FIRE BEHAVIOR ANALYST

WEATHER FORECAST: Weather conditions continue to change and be quite variable. SEE THE ATTACHED FIRE WEATHER FORECAST FOR THE LATEST and be sure to monitor your local conditions.

FIRE BEHAVIOR

GENERAL DAY SHIFT: Suppression efforts over the last several days have greatly reduced the chances of the fire spreading significantly. Increasing clouds and cooler temperatures will offset the strong winds that will persist today. In the absence of rain, fine fuel moistures are expected to range from 6 to 9 percent. Larger fuels continue to be extremely dry and will continue to burn until they are suppressed, receive significant precipitation or burn themselves out. Should something get started and is unaffected by suppression, expect spread rates in the 8-22 chains/hour range. Flame lengths will be 3-5 feet. Spotting distances are up to ½ mile and probability of ignition ranges from 30-50 percent. While seeing this sort of fire behavior is unlikely because of suppression, it is still possible given the expected weather conditions. Be sure to monitor your local conditions in case the weather becomes hotter and drier or cooler and wetter than expected.

SPECIFIC DAY SHIFT:

Branch I: Little overall fire activity is expected on this division today. Holdover fire in heavier fuels is still possible, but any spread in unburned fuels should be northeast and away from containment lines.

Branch II: This branch will remain down wind again today. While posing less of a threat than yesterday, areas of incomplete burning still pose a threat to containment. Unburned fuels next to the line with holdover fire or larger areas of unburned fuels within spotting distance of the line will still need monitoring and should not be allowed to build intensity.

GENERAL NIGHT SHIFT: With cool temperatures, moderate humidity recovery and a chance of rain, fine fuel moistures will recover enough tonight to inhibit fire spread. Smoldering in heavier fuels is possible. The fire will provide little light tonight and with mostly cloudy skies visibility will be limited.

AIR OPERATIONS: Continued strong winds today. Sunrise is at 0634 and sunset is at 1847.

SAFETY: High winds, falling snags and deep stump holes continue to be a threat to safety. If precipitation does occur, fuels and dirt roads will become slippery. Enough rain could cause debris on steep slopes to slide, posing a very dangerous situation. Clearly there are lots of fire and weather related safety issues that need your attention.


