




### \*\*\*ISOLATED THUNDERSTORMS THIS EVENING\*\*\*

**WEATHER DISCUSSION:** Upper level monsoon moisture will continue to move over the fire tonight. As a result isolated showers and dry thunderstorms will be possible this evening. Developed showers and thunderstorms will be capable of producing gusty and erratic winds. In addition... humidities will be slightly higher than last night due to the upper level moisture.

### WEATHER FORECAST:

#### TONIGHT:

**WEATHER:** Mostly clear. Isolated showers and thunderstorms in the evening. Areas of smoke... especially deeper canyons and drainages.

**MIN TEMPERATURES:** lower elevation 66-76  
upper valleys and higher elevation 63-70

**24 HOUR CHANGE:** little

**MAX HUMIDITY:** Lower elevations 25-40%  
upper valleys and higher elevations 35-50%

**24 HOUR CHANGE:** wetter 3-5%

**CWF:** <5% **LAL:** 2...1 overnight

#### 20 FT WINDS:

**RIDGETOP** – Southwest to west in the evening 10-20 mph with gusts up to 30 mph... becoming north to northeast by morning 5-10 mph with gusts to 15 mph.

**SLOPE/VALLEY** – Southwest to west in the evening 8-13 mph with gusts up to 20 mph... becoming north to northeast by morning 3-7 mph... lower slopes and protected valleys becoming downslope/downvalley winds less than 5 mph for much of the night.

**STABILITY/INVERSION:** Unstable during the evening becoming more stable after sunset with smoke settling into the canyons and drainages.

### WEDNESDAY FORECAST:

**WEATHER:** Partly cloudy with isolated showers and thunderstorms possible in the afternoon. Areas of smoke.

**MAX TEMPERATURES:** lower elevation 90-100... higher elevation 83-93

**MIN HUMIDITY:** lower elevations 10-20%... highest peak 20-30%

**CWF:** <5% **LAL:** 2

#### 20 FT WINDS:

**RIDGETOP** – North to northeast in the morning 5-10 mph with gusts to 15 mph... becoming west to southwest winds 10-20 mph with gusts up to 30 mph in the afternoon.

**SLOPE/VALLEY** – Terrain driven winds 3-7 mph in the morning... becoming west to southwest 8-15 with gusts to 25 mph. Interior locations will be terrain driven winds 5-10 mph.

**Extended Outlook: Thursday and Friday:** Upper level high pressure will weaken as a trough approaches the west coast. As a result... onshore flow will increase producing cooler temperatures and slightly higher humidities. Temperatures will generally be in the upper 80s to upper 90s and daytime humidities will be a wetter in the mid teens to near 30%. Due to the increased onshore flow afternoon and evening gusty west to southwest winds 10 to 20 mph will continue. Gusts 25-30 mph may be possible over the highest peaks.

## INPUTS

### WEATHER SUMMARY

Refer to Weather Forecast for details: **RED FLAG WARNING IN EFFECT UNTIL 9 PM PDT TONIGHT.**

Mostly clear. Areas of smoke. Min Temp – 63-70°. Max RH – 25-50%. Ridgetop Winds – SW 10-20 mph gusting to 30 in PM becoming NNE 5-10 mph in AM. Slope/Valley Winds – SW 8-13 mph with gusts to 20 in PM becoming Downslope 2-5 mph in AM.

### FUELS

Very heavy loading of decadent brush (chaparral, ceanothus, chemise, scrub oak, Manzanita) (FM4, SH5, SH7) across the entire fire area, 15 foot high with pine and Big Cone Doug Fir in the drainage and upper ridges.

Minimum fine fuel moisture: 4-7%, 1000 hour: 5-8%, Live fuel moisture: 60-65%. ERC's are running above 90%.

## OUTPUTS - FIRE BEHAVIOR

**GENERAL:** Local fire behavior thresholds: Wind (> 15 mph), RH (< 25%), Temp (over 90°), BI (> 201).  
Predicted BI for today – 212 (down 50).

Until about 2400 expect the fire to burn actively. After 2400 the fire behavior should moderate below 2500' due to improved humidity recoveries. Under 2500' Upslope Maximum Fire Behavior: ROS 20-40 c/h, FL 8-15, Spot Dist 1/5 m, PI 60%. Backing Fire: ROS 10-15 c/h, FL 5-8.

Above 2500' expect the fire to burn actively under the influence of the thermal belt. Upslope Maximum Fire Behavior: ROS 30-60 c/h, FL 15-25, Spot Dist 1/5 m, PI 85%.

### SPECIFIC:

**DIV B/C/D/E/F** – The fire will continue to back actively with occasional to frequent upslope runs. By about 0400 expect the fire behavior to drop noticeably. Conditions should be favorable for burning operations; however be heads up to the downslope winds, which may or may not impact all of the sub drainages.

**DIV H/L** – As the fire spreads west in to the Pacoima drainage, expect frequent upslope runs to the north towards the Divide Rd and to the south towards Mendenhall Peak. RH recovery for the area may be marginal above 2500', expect the fire to burn actively most of the night bottoming out at around 0400-0600. Initially the SW ridge top winds will not be favorable for burning operations. Expect the NE wind shift around 2300 resulting in more favorable conditions.

**DIV AA/BB** – The fire will continue to spread north towards Little Rock. As the fire moves to the NE towards Pleasant View Ridge, the fuel loading decreases noticeably, expect the fire behavior to reduce. Additionally, the wind shifts from SW to NE around 2300 will result in reduced fire behavior. These nighttime winds will be favorable for burning operations.

**BRANCH 20** – Yesterday the fire made a 5 mile run to the east into the San Gabriel Wilderness. It has crossed Devils Canyon below Mt Moody and is expected to make another significant run today, reaching as far as Twin Peaks or further. Fire behavior tonight will be very active throughout the night.

**DIV X/V** – Expect the fire to continue to spread actively as it moves towards Mt Wilson and the San Gabriel Wilderness. Fire activity will be greatest in the mid to upper elevations, in the thermal belt.

**FEEDBACK:** Collect WX obs hourly and turn in to FBAN or IMET at end of shift. Include fire behavior.

## AIR OPERATIONS

- Heavy smoke from convection columns may limit evening air operations. No night air operations.

## SAFETY.

- **Monitor the weather frequently for changing conditions. Don't let these increased humidities and cooler temps fool you. We are still experiencing critical fire behavior conditions.**



## MAJOR HAZARDS:

- **POTENTIAL FOR EXTREME FIRE BEHAVIOR WITH ALLIGNMENT OF WIND/SLOPE.**
- **DRIVING THROUGHT THE INCIDENT DUE TO ROAD CONDITIONS, DOWN POWERLINES, AND ROCKS.**
- **HEAT STRESS AND FATIGUE.**

## Fire Order of the day: Give clear instructions and insure they are understood.

- **Fire Behavior** – We are again experiencing active fire behavior. There is no significant relief in sight for the next couple of days. Drought conditions have resulted in live fuel moisture contents of 60-65 Percent and dead fuel moistures of 2-5 percent! To mitigate the potential concern, maintain situational awareness; establish LCES; follow the 10 Standard Orders; mitigate the 18 Situations.
- **H1-N1 (Swine Flu)** – There has been a significant increase in the occurrence of H1N1 especially in Southern California with one hospital reporting 700 cases. It is critical that any individual with flu symptoms and/or temperatures over 102 go to the medical unit. Please do not risk having your entire crew or even the entire incident base camp quarantined.
- **Hydration & Fatigue** – Maintaining an effective firefighting force is critical to successful fire suppression efforts. With the continued hot, dry weather hydration is essential to drink sufficient liquids. Drink and least three waters for each sports drink. Monitor yourself and those you supervise for symptoms. Be alert for signs of fatigue and take breaks as necessary.

## **L.C.E.S**

- **Lookouts-** Post experienced lookouts at good vantage points. Insure they know the crew locations and are knowledgeable about trigger points, escape routes and safety zones.
- **Communications-** Confirm radio frequencies. Provide updates on any changes.
- **Escape Routes-** Have more than one escape route that have been scouted. Time for the slowest person on the crew.
- **Safety Zones-** Use the black when possible. Consider rocky areas, water, and meadows. Evaluate for size and hazards.

## **Symptoms & Signs of Heat Illness**

**Heat Exhaustion:** Victim will have cool, clammy skin; pale coloring; feel weak, dizzy and/or nauseous.


Treatment – Have individual sit in shade or cool area; administer fluids; loosen clothing and assure rest.

**Heat Stroke:** *This is a life-threatening medical emergency!!*

Victim will have hot, dry, red skin and possible convulsions. These symptoms can progress to unconsciousness and death!

Treatment – Initiate emergency medical procedures outlined in incident Med Plan. Immediately cool individual's body by pouring water over them, especially the head and upper body. Monitor the victim and provide whatever medical support necessary. Placing ice around the neck, groin and armpits can help speed the cool down.


