FORECAST ISSUED: 2000 8/22/16

WEATHER DISCUSSION: The morning marine layer is around 2000 feet and will pull back to the coast by late morning. Conditions above the marine layer will start off mild and dry with poor to moderate recoveries. Below the marine layer, conditions will gradually warm and dry through the day. Temperatures are expected to be a little warmer than Monday as high pressure builds off the southern California coast. Terrain driven winds will prevail with more of a west to northwest component expected to develop by late morning with gusty sea breezes along the coast. Smoke dispersion will likely remain poor. Main concern for night operations remain poor humidity recovery with values forecast to dry during the overnight hours.

WEATHER FORECAST FOR TUESDAY:

WEATHER: Clouds, fog and patchy drizzle in the morning below 2000 feet. Becoming mostly sunny by late morning with areas of smoke. Clear above 2000 feet.

TEMPERATURES: 86-97 interior/ridges...79-86 lower slopes... 71-75 along Hwy 1. **24 HR Trend** (up 1 to 2)

HUMIDITY: Coast 50-60%...above 2000 ft / interior 15-25%. **24 HR Trend** (down 3 to 5%)

20 FT WINDS:

RIDGETOP - Sur Zone – Light winds becoming west-northwest during the afternoon at 5-10 mph. Gusts to 15 mph above Hwy 1. **Seco Zone** - east-northeast 2-4 mph in the morning becoming west to northwest 4-8 with gusts 10-12 mph in the afternoon.

SLOPE/VALLEY - Downslope/downcanyon 2-4 mph in the morning becoming upcanyon/upslope 4-8 mph with gusts 12 mph.

Marine Layer: Around 2000 feet.

WEATHER FORECAST FOR TUESDAY NIGHT:

WEATHER: Becoming mostly cloudy below 2000 feet, especially Sur zone and Carmel Valley. Smoke settling over the lower elevations. Coastal fog and possible patchy drizzle. Clear above 2000 feet.

TEMPERATURES: 68-74 above 2000 feet. 56-61 along Hwy 1 and up the Carmel Valley.

HUMIDITY: Full recovery below 2000 feet 80-100%...15-30% above 2000 feet locally 10% after midnight.

20 FT WINDS:

RIDGETOP - Sur Zone – West-northwest 5-10 mph gusts 15 mph early becoming 3-7 mph.

Seco Zone - West-northwest 4-8 with gusts 10 mph early becoming 2-4 mph.

SLOPE/VALLEY – Evening upcanyon 4-7 mph...becoming downcanyon 2-4 mph overnight.

Marine Layer: Around 2000 feet.

Extended Forecast: Conditions are expected to be a little warmer and drier on Wednesday as high pressure remains off the southern California coast. A trough of low pressure is then expected through the end of the week with conditions turning slightly cooler with an uptick in humidity once again.

FIRE BEHAVIOR

GENERAL

The fire will continue moving to the south mainly as backing and flanking fire. There will be some interior head fire runs in aligned drainages but none of these runs will impact existing containment lines. No active fire behavior is expected below the marine layer. Poor overnight RH recoveries (less than 30%) will continue and the fire will remain active at night. With over a week of little to no recoveries overnight all classes of fuels are critically dry. Heavier fuels at the bottom of moist drainages will slow the progression of the fire into and across creeks. When the fire does cross a drainage expect a slope reversal with short, rapid, intense uphill runs. The fire is burning primarily in a mix of brush and an oak understory. Snags, skeleton brush and heavy downed fuels are abundant and will increase the fire line intensity. Aspect is playing an active role in fire behavior. We are seeing more intense and complete consumption of fuels on the South and Western aspects. North and East aspects are burning as a mosaic and thus have potential for reburn.

SPECIFIC

Carmel Zone BRANCH I, II, IX

No forward fire progression is expected. Interior pockets of heavier fuels will continue to burn out.

Seco Zone BRANCH III, IV, V

Flanking fire will continue along north to south aligned drainages and will back off of Miller Peak. The fire has the potential to become established in Pine Valley. Fire will continue to slowly progress towards LP Reservoir from Buckskin Flat Camp. Wet Drainages will slow its progress toward Los Padres Reservoir. Rollout in this steep terrain will result in uphill runs back into the main fire. 10 -20' flame lengths in brush fuels should be expected when winds and fuel align with topography.

The fire is not expected to impact containment lines during this forecast period.

Sur Zone Branch VII, VIII

DIV O/P- Minimal fire behavior, interior smokes will continue, no threat to control lines.

DIV N – Fire progression towards the control line is not expected. Interior islands will continue to burn out. Monitor for rollout and re-burn potential.

DIV ZZ –DIV ZZ – Smoke from the Soberanes and Chimney fires has shaded fuels in the fire area. Moderated fire behavior should be expected under areas of smoke. The fire will continue backing off Logwood ridge into Delores and South Fork of Big Sur drainages. Fire will continue to back in the North Fork of Big Sur drainage and make attempts to reach South Ventana Cone and Pine Ridge. Primary mechanism of growth remains backing and flanking fire. Short uphill runs are possible. Favorable winds for line control today.

AIR OPERATIONS

Expect the smoke and marine layer to lift by early afternoon.

SAFETY

The fire is in an old burn scar and snags are abundant, look up to live!
 Incomplete burns means there is a high potential for reburn.


Ten Questions Every Fire Fighter must ask and Answer Yes to Before Engaging in Fire suppression

4. Do you know the weather forecast for today?
5. Have you followed the 5 Step Risk Management, assessed the fire behavior and made a prediction?
6. Are you interactive with the *Standard Fire fighting orders* and *watch out situations*?
7. Do you have the *Lookouts, communications, Escape Routes* and *safety zones* in place?
8. Do you understand that it is both your responsibility and your right to say *NO* to orders that cannot be accomplished with out compromising one or more *standard Fire Fighting Orders* or with out mitigating each of the *Watch Out Situations*?
9. Can you describe the fire environment you are going to operate in?
10. Are you prepared to engage, monitor the fire environment, be proactive, and make adjustments?



What Happens When You Get It:


Once urushiol touches the skin, it begins to penetrate in minutes. It is completely bound to the skin within 8 hours. Urushiol is the oil inside the plant that caused the allergic reaction to 70% of the population

You may develop any or all of the following:

- Red Rash
- Blisters
- Swelling

What To Do When You Get It:

Stop the symptoms before they start. If you know you've been exposed, cleanse the area immediately with plain soap and water to remove urushiol before it has a chance to bind to the skin. To remove the oil from your skin, scrub the area for several minutes, but do not break the skin, then rinse with cool water for several minutes. Once the area has been cleansed you may need to apply a topic ointment or further medical treatment.

Be sure to wash all clothing that you were wearing at time of exposure. Wash any bedding that you may have slept on as you can spread the oil from your skin or clothing to other parts of your body or to others.

- Tecnu
- Tecnu Extreme
- Zanfel
- Poison Oak Soap
- Cortaid Poison Cleanser
- Dawn Dishwashing Liquid

Oral medications that provide relief include:

- Benadryl (causes drowsiness)
- Claritin
- Chloropheneramine (causes drowsiness)

Topical treatments for the rash include:

- RhuliGel
- Cortaid
- Hydrocortisone Cream or Gel
- Calamine Lotion
- Caladryl Lotion
- Benadryl Cream
- ICP Clinic (Provided by Big Sur Medical Clinic)
- Exam and if indicated:
- Oral Medication (Prednisone)
- Antihistamines
- Injected Medication (Depo-Medrol)






MOLERA CAMP MAP




SLEEPER TRAILERS
