expect one more day of minimal to moderate fire activity. Fire progression will be primarily by creeping surface fire. Expect spot fires out to 100ft. and from rollouts. Single and group tree torching will occur in dense stands where ladder fuels are present. Fire activity will decrease over night under the inversion.

Probability of Ignition is 70%

SPECIFIC:

Branch I

- Expect backing fire with rapid up hill runs towards the interior.
- Single and group tree torching is probable if the smoke clears out.
- Expect rates of 1-2 chains per hour in the Manzanita Creek Drainage.

Branch II

- The fire is not expected to impact the Branch during this burn period.
- With the NE winds any column developed in Branch I could spread brands.

Branch VI

- Expect backing fire with the potential for short runs up hill back into the interior.
- Single and group tree torching is still probable if the smoke clears.
- Watch for spot fires from rolling material.
- Expect rates of spread of 1- 2 chains per hour mainly in the interior.

Air Operations: Smoke in the drainages early, light smoke over the fire in the afternoon.

SAFETY:

Can you see the main fire or are you in contact with some who can? Remember the smoke.

CHANGE IN WEATHER: Pay close attention to the Fire Weather Forecast and Predicted Fire Behavior Analysis. Don't be surprised if changes happen; have a contingency plan for any situations and anticipate issues in advance.

CUMULATIVE FATIGUE & COMPLACENCY: Crews have been on fires all year, and this incident is 50+ days old. People are tired, both physically and mentally and this can lead to accidents if care is not taken. Maintain your situational awareness and don't let complacency creep into your work. Concentrate on doing the job safely. This includes wearing the proper full PPE, especially in mop-up situations; sleeves rolled down, hard hat, and gloves.

DRIVING: Cal Trans is paving Hwy 299 in the Base Camp-ICP area. Watch for flaggers and pilot cars and follow their instructions. Also, a few incident personnel still are not driving with their lights on. If you are in this category, turn your lights on as you leave camp. If you are a passenger in a vehicle, remind the driver of their obligation. Watch for pedestrians along the road in the Petersburg Camp/IC area.

ROLLING HAZARDS: Are above every work area on this incident. Pay attention to what is above where you park and where you work. Have a lookout anytime the possibility exists of something coming down.

Many safe hours have been accomplished so far but we have a long way to go yet, stay focused on SAFETY.


