WEATHER DISCUSSION: A trough of low pressure will move into the Pacific Northwest bringing a return of west southwest wind over Northwest California. Ridge top winds should be out of the west and southwest and should be strong enough to push much of the smoke to the east today. Gusty upslope and upcanyon winds are likely this afternoon along west to east drainages. Cooler temperatures and higher rh's are expected tonight and Tuesday...as the trough moves slowly eastward. By Wednesday another ridge of high pressure is expected to build over the area.

FORECAST FOR TODAY:

WEATHER: Clear...less smokey at higher elevations. Smoke hanging in under the inversion through early afternoon clearing from west to east after 1300.

MAX TEMPERATURES:

Between 1500 – 3000 ft: 81 – 87 degrees.

Between 3000 – 4500 ft: 72 – 77 degrees.

Between 4500 – 6000 ft including higher ridgetops: 65 – 73.

MINIMUM RELATIVE HUMIDITY:

Between 1500 – 3500 ft: 24 – 30%.

Between 3500 – 5000 ft including higher ridgetops: 32 – 39%.

20 FT WINDS:

Upper Slopes/Ridge Tops: North and Northeast wind 2 to 5 mph...becoming West and Southwest in the afternoon ranging from 6 to 10 mph with gusts to 20 mph between 1200 and 1700 PDT.

Lower Slopes / Drainage: Down slope / down canyon or Northwest 3 – 5 mph until 1100 PDT then Upslope / Up canyon 4 to 8 mph. Stronger up canyon winds along favored West to east drainages 6 to 12 mph...with higher gusts ranging from 16 to 20 mph after 1300 PDT.

LAL : 1.

STABILITY/INVERSION: Moderate morning inversions forming along lower valleys and in canyons around sunrise. Smoke lifting by late morning at high elevations and be late afternoon around the lower elevation and drainages.

OUTLOOK FOR NEXT SHIFT (Tuesday): The trough will be centered over the area on Tuesday thus temperatures will be cool and rh's higher. High elevation winds will be out of the northwest ranging from 8 to 12 mph...while upslope and up canyon winds should remain under 5 mph. Good RH recovery is expected Tuesday morning at all elevations (>80%)...and will give way to minimum rh values around 30%.

EXTENDED FORECAST: Wednesday through Thursday...The weak trough slowly exits to the east leaving the fire area under northwest flow aloft. This means fairly mild weather for the region with near normal temperatures and rh values. Highs will be in the 80s with min rh's running around 20% on Wednesday. By Thursday a stronger ridge builds over the area thus temperatures will be higher and rh values down to 10-15% depending on Smoke abundance. Winds along higher elevations will be out of the east and northeast thus the potential still exists for Red Flag Warning type weather on Thursday and Friday.

WEATHER SUMMARY: <i>See attached Spot Weather Forecast for details.</i>	
ACTIVE FIRE BEHAVIOR IS ANTICIPATED TODAY!!! Gusty south/southwest winds will funnel upslope/upcanyon winds due to the low pressure system moving into the area. <u>MIN RH</u> 24 – 39% <u>MAXIMUM TEMP:</u> 65 to mid 80's in the lower elevations <u>WINDS (20 FT):</u> NNW 2-5G12 until noon; switching to SSW 6-10G20 from 1200-1700	
GENERAL FIRE BEHAVIOR: Inversion should be breaking by late morning in the higher elevations. Expect an increase in fire behavior due to an increase in solar radiation hitting the ground fuels and gusty winds. ERC has reached 79 for fuel model G on the Backbone RAWs which is now at the 80th percentile weather threshold. Shorter days are reducing the burn period.	
SPECIFIC: <u>DIVISION A/B:</u> The south/southwest winds are expected to influence the Manzanita Creek drainage as fire should make runs updrainage and towards Twin Sisters Peak which is rocky with very sparse vegetation. Spotting into Treloar Creek is unlikely but should not be ruled out. <u>DIVISION K:</u> Heavy down and dead fuels are very dry and will provide ignition source for isolated and group tree torching. Fire should continue to back down slope and should not be directly affected by the strong SSW wind due to the ridge blocking the direct affect of the wind. Torching and spotting from the interior may loft high enough to drop embers 1/2 mile ahead of the main fireline with a 60% PIG <u>DIVISION L:</u> Southwest winds will directly influence fire behavior and spread towards Rays Peak and Grizzly Butte. Given the continuous heavy timber type in this area the fire is likely to continue to burn up to and possibly over the saddle but will be moderated due to spreading downslope on the leeward side of the saddle. Spread distance could equal 1/2 to 3/4 mile with spotting up to 1/2 mile. <u>HOBO GULCH ROAD:</u> Isolated and Group tree torching in the interior of the fire could produce fire brands that could be lofted up and over the road and spot below the road. The PIG is expected to reach 60 to 70%.	
AIR OPERATIONS: Strong gusty wind over ridgetops could exceed 20mph gusts	
SAFETY: High winds still have the potential to initiate short runs through timber and brush stands. Dead and green trees can still cause spotting problems should they fall across the line.
