WEATHER DISCUSSION: Surface high pressure will build into the Pacific Northwest today and tonight, bringing much lower relative humidity accompanied by gusty northeast winds, especially on the ridges and through northeast to southwest oriented canyons tonight. Winds will gradually diminish during the day on Saturday.

WEATHER FORECAST FOR TODAY:

SKY/WEATHER: Mostly sunny.

MAXIMUM TEMPERATURES: 1500-3000 ft: 77-82. 3000-4500 ft: 69-74. 4500-7000 ft: 60-68.

MINIMUM HUMIDITY: 1500-3500 ft: 16-21%. 3500-7000 ft: 12-17%.

20 FOOT WINDS:

LOWER SLOPES/DRAINAGES: Variable 3 to 5 mph until 1100 PDT then upslope/upcanyon 5 to 10 mph with highest gusts of 14 mph in northeast to southwest oriented canyons.

UPPER SLOPES/RIDGETOPS: North to northeast 5 to 10 mph until 1100 PDT then increasing to 8 to 16 mph with gusts to 22 mph.

SMOKE INFORMATION: Strong low level inversion in canyons lifting by 1100 PDT with maximum smoke rise to 7,000 feet MSL. Southwest drift of smoke.

WEATHER FORECAST FOR TONIGHT:

SKY/WEATHER: Clear. Smoke will drift southwest.

MINIMUM TEMPERATURES: Drainages: 47-52. Mid-slope: 51-56.

MAXIMUM HUMIDITY: Drainages: 35-40%. Mid/upper slope: 25-30%.

20 FOOT WINDS:

LOWER SLOPES/DRAINAGES: Northeast to east 5 to 10 mph with gusts to 14 mph until 2000 PDT then downslope/downcanyon 2 to 6 mph.

UPPER SLOPES/RIDGETOPS: Northeast to east 10 to 20 mph.

OUTLOOK FOR SATURDAY/SATURDAY NIGHT: Northeast to east ridge winds 10 to 20 mph in the morning...diminishing to 5 to 15 mph by the late afternoon. Slope winds northeast to southeast 5 to 10 mph with gusts to 14 mph in northeast to southwest oriented canyons. Daytime RH 10-15%. Nighttime RH 35-45%. Afternoon temperatures up 2 to 4 degrees.

### WEATHER SUMMARY:

#### RED FLAG WARNING DUE TO LOW RH AND GUSTY NORTHEAST TO EAST WINDS!

Maximum Temperature: 60-68%

Minimum Relative Humidity: 12-17%

Ridgetop Winds: N to NE 8-16 / Gusting to 22

Upslope winds 5-10 in sheltered locations

### GENERAL:

Fire behavior will increase today with significant drying. This will be most noticeable in fuel models where fine fuels drive fire spread, especially where fuels are exposed to sun and wind. In timber fuels, where spread is determined by larger fuels, there may be increase in fire intensity, but minimal change in spread rates.

### SPECIFIC:

**Division J:** Fire will continue to back slowly down slope in timber fuels. Expect minimal rates of spread, generally less than 1 chain per hour, and flame lengths 1-2 feet. The possibility of torching will increase today with lower relative humidity. Fuels below may be more receptive to spotting due to rolling fire brands, and the resulting upslope spread could be more significant.

**Division K:** While fire activity could increase in patches of brushy fuels, subsiding northeast wind should help moderate upslope spread.

**Division L:** Areas of active burning in the Grizzly Creek drainage could rapidly gain in intensity and progress up the drainage toward the saddle between Ray's Peak and Grizzly Butte. As the fire enters heavy timber fuels approaching the saddle, fire behavior should diminish. This area should continue to be monitored very closely for increased activity.

### AIR OPERATIONS:

Visibility will likely be limited during the morning hours. Watch for gusty conditions in the afternoon.

### SAFETY

Increased fire activity should be monitored very closely, especially in areas where unburned fuels are between you and the active perimeter.

### **FIRE BEHAVIOR FORECAST**

#### **GENERAL FIRE BEHAVIOR:**

With the low RH and gusty winds expect the fire to become more active. Any fire that becomes established in north-south drainages will run with the wind. Fire progression will be primarily by spotting. Expect spot fires out to 1/2mile and from rollouts. Single and group tree torching with some passive crowning is probable in dense stands where ladder fuels are present. With the low RH expect the fire to remain active into the night.

Probability of Ignition is 90-100%

#### **SPECIFIC:**

##### **Branch I**

- Expect mostly backing fire. Torching will cause spot fires, which will run with wind.
- Single and group tree torching is probable north of Twin Sisters.
- Expect rapid rates of spread on any fire outside the existing perimeter.

##### **Branch II**

- The fire is not expected to impact the Branch during this burn period.
- With the NE winds any column developed in Branch I will spread brands.

##### **Branch VI**

- Expect backing fire with minimal rates of spread.
- Single and group tree torching is still probable in the interior.
- Watch for spot fires from rolling material.

**Air Operations:** Smoke in the drainages early, hazy in the afternoon. Gusty winds over ridges.

Watch for spot fires to develop if fire intensity picks up with the wind.

**DRIVING HAZARDS:** There are numerous driving hazards on this complex. Livestock animals have been reported loose in the area of Cecilville road in Branch IV. Deer have been sighted in several fire areas. Drive defensively and anticipate these hazards.

Hwy 299 and Petersburg Road are busy and congested in both ICP/Base Camp areas. There are also pedestrians in both ICP/Base Camp areas. Some incident travel routes are narrow and/or dusty, travel distances are long, local residents continue to share the roads. Be alert for traffic, drive with your lights on, keep your speed down, and anticipate other drivers' actions. Watch for school busses stopping along roads.

**HAZARDOUS TREES:** Hazard trees, both green and dead, are a major hazard on the complex. Scout your work areas, flag known hazards and let others know of the hazard, have a lookout when working around the trees.

**HUNTERS:** And citizens in the closure areas have been observed in the North Bar area. Heads up and direct them out of the closure to safety.

# **MULE PROTOCOL**

**Safety standards while working around Mules.**

- 1. Do not leave slings & sling loads in the trail, move them to off the trail out of site of the mules.**
- 2. All people, tools, packs, chain saws, put on the down hill side, get away from the trail.**
- 3. Talk to the Packers in a normal tone(loud noises can scare the mules).**
- 4. Avoid sudden movements around the mules.**
- 5. DON'T FEED THE ANIMALS!!!!!!!!!!!!**
- 6. Don't pet the animals without the packers permission (NEVER PET THE HEAD).**
- 7. Packers cannot leave the animals to scout a line.**
- 8. Remember if you encounter the Packers with trailers on the road, they cannot stop fast. It could injure the animals. Give the Packers the right away.**
- 9. Animals don't go on the fireline, only the trails.**
- 10. Mules and Horses have the right away on the trail.**




