**WEATHER DISCUSSION:** Little change in the overall weather is anticipated today as a trough of low pressure remains off the coast. Generally cool temperatures with low daytime humidities will prevail. Afternoon onshore will likely produce gusty southwest winds once again. The strongest winds will be in southwest to northeast drainages, upper peaks and southwest aspects.

---

### **WEATHER FORECAST:**

#### **TODAY:**

**WEATHER:** Mostly sunny. Areas of smoke.

**MAX TEMPERATURES:** Lower elevations 84-94  
Upper elevations 74-83

**24 HOUR CHANGE:** little

**MIN HUMIDITY:** 11-25%...locally higher under smoke east side of fire

**24 HOUR CHANGE:** little

#### **20 FT WINDS:**

**RIDGETOP** – Northeast to east in the morning 5-10 mph with gusts to 15 mph... becoming southwest to west in the afternoon 10-20 mph with gusts up to 30 mph in the afternoon. Local gusts to 35 mph above 4500 feet.

**SLOPE/VALLEY** – Northeast/downvalley winds 3-7 mph in the morning... becoming southwest/upvalley 7-12 with gusts to 20 mph. Local southwest gusts up to 35 mph along the Antelope Valley foothills

**STABILITY/INVERSION:** mostly stable in the morning with smoke settling becoming marginally unstable with day time heating.

---

### **SUNAY NIGHT FORECAST:**

**WEATHER:** Mostly clear. Areas of smoke... especially deeper canyons and drainages.

**MIN TEMPERATURES:** lower elevations 57-67... upper elevations 54-62.

**MAX HUMIDITY:** lower elevations 35-50%... higher elevation 25-35%... highest peaks locally to 20%.

#### **20 FT WINDS:**

**RIDGETOP** – Southwest to south in the evening 8-13 mph with gusts up to 30 mph... becoming east to southeast by morning 4-8 mph with gusts to 15 mph.

**SLOPE/VALLEY** – Southwest/upslope in the evening 7-13 mph with gusts up to 20 mph... becoming easterly/downslope by morning 3-7 mph.

---

**Extended Outlook: Monday through Wednesday:** The cooler air mass from the weekend will linger Monday and Tuesday with continued onshore flow. As a result... daytime temperatures will range from 80 at lower elevations to 70s at the ridgetops. Despite the cooler temperatures... daytime humidities will not increase that much. In fact... ridgetop humidity recoveries will remain poor to moderate. Expect the typical gusty afternoon southwest flow over much of the fire. By late Tuesday early Wednesday... the pattern begins to change with southeast flow developing aloft. This will bring some monsoonal moisture over the region the possibility for showers and thunderstorms.

### **WEATHER MESSAGE OF THE DAY:**

Take hourly weather observations and monitor the winds....deeper canyons will likely have gusty and erratic winds in the afternoon.

### INPUTS

#### WEATHER SUMMARY

**Refer to Weather Forecast for details:** Mostly sunny. Areas of smoke. Max Temp: 78-93°. Min RH: 14-24%. Ridgetop Winds – NW 5-10mph with gusts to 15 mph becoming SSW 10-20, gusts to 30 PM. Slope/Valley Winds – terrain 3-7 becoming SW / upvalley 8-16 with gusts to 35 mph in PM.

#### FUELS

Very heavy loading of decadent brush (chaparral, ceanothus, chemise, scrub oak, manzanita) (FM4, SH5, SH7) across the entire fire area, 15 foot high with Pine and Big Cone Doug Fir (FM8) in the drainage bottoms and ridge tops above 4000'. The dead component in much for the brush exceeds 60%, heavy stands of grass are completely cured. Minimum fine fuel moisture: 3-5%, 1000 hour: 5-8%, Live fuel moisture: 60-65%. ERC's are running above 90%.

### OUTPUTS - FIRE BEHAVIOR

**GENERAL:** Predicted BI for today 192 (down 62). Local Thresholds for active fire behavior: Winds (over 15 mph), RH (less than 25%), Temperature (over 90°) and BI (over 201)

Yesterday's fire behavior was very active to extreme; transport winds kept most areas smoke free. The most active area of the fire was in the San Gabriel Wilderness from Three Points to the West Fork San Gabriel River where the fire move up to 2 miles NE towards Waterman MT. Today expect the fire behavior to be similar to yesterdays. In the AM, the fire activity will pick up earlier than yesterday around, 0900-1100. Be prepared for winds to shift from NE to SW around 1000 depending upon smoke coverage. Heavy smoke will delay this wind shift. Convection column development is likely.

**MAX FIRE BEHAVIOR - BRUSH:** ROS 100-200 c/h, FL 20-60, Spotting Distance ½ mile, Probability of Ignition 85% **Backing fire:** ROS 30-50 c/h, FL 10-25. **TIMBER:** ROS 15-30 c/h, FL 3-8.

**Branch I and II** – For the divisions along the **Foothill Drive corridor**, the fire activity has diminished greatly.

Expect to find isolated areas of heat in the interior especially where fuels were heaviest.

In the **Mt Wilson area**, the fire has transitioned into a timber fuel model resulting in a significant reduction of the fire behavior. Expect the timbered, north aspect slopes to the north of Mt Wilson to burn with moderate to high fire behavior. If the fire from Lobo or Devil's Canyon does spot across the West Fork of the San Gabriel River, the fire could make a rapid upslope run with extreme fire behavior, convection column development and spotting. Should this happen, the SW ridgetop winds will limit the potential of spot fires over the proposed containment line. These winds will also be favorable for burning ops.

**Branch IV and V – Pacoima drainage:** Pay attention to wind direction, wind speed and RH and the effect on burnout and holding operations. **Bare Mt:** Sparser fuels at lower elevations will make burnout operations difficult. Burnout at higher elevation could also be problematic due to unfavorable winds as experienced yesterday. Mid elevations dominated by dense decadent brush still have potential for very active fire behavior.

**All areas** have the potential to burn actively when slope and wind direction are in alignment. Expect wind eddies around side drainages.

**Branch XX** – Along Hwy 2, expect the fire to spread laterally eastward and north towards Hwy 2. For the fire in the Three Point's area, expect the fire to back very actively to the north under the influence of the SSW winds. There is a chance of the fire making a strong push up the Chileno Canyon and further north possibly spreading into the West Fork Bear Canyon. With the active to extreme fire behavior potential, convection column development is likely. Be prepared for the column to collapse creating gusty and erratic winds.

#### AIR OPERATIONS

- Smoky conditions likely across the fire area until 1000-1200 especially on the eastern side.

#### SAFETY







## “DO BASIC THINGS VERY WELL”

- **Lesson in Fire behavior:** Events yesterday demonstrated that the potential still exists for extreme fire behavior on this incident. **Don't let your guard down!** Review “Severe Fire Behavior Potential” (IRPG p.76). Monitor current weather conditions and forecasts. Make sure all personnel receive thorough briefings every shift. Maintain adequate escape routes and safety zones. Advise all personnel if these are compromised or changed. Set trigger points when appropriate. **MAINTAIN SITUATIONAL AWARENESS!**
- **Driving on the Incident** – Drive defensively w/head lights on; use chocks & backers; watch for rockfall off cutbanks in burned areas. Increase following distances on dusty roads; slow down for opposing traffic. Be able to stop in ½ the visible distance on blind curves. **Maintain Situational Awareness!**
- **Hazardous Terrain** – Steep, rocky terrain is common on the Angeles. Rolling material is a major issue. Rocks and trees have been loosened or dislodged by the fire. Evaluate your work area closely before entering. Spread workers out farther than 10 feet apart. Stagger workers so they are not working or walking directly above or below each other.
- **Hydration & Fatigue** - Heat stress problems will continue as the weather is moderating. The higher humidities reduce the effectiveness of the body's heat regulating system since sweat doesn't evaporate as well. Be familiar with signs symptoms and onitor yourself and those you supervise for symptoms. Be alert for signs of fatigue and take breaks as necessary. Maintain 2:1 work/rest ratio. Pace yourselves.

### **Look Up, Look Down, Look Around**

- \***Fuel Characteristics** – Assess prior to beginning operations.
- \***Fuel Moisture** – Read daily shift plan and assess on site.
- \***Fuel Temperature** – Varies with exposure to direct sunlight.
- \***Terrain & Fuel Accumulations** – Scout prior to beginning operations and continuously during operations.
- \***Wind** – Measure, observe, feel and notice changes.
- \***Atmospheric Stability** – Observe indicators.
- \***Fire Behavior** – Monitor constantly prior to and during operations.
- \***Safety** – Ask questions in unfamiliar situations. The only “dumb” question is the one that wasn't asked.

### PERSONAL HEALTH:

- DRINK PLENTY OF FLUIDS AND AVOID ENERGY DRINKS.
- WASH HANDS FREQUENTLY
- VISIT MED UNIT AT FIRST SIGN OF COLD OR FLU-LIKE SYMPTOMS
- TAKE CARE OF ANY INJURY A.S.A.P.




