**WEATHER DISCUSSION:** Marine layer will continue to be deep today, at least 2500 feet and locally as high as 3000 feet. This will bring cooler temperatures and higher humidity readings to nearly all areas of the fire. Morning clouds in Carmel Valley will slowly pull back to the coast by late morning. Earlier sunshine is likely south of Pt Sur in the Sur Zone. The afternoon burn period will likely be shorter than previous days with the cooler temperatures and higher humidity. In addition the afternoon seabreeze will initiate earlier and bring low clouds and higher humidity air back inland by evening. Expect good humidity recovery tonight for the first night since the fire has started. Another reinforcing shot of cool air and high humidity on Saturday as another weak weather system moves through the region.



#### GENERAL

Overall fire activity is likely to decrease a bit as the higher humidity conditions move into the area. Fire activity above the marine layer (3000ft) will continue to be more active than the lower elevations. Fire movement below the marine layer (3000ft) will be less with more of an understory burn with low to moderate intensity. Monitor the moving marine layer and how it will affect your fire behavior in relation to your elevation. The fire is burning into the Basin Fire scar (2008) but fuel loading is supporting critical rates of spread and mid range spotting. **ERC continues to be in the 97<sup>th</sup> percentile.** The fire is burning in a mix of brush, grass and timber understory; fuels will vary by slope and aspect and proximity to the coast. During the nighttime RH recovery will be better than previously seen and will not support active fire after midnight. Look for shifting winds at the confluence of creeks and drainages.

#### SPECIFIC

##### Carmel Zone BRANCH I

Fire activity should be low. As you engage in mop-up watch for snags, fire weakened trees, stump holes, and dirty burn areas that have re-burn potential.

##### Carmel Zone BRANCH II

The fire will continue to burn interior islands between the main fire and the back fire. The N-NW winds will continue to cause smoke to shadow the branch. As a backing fire moves from Rock Ridge down to Los Padres Reservoir there could be short lived up hill runs from roll out. Should a spot fire across Los Podres reservoir and Carmel River, expect to have upslope runs as the fire will be in alignment with slope and heavy dead fuels from the Basin Fire (2008). Fire activity at night will be dependent on the position of the marine layer but the RH recovery will be better than the last week with POI less than 20%. Watch out working on indirect line and know what the fire is doing on neighboring branches at all times.

##### Carmel Zone BRANCH IX

Fire activity should be low. As you engage in mop-up watch for snags, fire weakened trees, stump holes, and dirty burn areas that have re-burn potential. Under the marine layer there is still potential for active burning. Fuels in this branch have been burning with low intensity even in relatively high humidity.

##### Seco Zone BRANCH III, IV, V

Smoke is expected to shadow the area again today making visibility difficult in some areas and may need multiple lookouts to know the exact location of the main fire edge. The daily progression of the fire should not impact this branch but escape routes must be identified and reevaluated as the operational period moves into prime burn windows.

##### Sur Zone BRANCH VII, VIII

Fire activity is expected to be minimal however, there is potential for slope reversal should the fire cross S.Fork Little Sur below Cabezo Prieto (north H2). Should the fire cross, expect very high to extreme fire behavior and intensities with rapid rates of spread. Despite being in the footprint of the Basin Fire (2008) the fuel loading is enough to continue progression to the South. Under the marine layer there is still potential for active burning. Fuels in this branch have been burning with low intensity even in relatively high humidity. Fire activity at night will be dependent on the position of the marine layer but the RH recovery will be better than it has been in the past week with POI less than 20%.

### AIR OPERATIONS

Smoke and fog could make visibility difficult throughout the incident. Fire Behavior can change rapidly don't rely on air craft for your plan

# CAL FIRE

## INCIDENT MANAGEMENT TEAM

### WATER USAGE PLAN

#### *California Drought Emergency*

The following shall be considered and implemented by all fire resources as a means to provide maximum efficiencies when utilizing water resources, while minimizing the impacts to private and public water supplies. Accountability shall be maintained for all water supplies that are utilized and care should be applied to ensure proper replacement and/or reimbursement to the supplier/ owner.

#### **Fireline personnel- (During mop up operations)**

- Use of Pencil Hose and Garden Nozzles with Shut-Offs.
- Use of Back pumps.
- Dry Mop-up and consolidation of heavy fuels to areas where they can burn out safely
- Locate/ Relocate Firelines to lighter fuels or natural barriers when safe.
- Set up and use portable tanks in anticipation of longer transport times for Water Tenders.
- Use of foams, gels and other water enhancers.
- Evaluate need to mop up in excess of 200 feet from fireline

#### **Road Maintenance and Repair-**

- Monitor and water roads only when and where needed.
- Water when most effective (evening and nights).
- Use chemical treatments when available (Magchloride, Omni bind etc).
- Consider use of tertiary or treated water (sp)

#### **Aviation Operations-**

- Use of Gels, Foams and Retardants. Set up portable plants.
- Consider Blivits and Pencil hose for interior mop up operations as opposed to numerous bucket drops.
- Establish and use pre-use agreements for existing and known water sources.
- Use large watershed dip sites when able. Minimize use of small, static ponds and lakes.
- Maintain accountability of water used and locations of dip sites.
- Evaluate need for interior bucket drops

#### **Private Water Supplies-**

- Notify property owner as early as possible.
- Minimize usage and develop alternative water supplies when and where appropriate.
- Track usage (meter, 214 form) and develop a plan to replace water.
- Make arrangements for reimbursement and damage claims if needed.

#### **Public/ Municipal Water Supplies-**

- Notify Agency as soon as possible and request a representative to the incident.
- Identify fill areas and request metering devices. Place on incident map.
- Use alternative or reclaimed water sources when available. Place on incident map.
- Make arrangements for reimbursement and damage claims if needed.

#### **Management and Supervision-**

- Use leaders intent and consider establishing Water Conservation as a Management Objective.
- Consider complexity of water use on incidents. Consider establishing a Water Supply Group Supervisor to coordinate additional resources to support the incident needs.
- Complete the Water Usage Report daily and turn in to Finance
- Review this check list and brief daily.





## **DEMOB**

### SOBERANES INCIDENT

CA – BEU – 003422

- Resources must Check-In prior to the Demob process.
  - In order to be deemed excess, supervisors must submit an ICS #213 to the Resources Unit.
  - **Please return all supplies and equipment, either at ICP-Toro Park or the camp assigned to, prior to reporting to Demob (ICP – Toro Park)**
  - **Strike Team Leaders and/or Overhead personnel** report to Demob (ICP-Toro Park) at the times posted on the Tentative Demob List, which is posted around the Incident Base and through the QR Reader. After receiving the #221, the STEN will report to ground inspection.
- \*Engines will report to ground support (Fort Ord) at the times posted. The engines will go through vehicle inspection and **weed wash** then wait for their STEN to meet up with them at Fort Ord.
- When the strike team and leaders are completed with ground support, the strike team will report back to ICP – (Toro Park) to finish their #221.
  - Resources will get signatures from the following units:
    - Motels
    - Supply
    - Ground Support
    - Weed Wash
    - Training (If they have a trainee)
    - Communications
    - Documentation
    - Time
    - Demob
  - After the #221 is given to Demob, all CAL FIRE, Federal, and Local Government personnel are approved to travel back to home unit or a reassignment.

## **FIRE SUPPRESSION REPAIR PLAN SOBERANES FIRE: CA-BEU-003422**

Fire Suppression Repair is the repair of damage caused directly by fire suppression activities. It is not the repair of areas damaged by the fire activity itself such as burned material and secondary damage such as falling trees or erosion from hydrophobic soils. We are responsible for repairing only the damage caused by fighting the fire. We are also not responsible for upgrading facilities beyond their pre-fire condition.

### **Instructions for suppression repair during mop-up**

While performing mop-up operations dozer or excavator operators will install waterbreaks on all dozer lines while dozers will install waterbreaks on secondary access roads. Dozer lines amongst the structures shall have the berms pulled and waterbreaks installed where necessary with hand crews to minimize the impacts on residents. Hand crews will install waterbreaks on all handlines, and waterbreaks on dozer lines situated on extremely steep slopes may also need to be installed by hand crews.

Scattered trash shall be collected and deposited in trash piles. Trash piles will be removed and placed at drop points either before or while hose lays are collected. Police your areas and clean them up as events wind down.

### **Inventory and Mapping**

Suppression overhead and other personnel will document repair needs and their location. This information will be given to the Fire Suppression Repair Group. **GREEN** flagging will be used to designate area in need of repair. The type of repair/instructions will be written directly on the green flagging for ease of use.

### **Objectives**

- Install waterbreaks while crews and dozers are actively onsite on roads, trails, and handlines damaged by fire suppression.
- Waterbreaks shall have proper angle and open outlets to insure effective drainage.
- Repair damaged fences (remember, those portions damaged by suppression efforts, not by the fire itself).
- Restore barriers on roads that were previously closed but opened for suppression activities.
- Insure that drainage is provided at crossings, ditch drains, remove deposited material, and stabilize approaches.
- Report any damage or damages mitigation to the Fire Suppression Repair Group.
- Complete all repair work as determined by the Fire Suppression Repair Specialist prior to final demobilization.

### **Firelines/Existing Fuelbreaks/Staging Areas/Safety Zones/Heliports/Drop Points**

- Remove debris deposited during suppression activities, including flagging and signs.
- Install waterbreaks where necessary for erosion control.
- Pull berms back onto disturbed areas, except in areas identified as needing a berm to serve as a barrier for roads/trails.
- Spread brush across the disturbed areas to provide ground cover and a seed source.

- Masticators/excavators/dozers with brush rakes or grapples will be utilized on existing fuelbreaks utilized during suppression efforts to reduce any excessive fuel loading.

**Roads**

- Clean culverts and drainage facilities plugged with soil and debris deposited during suppression activities.
- Re-establish cross drains and drainage if removed or made inoperable by suppression activities.
- Use cut brush – if available and nearby – to block off potential OHV access.
- Remove outboard berms created during suppression activities and incorporate into the road surface.

**Watercourses**

- All slash; soil and debris deposited into watercourses during suppression activities shall be removed.
- All loose soil must be pulled away from the watercourse and stabilized (graded smooth, and slash packed for cover).
- If excavated, the stream channel will be wider than the natural channel and set to natural grade. The approaches to the crossing will be sloped back to prevent stream bank failure.

**Archaeological or Historic Sites**

Equipment shall not to enter archaeological or historic sites unless the operator is closely supervised by an Archaeologist or Fire Suppression Repair Specialist. Many known sites have been flagged by the incident archaeologists. Archaeological or historic sites are delineated in the field with several types of flagging colors and designs, but generally flagging that appears to be encircling a given feature must be avoided. Known flagging schemes are as follows:

CAL FIRE:                      Yellow and black stripped & Orange and black stripped  
 U.S.F.S.                         Yellow and black stripped tied with blue  
 Santa Lucia Preserve:      White and blue tied together & Yellow and black stripped

**Waterbreaks/Waterbar/Cross Drain spacing**

Line or Road Gradient (%)	0-10%	11-25%	26-50%	50%+
Spacing	200 ft.	100 ft.	75 ft.	50 ft. (25' on Federal land)

Waterbreaks shall be cut diagonally with a minimum depth of 6" into existing grade with a 12"berm for a minimum height of 18". Waterbreaks will be installed at a 30-45 degree angle. Outlets shall be open and directed into non-erodible material.

**Conflicts with Suppression Activities**

Postpone repair activities that hamper access or other suppression actions. The location of needed repair actions shall be noted and relayed to the Fire Suppression Repair Group. DO NOT compromise fire lines by spreading flammable material across them.

## **Archaeological and Historical Sites Fireline Guidance for the (NAME) Incident**

**Do not compromise safety for the protection and preservation of archaeological and historical sites. When feasible and prudent:**

1. Be on the lookout for prehistoric and historic sites. Prehistoric archaeological sites include boulders and bedrock with mortars and cupules, holes and grinding surfaces, temporary camps containing scatters of stone flakes, and deposits of dark brown to blackish soil with shell fragments (midden) occurring in layers or mounds on flat surfaces near sources of water, along coastal areas and wetlands, along ridges and saddles, and other areas suitable for camping. Historic sites include old wooden cabins, barns, corrals and other buildings, rock foundations and historic artifact scatters. These kinds of resources are often found in the same kinds of environmental settings as prehistoric camp sites.
2. Some archaeological and historical sites have not been flagged yet. If you observe artifacts, features, or sites, attempt to avoid dozing or driving through and/or parking on these sites, if feasible, especially with heavy equipment.
3. If you can't avoid sites, minimize disturbance as much as feasible, only clearing the surface to as minimal a depth and width as necessary.
4. Leave all artifacts in place. Some artifacts may have been intentionally placed for religious or ceremonial reasons.
5. When a site is discovered, flag it for visibility and report its location to the Division Supervisor. If feasible, note locations of discovered resources on a map. Better yet, take a GPS reading. Leave information with the Plans Section so that the sites can be relocated and protected during both the suppression and fire suppression repair phases of the Incident.
6. If you encounter a burial or other human remains, cease work in that area immediately and contact the CAL FIRE Archaeologist. State law requires that CAL FIRE then contact the County Coroner, who will then determine if the remains are part of a crime scene. If the Coroner determines that the remains are Native American, State law requires the Coroner to contact the Native American Heritage Commission in Sacramento.

# Wilderness Special Instructions – Resource Advisor

## **DOZER LINES - DIVISIONS K, M, & P**

- Dozer lines will not exceed 50 feet in width except for safety reasons.
- Dozer lines in Wilderness will be repaired later; construct line to minimize impact.
- Do not push brush off steep hillsides – it will be spread over the line during repair.
- Minimize removal of top soil – it will be spread back over the line during repair.
- Avoid riparian areas, seeps and springs.

## **Wilderness Minimum Impact Suppression Tactics (MIST)**

The intent of Minimum Impact Suppression Tactics is to suppress a wild fire with the least impact to the land. Fire conditions and good judgment dictate the actions taken. Consider what is minimally necessary to halt fire spread and contain it within the fireline.

### **FIRELINE CONSTRUCTION PHASE:**

- Use cold-trail, wet line or combination when appropriate.
- Allow fire to burn to natural barriers.
- If constructed fireline is necessary, use minimum width and depth to check fire spread.
- Remove or limb only those fuels that if ignited would have potential to spread fire outside the fireline.
- Minimize cutting of trees, burned trees, and snags unless determined they will cause fire spread across the fireline or endanger workers.
- Cut brush or small trees flush to the ground; camouflage the cut surface with soil or brush.

### **HELISPOT CONSTRUCTION:**

- Consider using a long line remote hook in lieu of constructing a helispot.
- If construction is necessary, consider natural openings, or previously used areas. Cut only what is necessary to achieve safe operating space.




