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Incident Strategy

The suppression strategy for the Soberanes Fire is full suppression with direct and indirect attack methods within the Life First Doctrinal Guidelines and Chief's Intent for 2016. To the extent possible, utilize existing or historic firelines for control purposes to minimize resource effects on wilderness. Provide for structure and community protection. A key element of the plan is flexibility and the ability to apply the right resource, to the right task, at the right time, for the right duration. It is understood fireline will be constructed only where it is feasible and safe to do so.

Leader's Expectations

- Provide the highest level of customer services to all involved with or impacted by the Soberanes Fire. All incident assigned personnel should be prepared to take the appropriate actions regarding:
 - Personal interactions both internal and external to the incident management organization
 - Personal safety and the safety of others
 - An incident-within-an-incident

Management Objectives:

- Provide for and maintain public and first responder safety by utilizing the incident safety analysis process.
- Protect all critical assets at risk to include the redwoods, historical assets, infrastructure and improvements, watersheds, and transmission lines.
- Utilize tactics that promote the protection of sensitive natural and cultural resources in the Ventana Wilderness.
- It is the Unified Incident Commanders' Leaders Intent to ensure collaboration at all levels of the incident.
- Be financially responsible for all management and fire suppression tactics.
- Foster and enhance community and political relationships.
- All management actions and efforts will be focused on serving, safeguarding, and protecting the citizens and natural resources of Monterey County.

Control Objectives:

- Keep the fire inside the current perimeter in the Carmel Zone to protect infrastructure in the adjacent communities.
- Keep the fire north of the Nacimiento-Ferguson Road to limit fire growth to the south at the point of greatest opportunity.
- Keep the fire west of Carmel Valley and Reliz Canyon to avoid impacts to the communities along the Highway 101 corridor and Fort Hunter Liggett Military Reservation.
- Keep the fire east of Highway 1 to protect the visual corridor of this National Scenic Byway.



WEATHER DISCUSSION: There will be some changes in the weather today as an upper low approaches the region. This will change the winds to a more southwest direction which will bring smoke from the Soberanes and Chimney Fires northward over interior portions of the fire. The southwest winds will be fairly light and tend to keep smoke over the interior of the fire with impacts for air operations. Temperatures will trend slightly cooler with humidity higher due to onshore winds and a slightly deeper marine layer around 1800 feet deep. Humidity values may actually be at a minimum this morning then creep higher as the marine layer mixes out during the day. For tonight the main concern will once again be very low humidity readings during the overnight hours.

WEATHER FORECAST FOR THURSDAY:

WEATHER: Morning fog, drizzle and clouds until about 9-10 am below 1800 feet otherwise clear with smoke.

TEMPERATURES: 82-92 interior/ridges...72-81 lower slopes... 64-71 along Hwy 1. **24 HR Trend** (down 2 to 5)

HUMIDITY: 18-28% interior above 1800 feet. 50-60% coast. **24 HR Trend** (5 to 10% wetter)

20 FT WINDS:

RIDGETOP - Sur Zone – Light winds becoming Southwest during the afternoon at 5-10 mph. Gusts to 12-15 mph above Hwy 1. **Seco Zone** - East-Northeast 2-4 mph in the morning becoming Southwest 4-8 with gusts 10-12 mph in the afternoon.

SLOPE/VALLEY - Downslope/downcanyon 2-4 mph in the morning becoming upcanyon/upslope 4-8 mph with gusts 12 mph.

Marine Layer: Around 1800 feet.

WEATHER FORECAST FOR THURSDAY NIGHT:

WEATHER: Becoming mostly cloudy coast and Carmel Zone below 2000 feet. Areas of fog and drizzle late. Clear with smoke over interior portions of the fire.

TEMPERATURES: 69-75 above 2000 feet. 52-61 in the marine layer.

HUMIDITY: Full recovery below 2000 feet 80-100%...20-35% above 2000 feet locally 15% after midnight.

20 FT WINDS:

RIDGETOP – Sur Zone – Southwest 5-10 mph gusts 15 mph early becoming 2-5 mph overnight.
Seco Zone- Southwest 4-8 with gusts 10 mph early becoming 2-4 mph overnight.

SLOPE/VALLEY – Evening upcanyon 4-7 mph...becoming downcanyon 1-4 mph overnight.

Marine Layer: Around 2000 feet.

Extended Forecast: Upper low stays over the region Friday with a 2000-2500 foot marine layer in place. General winds will remain from the Southwest 5-10 mph. Highs 80-90 above the inversion with 70s lower elevations. Humidity values 15-25% above the inversion both night and morning with full recovery lower slopes below the marine inversion. No big changes through the weekend with marine layer in place.

OUTPUTS

FIRE BEHAVIOR

GENERAL

Expect the fire behavior to moderate with the cooler weather. The fire will continue moving to the south mainly as backing and flanking fire. There will be some interior head fire runs in aligned drainages but none of these runs will impact existing containment lines. No active fire behavior is expected below the marine layer. Poor overnight RH recoveries (less than 30%) will continue and the fire will remain active at night. All classes of fuels are critically dry. Heavier fuels at the bottom of moist drainages will slow the progression of the fire into and across creeks. The fire is burning primarily in a mix of brush and an oak understory. Snags, skeleton brush and heavy downed fuels are abundant and will increase the fire line intensity. Aspect is playing an active role in fire behavior. We are seeing more intense and complete consumption of fuels on the South and Western aspects. North and East aspects are burning as a mosaic and thus have potential for reburn.

SPECIFIC

Carmel Zone BRANCH I, II, IX
 No forward fire progression is expected.

Seco Zone BRANCH III, IV, V
 Flanking fire will continue along north to south in aligned drainages. The fire has stalled on Miller Mt. there is the potential for the fire to hook below Miller and impact Pine Valley. Fire will continue to slowly progress towards LP Reservoir from Buckskin Flat Camp. Rollout in this steep terrain will result in uphill runs back into the main fire. 10 -20' flame lengths in brush fuels should be expected when winds and fuel align with topography.

The fire is not expected to impact containment lines during this forecast period.

Sur Zone Branch VII, VIII
 DIV O/P – In patrol status. No forward fire progression expected.
 DIV N – Fire progression is not expected to challenge control lines. Interior islands will continue to burn out. Monitor for rollout and re-burn potential.
 DIV ZZ – The fire has backed away from logwood ridge and is well established in the confluence of South Fork and North Fork of Big Sur river drainage. The fire will continue to flank around Olmstead Mountain, back into the South Fork and make short uphill runs back toward Logwood ridge. Once established on the south side of the South Fork uphill runs will take the fire further to the interior. Expect upper level winds to keep any smoke from the Chimney fire from reaching our fire area. Fire behavior will increase with clear air. Monitor for this throughout the shift.

AIR OPERATIONS

Expect the smoke and marine layer to lift by late morning.

SAFETY

The fire is in an old burn scar and snags are abundant, look up to live!
 Incomplete burns means there is a high potential for reburn.

- Are you prepared for a Medical Emergency, what are your options based on your location?

Looking at medical emergencies that have had bad outcomes several contributing factors come into play. Many of these by themselves are not a problem when several of these occur together the effect can be tragic. Being in an unfamiliar area with poor access not having the normal medical response available requires a different approach require far greater situational awareness to mitigate these issues. We have provided you with a check list of things to do before and during a medical evacuation. Please review these cards. Cut the cards out and laminate them for your line gear. Remember Pre-Incident Planning, good situational awareness and size up when you arrive at the work site, having a plan for your Div. regarding (EMT) **E**quipment, **M**anpower, and **T**ransportation may save a life. If you wait to plan it may be too late. If you have any questions or concerns please come by the Medical Unit and speak with the on duty MEDL.

Medical Pre-Incident Planning:

- Identify EMTs and Equipment imbedded in suppression resources.
- Review the Incident or Forest Emergency reporting procedures
- Review the Incident's assigned Medical resources and their location. (note radio call sign)
- Assure that all assigned supervisors have reviewed and understand the Medical Plan. (if none is available develop a quick plan before engaging)

Arriving at work site:

- Assess access and egress for medical ground units.
- Assure that all resources can clearly articulate their location. (update as they move)
- GPS potential Drop Points or Landing Zones.
- Note weather changes and check on availability of air resources.
- Pre-Position medical supplies

During Response to a Medical Emergency:

- Contact Communications and declare a **MEDICAL EMERGENCY!!**
- Identify the Unit needing help and their location
- Insure that LECS are maintained.
- Obtain patient info and severity.
- Develop a resource list
 - Initial care
 - Sustained care
 - Extrication/evacuation
- Report the Emergency and request anticipated resources needs
- Put two plans in place and start both plans clearly identifying the primary and backup plan to resources assigned.

During the Evacuation (every 15 min.)

- Reassess the treatment and the patient response (Are they getting better?) Do you have the right level of care?
- Assess the evacuation plans progress and adjust as needed.
- Assure that additional personnel are available for relief.
- Up-date Comm/Disp of the progress of the rescue.

The following are some tips for a slow, safe withdrawal from fire line life.

- Your first evening at home, start a roaring fire in the fireplace, turn off all the lights, and read a comic book by flashlight. Partially shut the flue damper and have a little smoke back up into the house, enough that it stings your eyes a little bit.
- When it's time for bed, turn on all the lights in your room. Leave them on all night. Sprinkle some dirt and pine needles on your sheets. Put some rocks and your dirty socks beneath your pillow. When you get into bed, be sure you've still got your boots or shoes on. Wear the same clothes you've had on all day. If your bed is too comfortable, sleep in an old, dirty sleeping bag near the fireplace and/or as close to the kitchen as possible.
- Have a friend come over, have him use a bullhorn outside your bedroom all night, using phrases such as "will the crew boss from San Carlos #6 report to plans," "ground support report to the Logistics Chief immediately," and the perfunctory "Ops Chief to Communications ASAP." Have him blow into the bullhorn at least two times before making each announcement.
- Have a couple of people who don't know you and have not been in your house before, wander in between 2 and 3 a.m. with huge red packs, pull out their sleeping bags, and sleep on the floor. Have them leave a radio on, switched on to one of the incident's tac channels all night.
- Lock the bathroom door. Arrange to have a porta-potty placed in your driveway. Have it delivered full, after being used by at least a couple of hundred people. Make sure the latch on the door doesn't work. Have someone open the door a couple times while you are using it. Make sure the porta-potty is placed somewhere very dark, and forget to bring your flashlight when you use it.
- Ask the person who delivers your paper to honk the car horn for you as early as possible – preferably around 4 a.m.
- Acquire a taste for half melted 'energy bars', made mostly from sawdust.
- Wear a stuffed backpack all day at work; if it is too comfortable, put some rocks in it.
- At lunch time, take your sandwich outside and drop it in a flower bed. Retrieve it and stand beside a full garbage can while you eat it. Wash it down with a drink that's been in the car trunk all morning.
- Several times during the day, hit yourself in the shins with a hammer.
- During the day take a break by lying down in the dirt outside, if it is too comfortable, lay on a few rocks. Use your hard hat as a pillow by putting it in the crook of your neck, below the back of your head. It is preferable if you find a steep slope in the sun to lie down, steep enough that you have to plant your feet on some downhill boulders to keep from slipping down the slope.






