


**\*\* Warmer and drier period underway \*\***

**WEATHER DISCUSSION:** Upper level ridge continues building overhead bringing warming and drying conditions. Sunday and Monday will be the warmest and driest days as light offshore flow prevails. Expect terrain driven winds will dominate the pattern with a possible return to brief and light southwest ridge winds in the afternoons/early evenings beginning Sunday. Otherwise, easterly component ridge winds will prevail. Very strong thermal belts with very poor humidity recovery the next several nights.

### WEATHER FORECAST For Today:

**WEATHER:** Clear.

**TEMPERATURES:** Highs 74-77 Ridges; 87-92 Lowest valleys near active fire. (8-12 degrees warmer)

**HUMIDITY:** 10-15% lowest valleys. 15-20% elsewhere (down 2-4%).

**20 FT WINDS:**

**RIDGETOP / UPPER SLOPE** – North 7-11 mph with gusts to 18 mph.

**LOWER SLOPE / VALLEY** – Upslope/upvalley 4-8 mph. Gusts to 15 mph in the afternoon.

**Inland Marine Layer:** Less than 500 feet...No impact.

### WEATHER FORECAST For Tonight:

**WEATHER:** Clear.

**TEMPERATURES:** Lows 43-48 in the valleys. 60-65 ridges. (5-10 degrees warmer).

**HUMIDITY:** Ridge/Thermal Belt: 28-33% early falling to 20-25% toward sunrise. Valleys Max 45-50%

**20 FT WINDS:**

**RIDGETOP / UPPER SLOPE** – North 8-12 with gusts to 20 mph shifting Northeast 5-8 mph with gusts to 15 mph around 2200 hrs.

**LOWER SLOPE/VALLEY** – Down slope/valley 3-6 mph.

**Inland Marine Layer:** Less than 500 feet...no impacts.

**Thermal Belt:** 3500 feet.

**EXTENDED FORECAST:** Strong high pressure continues Sunday through Monday. Sunday and Monday will be the hottest and driest days of the week. The upper ridge starts moving east Tuesday as weak low pressure moves north into the Great Basin and a slow moving upper trough starts moving south from the Gulf of Alaska. Ridge winds remain less than 10 mph sustained through most of the week.

Coastal Sage Scrub fuel, primarily chamise and button brush, have seasonally low live fuel moisture for this time of year. Fire continues to burn in areas burned by both the 1999 Kirk and 2008 Basin Fires, and further south in fuels burned only once by the 2008 Basin fire. Snags, skeleton brush and heavy downed fuel are abundant.					
<b>Probability of ignition</b> : Day: Shaded 60% Unshaded 90%					
Night: 40%					
<b>SPECIFIC</b>					
<b><u>BRANCH III, IV</u></b>					
Today will be a good day for firing operations in Branch IV. Fire should carry well in the continuous fuels. Additional intensity may be needed where the vegetation is sparse. It will still be possible to get short upslope runs to the ridges with any unchecked fire, but should be short lived. Branch III will see creeping and smoldering except where fuels are continuous, align with slope and/or winds. An occasional flare up may be possible in drainages with heavy fuel loading.					
Tonight should see a decrease in fire behavior by sunset. Fire will creep and smolder through the night with an occasional flare up. Fire spread will only occur in continuous fuels and where wind and terrain align. Firing operations may be difficult as fire will not spread easily.					
<b>AIR OPERATIONS</b>					
VFR conditions expected through the operational period.					
<b>SAFETY</b>					
As fuels dry out watch for indicators that suggest changes in fire behavior. These include numerous trees torching, smoldering fuels picking up, small fire whirls and frequent spot fires.

**WEATHER DISCUSSION:**

**\*\* Warmer & Drier \*\***

High pressure builds over the area through the weekend with increasing temperatures. Minimum RH lowers considerably over the weekend with terrain-driven slope winds and breezy ridge winds. Greater chances of marine layer clouds impacting the coast increase next week as the high pressure breaks down.

**WEATHER FORECAST For Today:**

**WEATHER:** Upper ridge builds in over fire with slightly weaker afternoon northeasterly ridge winds today, but still gusty. Expect lower afternoon humidity and poorer overnight recovery tonight. Clear along coast with minimal marine layer cloudiness this morning and no impacts to aviation.

**TEMPERATURES:** Highs 79-83...highest on lower slopes. (Up 9-12 degrees)

**HUMIDITY:** 10-14% Lower slopes... 14-17% Coastal Ridge (Down 2-3%).

**20 FT WINDS:**

**RIDGETOP –** NNE 10-12 mph, gusting 18 mph.

**SLOPE/VALLEY –** Downslope 3-5 mph through 0900, then upvalley/upslope 6-8 mph.  
Gusts 12 mph in the afternoon.

**Marine Layer Top:** 1000 ft marine layer offshore with no impacts.

**WEATHER FORECAST For Tonight:**

**WEATHER:** Mostly clear as marine stratus should stay just offshore. Remaining breezy NNE over ridges.

**TEMPERATURES:** Lows 59-62 in the valleys. 62-65 ridges. (Up 5-8).

**HUMIDITY:** 30-35% in Higgins drainage. 20-25% thermal belt/ridges.

**20 FT WINDS:**

**RIDGETOP –** NNE 10-12 mph gusting to 18 mph.

**SLOPE/VALLEY –** Downcanyon 3-5 mph with gusts 9 mph.

**Marine Layer:** 1000 ft marine layer with minimal impacts at H-70 & H-71 as it tries form on coast

**EXTENDED FORECAST:**

High pressure continues to build into Sunday with warming temperatures, lower RH, and diurnal wind shifts from SW in the afternoon and NE overnight. Monday and Tuesday will still be hot, but beginning to trend downward. The next frontal system approaches Wednesday and passes through the area Thursday into early Friday. This system will not be as strong as the previous frontal system.

<p>Coastal Sage shrub fuel moisture, primarily chamise and button brush are running below seasonal averages. Abundant dead fuels remain from the 1999 Kirk and 2008 Basin fires. Many drainage bottoms did not burn during these previous fires and contain deep duff under timber and brush.</p> <p>10-hour fuels yesterday 5% Coastal Ridge. We are entering a cycle again of very poor overnight humidity recovery, which will only degrade the already low fuel moistures.</p> <p><b>Probability of Ignition:</b> 65-70%</p>																			
<b>SPECIFIC</b>																			
<b>Branch VII:</b> Breezy conditions with lower relative humidity will continue to expose new hot spots in Higgins Creek drainage. Any fire that may get established will be capable of rapid upslope runs with flame lengths in excess of 8 feet afternoon and early evening.																			
<b>AIR OPERATIONS:</b> No known impacts to aviation.																			
<b>SAFETY:</b> During these periods of little fire behavior, complacency sets in and we are often caught off guard by changing fire behavior. Things are changing! We should never be surprised by fire behavior! Take weather observations frequently. Base all actions on current and expected fire behavior.






## Archaeological and Historical Sites Fireline Guidance for the SOBERANES Incident

One of the values we protect on our National Forest is Heritage Resources, this includes the preservation of Historic sites, Archaeological sites, and sites with traditional or sacred values.

Known archaeological sites are flagged for avoidance with blue flagging tape and yellow and black stripe flagging tape together. Do not compromise safety for the protection and preservation of archaeological and historic sites. When feasible and prudent:

1. ***Be on the lookout for prehistoric and historic sites.*** Prehistoric archaeological sites include boulders and bedrock with mortars and cupules, holes and grinding surfaces, temporary camps containing scatters of stone flakes, and deposits of dark brown to blackish soil with shell fragments (midden) occurring in layers or mounds on flat surfaces near sources of water, along coastal areas and wetlands, along ridges and saddles, and other areas suitable for camping. Historic sites include old wooden cabins, barns, corrals and other buildings, rock foundations and historic artifact scatters. These kinds of resources are often found in the same kinds of environmental settings as prehistoric camp sites.
2. Some archaeological and historical sites have not been flagged yet. If you observe artifacts, features, or sites, attempt to avoid dozing or driving through and/or parking on these sites, if feasible, especially with heavy equipment. Some sites can be protected through avoidance, or by carefully removing flammable materials adjacent to sensitive features, or by wrapping with protective fireproof fabric.
3. If you can't avoid sites, minimize disturbance as much as feasible, only clearing the surface to as minimal a depth and width as necessary.
4. Leave all artifacts in place. Some artifacts may have been intentionally placed for religious or ceremonial reasons.
5. When a site is discovered, flag it for visibility and report its location to a Division Supervisor. ***If feasible, plot locations of discovered resources on a map, and take a gps reading and photograph.*** Leave the information with an archaeologist (in the READ tent) so that sites can be relocated and protected during both the suppression and fire suppression repair phases of the Incident.
6. ***If you encounter a burial or human remains, cease work in the area immediately*** and contact the USFS Archaeologist. State law requires that the Archaeologist contact the Coroner, who will determine if the remains are part of a crime scene.




**TORO PARK ICP MAP**



# Fort Hunter Liggett Spike




# Liggett Spike Camp Directional Map
