## 4. Operational Period – 08/27/16

### Incident Strategy:

Protect values at risk by using a combination of direct and indirect tactics to suppress the fire. A key element of the strategy is to apply the right resources, to the right task, at the right time, for the right duration in order to achieve objectives with minimum firefighter exposure.

### Leader's Intent:

Incident personnel understand daily operational direction for all phases of the incident. Personnel take responsibility for their own personal safety as well as the safety of others, and take corrective action where appropriate. Everyone assigned to the incident understands their roles and responsibilities within the incident medical plan and the incident emergency plan.

### Management Objectives:

- Provide for firefighter and public safety through the application of sound risk management analysis and the implementation of appropriate mitigations.
- Protect communities, infrastructure and utilities, improvements, historical assets, and the Ventana watershed.
- Ensure cost containment measures are identified and applied.
- Enhance community relations and political relationships through timely information exchange.
- Provide for initial attack assistance at the request of Monterey Ranger District of the Los Padres National Forest.
- All personnel demonstrate principles of respect and dignity.

### Control Objectives

- Keep fire north of Nacimiento-Ferguson Road, west of Carmel Valley and Reliz Canyon, east of Highway 101 Corridor and Fort Hunter Liggett Military Reservation and inside of the northern containment lines.
- Advance and strengthen control lines and prepare to take advantage of containment opportunities on the exposed southern edge of the fire.
- When possible, minimize adverse effects to the Ventana Wilderness area by using minimum impact suppression tactics (MIST). Where opportunities exist, use preexisting containment lines.



## Soberanes Fire Weather Forecast

**WEATHER DISCUSSION:** A weak upper level low will continue to exit the area today as a weak upper level ridge of high pressure builds in from the southwest, bringing warmer temperatures to the area. The marine layer Friday extended to almost 2800 feet with only areas above that elevation seeing warm and dry conditions. The marine layer will be more compressed on Saturday but will still extend between 2000 and 2200 feet which will separate the warm and dry conditions from the cooler and moister ones. Once again, winds will remain light and generally from the southwest along the ridges while terrain driven winds will dominate along the slopes and in the valleys. Southerly transport winds remain weak for overall poor smoke dispersion with the smoke lingering underneath the inversion. Humidity values may be at their lowest early in the day and rise as the day progresses. For tonight the main concern will once again be low humidity readings during the overnight hours.

**WEATHER FORECAST FOR SATURDAY:**

**WEATHER:** Morning fog and possible drizzle. Low clouds until early afternoon below 2200 feet. Otherwise, clear skies with area of smoke.

**TEMPERATURES:** 82-90 interior/ridges...72-81 lower slopes... 62-68 along Hwy 1. **24 HR Trend** (up 1 to 2)

**HUMIDITY:** 15-25% interior above 2200 feet. 52-63% coast. **24 HR Trend** (down 2 to 4%)

**20 FT WINDS:**

**RIDGETOP -** Light winds becoming Southwest during the afternoon at 5-10 mph. Gusts to 12-15 mph above Hwy 1.

**SLOPE/VALLEY -** Downslope/downcanyon 2-4 mph in the morning becoming upcanyon/upslope 4-8 mph with gusts 12 mph.

**Marine Layer:** 2000 to 2200 feet.

**WEATHER FORECAST FOR SATURDAY NIGHT:**

**WEATHER:** Becoming mostly cloudy along the coast and below 2200 feet with areas of fog and possible drizzle. Clear with smoke over interior portions of the fire above 2000 feet.

**TEMPERATURES:** 67-74 above 2000 feet. 54-60 in the marine layer.

**HUMIDITY:** Full recovery below 2200 feet 90-100%...20-30% above 2200 feet and locally 11 to 16% after midnight.

**20 FT WINDS:**

**RIDGETOP -** Southwest 5-10 mph gusts 15 mph early becoming 2-5 mph overnight.

**SLOPE/VALLEY -** Evening upcanyon 4-7 mph...becoming downcanyon 1-3 mph overnight.

**Marine Layer:** Around 2200 feet.

**Extended Forecast:** The weak high pressure will bring a brief warming trend for Sunday and Monday but the marine layer looks to be well established and should hover around 2000 feet. General winds will turn more to the northwest with time. Another trough of low pressure will move into the area Tuesday.

## OUTPUTS

### FIRE BEHAVIOR

#### GENERAL

All classes of fuels are critically dry. Heavier fuels at the bottom of moist drainages will slow the progression of the fire into and across creeks. The fire is now burning primarily in a mix of brush and oak burned in the 2008 Basin Fire. Snags, skeleton brush and heavy downed fuels are abundant and will increase the fire line intensity. Aspect is playing an active role in fire behavior, with more intense and complete consumption of fuels on the South and Western aspects. Local upslope and up-drainage winds can push fires on those favorable aspects. Flanking and backing fire is producing a mosaic and a potential for reburn.

In the old burn scars, shrub fuels are not burning aggressively unless sun, aspect, and slope drainage winds align to produce headfire runs. 10 -20' flame lengths in brush fuels should be expected. SW wind at the ridges is not much of a factor for active fireline below the high ridges. None of these runs will impact existing containment lines during the burn period. No active fire behavior is expected below 2000' throughout the period.

#### SPECIFIC

##### BRANCH I, II, IX

No forward fire progression is expected.

##### BRANCH III, IV, V

Limited fire movement west of the Carmel River above the Los Padres Reservoir, Miller Mountain, and above the English Cabin. North aspects, downslope alignments, and lower fuel loads will continue to moderate spread, limiting the potential impact to indirect lines in these branches during the forecast period.

Fire will continue to slowly fill in the unburned pocket north and east of Double Cone.

##### Branch VIII

DIV O/P – In patrol status. No forward fire progression expected.

DIV N – Fire progression is not expected to challenge control lines. Interior islands will continue to burn out. Monitor for rollout and re-burn potential.

##### Branch VII

DIV ZZ – The fire has backed away from logwood ridge and is well established on the south facing ridge above the South Fork of Big Sur River. Look for fire to get established on the south side of the South Fork, further encouraging spread up the drainage to the southeast and to the ridge above Pick Creek if skies clear enough.

Otherwise, north aspects and downslope alignments should continue to limit overall spread to the southeast. Threat to the control line not expected during this burn period.

DIV UU – Fire not expected to reach the division in this burn period.

### AIR OPERATIONS

Expect the marine layer to lift later, by early afternoon, Smoke likely to linger in the interior again.

### SAFETY

Fire is moving forward in the interior. Increasing potential for exposure to unburned fuels between the fire and your lines. Incomplete burns means there is a high potential for reburn.

## Urban/Wildland Watch Outs

- ≈ Wooden construction and wood shake roofs;
- ≈ Poor access and narrow one-way roads;
- ≈ Inadequate water supply;
- ≈ Natural fuels 30 feet or closer to structures;
- ≈ Extreme fire behavior;
- ≈ Strong winds;
- ≈ Evacuation of public (panic);
- ≈ Bridge load limits.

## Powerline Safety

- ≈ Downed wire on vehicle – don't leave vehicle until power company arrives. If vehicle is on fire, or fire is near, don't hang on to door. Keep feet together and bunny hop away;
- ≈ Don't operate heavy equipment under powerlines;
- ≈ Don't make water drops on live powerlines;
- ≈ Don't drive with long antennas under powerlines;
- ≈ Don't fuel vehicles/equipment under powerlines;
- ≈ Don't stand near powerlines during water drops or retardant drops;
- ≈ Don't park under powerlines;
- ≈ Don't apply straight streams to powerlines;
- ≈ Thick, heavy smoke can cause arcing.

Archaeological and Historical Sites  
Fireline Guidance for the SOBERANES Incident

One of the values we protect on our National Forest is Heritage Resources, this includes the preservation of Historic sites, Archaeological sites, and sites with traditional or sacred values.

Known archaeological sites are flagged for avoidance with blue flagging tape and yellow and black stripe flagging tape together. Do not compromise safety for the protection and preservation of archaeological and historic sites. When feasible and prudent:

1. Be on the lookout for prehistoric and historic sites. Prehistoric archaeological sites include boulders and bedrock with mortars and cupules, holes and grinding surfaces, temporary camps containing scatters of stone flakes, and deposits of dark brown to blackish soil with shell fragments (midden) occurring in layers or mounds on flat surfaces near sources of water, along coastal areas and wetlands, along ridges and saddles, and other areas suitable for camping. Historic sites include old wooden cabins, barns, corrals and other buildings, rock foundations and historic artifact scatters. These kinds of resources are often found in the same kinds of environmental settings as prehistoric camp sites.
2. Some archaeological and historical sites have not been flagged yet. If you observe artifacts, features, or sites, attempt to avoid dozing or driving through and/or parking on these sites, if feasible, especially with heavy equipment. Some sites can be protected through avoidance, or by carefully removing flammable materials adjacent to sensitive features, or by wrapping with protective fireproof fabric.
3. If you can't avoid sites, minimize disturbance as much as feasible, only clearing the surface to as minimal a depth and width as necessary.
4. Leave all artifacts in place. Some artifacts may have been intentionally placed for religious or ceremonial reasons.
5. When a site is discovered, flag it for visibility and report its location to a Division Supervisor. If feasible, note locations of discovered resources on a map, and take a gps reading and photograph. Leave the information with an archaeologist (in the READ tent) so that sites can be relocated and protected during both the suppression and fire suppression repair phases of the Incident.
6. If you encounter a burial or human remains, cease work in the area immediately and contact the USFS Archaeologist. State law requires that the Archaeologist contact the Coroner, who will determine if the remains are part of a crime scene.






