**\*\* Different Wind Direction Today and still very dry \*\***

**WEATHER DISCUSSION:** Main impact will be the new general wind direction. South winds this morning will shift to be from the southwest later this afternoon. Best estimate is around 1600 hours, but it could be a couple hours on either side. Conditions will still be warm and dry...certainly well above normal for this time of year. Temperatures could be lower under smoke shading. Weather cools off several degrees Tuesday but we will see minimal increases in humidity as drier air moves in. Gaining confidence in a cold frontal passage Wednesday night followed by a significant wind event Thursday.

**WEATHER FORECAST For Today:**

**WEATHER:** Mostly sunny with passing thin high clouds. Smoke layer around 4000 feet lifting around 1100.

**TEMPERATURES:** Highs 83-92 in the active fire area. (2-4 degrees cooler)

**HUMIDITY:** 11-14%. (up around 3%)

**20 FT WINDS:**

**RIDGETOP / UPPER SLOPE –** South 3-6 mph increasing to south-southwest 5-8 mph with gusts 12-15 mph at approximately 1600.

**LOWER SLOPE / VALLEY –** Upslope/upvalley 3-7 mph.

**Inland Marine Layer:** Less than 1000 feet...little impact.

**Haines:** 4

**WEATHER FORECAST For Tonight:**

**WEATHER:** Mostly clear with some high clouds.

**TEMPERATURES:** Lows 48-52 in the valleys. Ridges/Thermal Belt 68-72 through the night. (2-5 degrees cooler).

**HUMIDITY:** Valley bottoms: Max 50-55%. Ridges/Thermal Belt: 20-24% in the evening, rising to 35-40% around midnight and remaining there.

**20 FT WINDS:**

**RIDGETOP –** Southwest 6-10 mph with gusts to 20 mph through the night.

**SLOPE/VALLEY –** Down canyon 2-4 mph below the inversion/thermal belt.

**Marine Layer:** Less than 1000 feet...little impact. **Thermal Belt:** Around 4000 feet

**EXTENDED FORECAST:** Tuesday and Wednesday see upper low pressure developing over the Pacific Northwest then moving over the Great Basin for Thursday and Friday. Have gained confidence in a stronger and stable northwest wind event Thursday with sustained speeds of 15-25 mph possible with afternoon humidity 15-25%.

<p>Coastal Sage Scrub fuel, primarily chamise and button brush, have seasonally low live fuel moisture for this time of year. Fire continues to burn in areas burned by both the 1999 Kirk and 2008 Basin Fires, and further south in fuels burned only once by the 2008 Basin fire. Snags, skeleton brush and heavy downed fuel are abundant.</p> <p style="text-align: center;"><b><u>Probability of ignition</u> : Day:</b> Shaded 70% Unshaded 90-100%</p> <p style="text-align: center;"><b>Night:</b> 60%</p>						
SPECIFIC						
<b><u>BRANCH III, IV, VI</u></b>						
<p>Fire behavior within the fire perimeter will be much the same as yesterday. Expect to see smoke start to puff up mid-morning from isolated heat and the possibility of short runs exists where there is any intensity.</p> <p>Within the areas that were burned out in the last few days you can still expect pockets of heat to make upslope runs where fuels are aligned. If enough intensity builds the fire will easily spread through less densely vegetated areas. Watch out for areas where winds align with north-south drainages as the potential exists for large fire growth. Smoke from yesterday's operations may help to shade portions of the fire area but is unlikely to have an impact on fire behavior.</p> <p>Fire behavior will moderate around 1900 as the humidity increases. The potential for upslope runs will be present where the intensity and continuous fuels exist within and above the thermal belt (4000 ft).</p>						
AIR OPERATIONS						
<p>A shallow inversion is possible but should have little effect on air operations. Smoke from firing operations will reduce visibility within the fire area. Smoke is settling up to 4000 ft and should lift out by 1100. VFR conditions expected through the operational period.</p>						
SAFETY						
<p>Remain situationally aware. Communicate weather observations to remain informed on current weather. Make sure any and all hazards have been identified and mitigated prior to working in an area.</p>

**WEATHER DISCUSSION:**

***\*\* Last Day of Warm and Dry, Unfavorable Winds Begin Wed \*\****

Weakening upper ridge over fire sandwiched by an upper low to the south and a frontal system approaching from Pacific Northwest. The upper low will move to east tonight while the frontal system will impact the fire with strong NW winds Wed, transitioning NE by Fri. These NW ridge will likely increase down Higgins Creek and pull any fire downcanyon. Marine layer stratus will thicken Wed/Thu, but should remain below 2500 ft.

**WEATHER FORECAST For Today:**

**WEATHER:** Shallow marine layer remains offshore. Upper low off southern California coast will keep ridge winds from SE through SW and push some high cloudiness over fire that may curb solar heating. Expect SW ridge winds to help keep fire activity within Higgins drainage.

**TEMPERATURES:** Highs 83-86 active fire area. (Down 2-3 degrees)

**HUMIDITY:** 10-14% (Up 2-3%).

**20 FT WINDS:**

**RIDGETOP –** S-SE 5-7 gusting 10 mph...after 1100 shift SW 10-12 mph, gusting 15 mph.

**SLOPE/VALLEY –** Downvalley 2-5 mph through 0900, then upvalley/upslope 3-7 mph.

Gusts 10-12 mph in the afternoon.

**Marine Layer Top:** Around 1000 feet Above Sea Level. **Haines:** 4

**WEATHER FORECAST For Tonight:**

**WEATHER:** Marine layer stratus should not impact the coast, and not impact to the burn area. Winds remaining breezy over ridges.

**TEMPERATURES:** Lows 61-64 in the valleys. 65-68 ridges. (Down 5-6%).

**HUMIDITY:** Lowering overnight 25-35% in Higgins drainage...20% thermal belt/ridges.

**20 FT WINDS:**

**RIDGETOP –** Becoming SSE 9-12 mph gusting to 15 mph.

**SLOPE/VALLEY –** Downcanyon 3-6 mph.

**Marine Layer:** 1500 feet impacting Highway 1.

**EXTENDED FORECAST:**

Tue into early Wed may keep W-NW winds due to approaching frontal system. The approaching front will increase the marine layer to near 2000 ft. Winds increase Wed-Thu as frontal moves through area, then NE winds return Friday behind frontal system. Winds may be quite breezy at Molera Camp Wed and Thu.

Many drainage bottoms did not burn during these previous fires and contain deep duff under timber and brush. These fuels can hold heat for many days and under the right conditions initiate fire spread.

SPECIFIC:							
Branch VI, VII and VIII: Heat will continue to pop-up in the Lost Valley Creek and Higgins Creek drainage area. Under current conditions if this heat finds the proper alignment with unburned fuels major runs are possible.							
AIR OPERATIONS:							
Smoke from burnout operations could limit air operations missions on the interior and along Branch VII.							
SAFETY: <u>Common Denominators of fire behavior on tragedy fires:</u>							
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Most incidents happen on the smaller fires or on isolated portions of larger fires.</li> <li>• Most fires are innocent in appearance before unexpected shifts in wind direction and/or speed results in "flare-ups" or "extreme fire behavior." In some cases, tragedies occur in the mop-up stage.</li> <li>• Flare-ups generally occur in deceptively light fuels, such as grass and light brush.</li> <li>• Fires run uphill surprisingly fast in chimneys, gullies, and on steep slopes.</li> <li>• Some suppression tools, such as helicopters or airtankers, can adversely affect fire behavior. The blasts of air from low flying helicopters and airtankers have been known to cause flare-ups.</li> </ul>

## MOP UP Operations

***Balance the risk of exposure to hazards against the Mop Up objective potentially achieved.***

- Evaluate mop-up distances against what is safe and necessary.
- Survey your work area; what hazards exist, and how can we mitigate those hazards.
- Trees: Gravity always wins. Look up, down and around.
- Concentrations of white ash will indicate areas of significant heat with possible hidden hazards.
- Hidden hazards: Burning root systems near stump holes can collapse when stepped on.
- Use appropriate PPE, know your assignment.

## Leader's Intent

- Task: What is to be done?
- Purpose: Why is it to be done?
- End State: How it should look when done.

## Points to Ponder

- Vehicle accidents are a common cause of firefighter injuries – **Drive Smart**
- FF's are injured or killed annually from falling trees – **Look Up**
- Ash pits and stump holes are the most common cause of burn injuries – **Look Down**
- FF's can be the cause of, or recipient of rolling debris – **Look Around**
- Heat, long hours, and repetition can lead to complacency and injuries – **Pace yourself**
- Multiple Resources of multiple typing doing multiple jobs = Multiple potential for injury – **Stay Focused**
- Communicate clearly and get confirmation that your message is understood – **Communicate Clearly**

## Statistics

- NFPA estimates 63,350 FF injuries occurred in the line of duty in 2015.
- An estimated 43% of those injuries occurred during fire-ground operations
- The leading injuries during fire-ground operations involved injuries such as sprains, strains, and muscular pain attributed to fatigue
- An estimated 17% of those injuries involved loss of work
- Injuries are more prevalent between the hours of 2:00 and 5:00 PM
- In 2015, an estimated 14,910 collisions involved fire department emergency vehicles responding to or returning from incidents.



## IIBMHB 2016 - PERSONNEL CHAPTER 10

### **Meal Periods (Actual Hours Worked Employees)**

Compensable meal periods are the exception, not the rule (5 CFR 551.411 (c) 36 and 29 CFR 785.19 (a))

Personnel assigned to the fireline may be compensated for their meal period if all of the following conditions are met:

- The fire is not controlled, **and**
- The Operations Section Chief makes a decision that it is critical to the effort of controlling the fire that personnel remain at their post of duty and continue to work as they eat, **and**
- The compensable meal break is approved by the supervisor at the next level and it is documented in remarks on the CTR, SF-261.

In those situations where all other incident support personnel cannot be relieved from performing work and must remain at a post of duty, a meal period may be recorded as time worked for which compensation shall be allowed and documented in remarks block on the CTR, SF-261.

For personnel in support positions, and fireline personnel after control of the fire, a meal period of at least 30 minutes must be ordered and taken for each work shift (e.g., a minimum 30 minute break for shifts of 8 hours or more). All meal periods unless justified in remarks must be shown as a 30 minute break.

**Local Government responding under CFAA follow their department policy and guidelines regarding hours and meal breaks.**

### **On-Shift Time**

On-shift time includes a combination of actual work, ordered standby, and compensable travel. On-shift time has a specific start and ending time and is recorded as clock hours. Each resource is responsible for ensuring they are meeting their 2/1 Work Rest Ratio and/or getting approval in advance from their supervisor and completing a Work Rest/Mitigation form to be approved by IC.

## **Archaeological and Historical Sites Fireline Guidance for the SOBERANES Incident**

One of the values we protect on our National Forest is Heritage Resources, this includes the preservation of Historic sites, Archaeological sites, and sites with traditional or sacred values.

Known archaeological sites are flagged for avoidance with blue flagging tape and yellow and black stripe flagging tape together. Do not compromise safety for the protection and preservation of archaeological and historic sites. When feasible and prudent:

1. ***Be on the lookout for prehistoric and historic sites.*** Prehistoric archaeological sites include boulders and bedrock with mortars and cupules, holes and grinding surfaces, temporary camps containing scatters of stone flakes, and deposits of dark brown to blackish soil with shell fragments (midden) occurring in layers or mounds on flat surfaces near sources of water, along coastal areas and wetlands, along ridges and saddles, and other areas suitable for camping. Historic sites include old wooden cabins, barns, corrals and other buildings, rock foundations and historic artifact scatters. These kinds of resources are often found in the same kinds of environmental settings as prehistoric camp sites.
2. Some archaeological and historical sites have not been flagged yet. If you observe artifacts, features, or sites, attempt to avoid dozing or driving through and/or parking on these sites, if feasible, especially with heavy equipment. Some sites can be protected through avoidance, or by carefully removing flammable materials adjacent to sensitive features, or by wrapping with protective fireproof fabric.
3. If you can't avoid sites, minimize disturbance as much as feasible, only clearing the surface to as minimal a depth and width as necessary.
4. Leave all artifacts in place. Some artifacts may have been intentionally placed for religious or ceremonial reasons.
5. When a site is discovered, flag it for visibility and report its location to a Division Supervisor. ***If feasible, plot locations of discovered resources on a map, and take a gps reading and photograph.*** Leave the information with an archaeologist (in the READ tent) so that sites can be relocated and protected during both the suppression and fire suppression repair phases of the Incident.
6. ***If you encounter a burial or human remains, cease work in the area immediately*** and contact the USFS Archaeologist. State law requires that the Archaeologist contact the Coroner, who will determine if the remains are part of a crime scene.




