West of the Little South Fork, Caesar Peak and Canyon Creek. <b>Management Objectives</b> 1. Provide for Fire Fighter and Public Safety. 2. Support efforts to protect and rebuild infrastructure that include transportation routes, electrical transmission lines, and communications systems in the fire area. 3. # Fire Weather Forecast

**WEATHER DISCUSSION:** The trough of low pressure is currently over the fire area thus cold overnight lows and cooler afternoon temperatures are in store. Excellent relative humidity recovery will be observed at all elevations tonight and through Wednesday morning...and will lead into fairly moist rh values in the afternoon. Winds will generally be out of the west and northwest at higher elevations with light upslope / up canyon winds during the afternoon. The trough will move slowly eastward with another ridge of high pressure expected to build over the area late Wednesday.

**FORECAST FOR TODAY:**

**WEATHER:** Partly Cloudy with some afternoon cumulus buildup. Isolated light showers in the afternoon (20%) but no wetting rain expected. Smoke hanging in under the inversion through early afternoon...lifting by 1300.

**MAX TEMPERATURES:**

Between 1500 – 3000 ft: 76 – 81 degrees.

Between 3000 – 4500 ft: 67 – 73 degrees.

Between 5500 – 6500 ft including higher ridgetops: 54 – 60.

**MINIMUM RELATIVE HUMIDITY:**

Between 1500 – 3500 ft: 42 – 47%.

Between 3500 – 5000 ft including higher ridgetops: 50 – 55%.

**20 FT WINDS:**

Upper Slopes/Ridge Tops: West and Northwest 3 to 7 mph...becoming North and Northwest by late morning ranging from 6 to 10 mph with gusts to 20 mph in the afternoon.

Lower Slopes / Drainage: Down slope / down canyon or Northwest 3 – 5 mph until 1100 PDT then Upslope / Up canyon 4 to 8 mph. Stronger up canyon winds along favored North and Northwest drainages 6 to 10 mph in the afternoon.

**FORECAST FOR TONIGHT:**

**MIN TEMPERATURES TONIGHT:** 37 – 44.

**MAXIMUM RELATIVE HUMIDITY RECOVERY TONIGHT:** Greater than 80%.

**20 FT WINDS TONIGHT:** Upslope / Upcanyon 3 to 5 mph until 2000 PDT. Then down slope / down canyon 1 to 2 mph. North and Northeast winds along ridge tops 3 to 5 mph.

**STABILITY/INVERSION:** Moderate morning inversions forming along lower valleys and in canyons around sunrise. Smoke lifting by mid afternoon.

**OUTLOOK FOR NEXT SHIFT (Wednesday/Wednesday Night):** The trough will be centered over the area on Tuesday thus temperatures will be cool and rh's higher. High elevation winds will be out of the northwest ranging from 8 to 12 mph...while upslope and up canyon winds should remain under 5 mph. Good RH recovery is expected Tuesday morning at all elevations (>80%)...and will give way to minimum rh values around 30%.

### **FIRE BEHAVIOR FORECAST**

#### **GENERAL FIRE BEHAVIOR:**

This fire remains fuels and topography driven. Fire progression will be primarily do to spotting and surface fire. Expect spot fires out to 1/2mile and from rollouts. Single and group tree torching will occur in dense stands where ladder fuels are present. Fire active will decrease over night under the inversion.

Probability of Ignition is 70%

#### **SPECIFIC:**

##### **Branch I**

- Expect backing fire with the potential for rapid up hill runs towards the interior.
- Single and group tree torching is probable as the smoke clears out.
- Expect rates of 1-3 chains per hour in the Mazanita Crk Drainage.

##### **Branch V**

- The fire is not expected to impact the Branch during this burn period.
- With the NW winds any column developed in Brach VI could spread brands.

##### **Branch VI**

- Expect backing fire with the potential for short runs up hill back into the interior.
- Single and group tree torching will continue.
- Watch for spot fires from rolling material.
- Expect rates of spread of 1- 2 chains per hour.

**Air Operations:** Smoke in the drainages early, east sides of ridges will remain smoked in most of the day.

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#### **SAFETY:**

**Watch out Number 11: You have unburned fuels between you and the fire.**
