WEATHER DISCUSSION: Little change is expected in the overall weather today. Temperatures will generally be in the 80s with 70s above 4500 feet. Humidities will lower into the teens and 20s. However... ridge tops may start out very dry in the morning and gradually rise through the day. Typical diurnal winds will persist with gusty south to southwest possible this afternoon.

WEATHER FORECAST:

TODAY:

WEATHER: Mostly sunny. Areas of smoke.

MAX TEMPERATURES: Lower elevations 84-92

24 HOUR CHANGE: little

Upper elevations 74-83...cooler above 6k ft

MIN HUMIDITY: 11-25%...locally higher under smoke east side of fire

24 HOUR CHANGE: little

20 FT WINDS:

RIDGETOP – Southeast to east in the morning 4-8 mph with gusts to 15 mph...becoming south to southwest winds 10-20 mph with gusts up to 30 mph in the afternoon.

SLOPE/VALLEY – Northeast/downslope winds 3-7 mph in the morning...becoming southwest/upslope 8-15 with gusts to 25 mph upper slopes.

STABILITY/INVERSION: mostly stable in the morning with smoke settling becoming marginally unstable with day time heating.

MONDAY NIGHT FORECAST:

WEATHER: Mostly clear. Areas of smoke... especially deeper canyons and drainages.

MIN TEMPERATURES: 55-67.

MAX HUMIDITY: lower elevations 35-50%...higher elevation 25-35%...highest peaks locally to 20%.

20 FT WINDS:

RIDGETOP – Southwest to south in the evening 10-20 mph with gusts up to 30 mph...becoming east to southeast by morning 4-8 mph with gusts to 15 mph.

SLOPE/VALLEY – Southwest/upslope in the evening 7-13 mph with gusts up to 20 mph...becoming easterly/downslope by morning 3-7 mph..

Extended Outlook Tuesday through Thursday: The weather will begin to moderate on Tuesday as the upper trough from the weekend begins to weaken over the region. Temperatures will be in the mid 70s to lower 90s with continued low daytime humidities. Overnight humidities will remain in the moderate to poor range. Winds will be typical diurnal flow with gusty southwest winds in the afternoon/evening.

For Wednesday through Thursday...the weather pattern will change across the area as high pressure aloft builds over the desert southwest. The strengthening high pressure aloft... combined with decreasing onshore flow... will produce a noticeable warming trend. By Thursday... expect afternoon temperatures to range from the 90s at lower elevations to the 80s at the ridgetops. As this pattern develops... southeasterly flow will develop aloft which will allow for the intrusion of some monsoonal moisture into the area. This increase in moisture will result in some partly cloudy skies and the slight chance of showers and thunderstorms in the afternoon and evening hours... starting on Thursday.

INPUTS

WEATHER SUMMARY

Refer to Weather Forecast for details: Mostly sunny. Areas of smoke. Max Temp: 71-93°. Min RH: 12-25%. Ridgetop Winds – SE-E 5-10mph with gusts to 15 mph becoming SSW 10-20, gusts to 30 PM. Slope/Valley Winds – terrain 3-7 becoming SW / upvalley 8-15 with gusts to 25 mph in PM.

FUELS

Very heavy loading of decadent brush (chaparral, ceanothus, chemise, scrub oak, manzanita) (FM4, SH5, SH7) across the entire fire area, 15 foot high with Pine and Big Cone Doug Fir (FM8) in the drainage bottoms and ridge tops above 4000'. The dead component in much for the brush exceeds 60%, heavy stands of grass are completely cured. Minimum fine fuel moisture: 3-5%, 1000 hour: 5-8%, Live fuel moisture: 60-65%. ERC's are running above 90%.

OUTPUTS - FIRE BEHAVIOR

GENERAL: Predicted BI for today 251 (up 61). Local Thresholds for active fire behavior: Winds (over 15 mph), RH (less than 25%), Temperature (over 90°) and BI (over 201)

Yesterday's fire behavior moderated under the influence of a somewhat stable air mass. The fire was most active in Three Points, Mt Waterman and Cogswell Reservoir areas. **Today** expect the fire behavior to be similar and perhaps more active than yesterdays. In the AM, the fire activity will pick up around, 1000-1200. Be prepared for winds to shift from NE to SW around 1100 depending upon smoke coverage. Heavy smoke will delay this wind shift. In the timber fuel model the greater amounts of heavy fuels will require more effort to mop up and monitor/patrol.

MAX FIRE BEHAVIOR - BRUSH: ROS 60-150 c/h, FL 15-40, Spotting Distance 1/3 mile, Probability of Ignition 85% **Backing fire:** ROS 10-20 c/h, FL 4-8. **TIMBER:** ROS 5-15 c/h, FL 1-4.

Branch I and II – For the divisions along the **Foothill Drive corridor**, the fire activity has diminished. Expect little heat. In the **Mt Wilson area**, on the north aspect above 3500' the fire has transitioned into a timber fuel model with an oak understory, resulting in a significant reduction of the fire behavior. Expect this area to burn with moderate fire behavior. The SE winds will generally be favorable for the burning operations, however short range spotting is possible. For the burning operations, expect the lower slope to burn with higher intensity. Be heads up to the potential of reburn should the intensity build to fast on the lower slopes.

Branch IV and V – Pacoima drainage: Pay attention to wind direction, wind speed and RH and the effect on burnout and holding operations. **Bare Mt:** Due to sparse fuels at lower elevations, narrow strip head firing patterns will be more effective than backing. Burnout at higher elevation could also be problematic due to unfavorable winds over fire lines. Expect very active fire behavior in dense decadent brush. **All areas** have the potential to burn actively when slope and wind direction are in alignment. Expect wind eddies around side drainages and leeward sides of ridgetops.

Branch III, XX & XXII – Along Hwy 2, expect the fire to spread laterally eastward and north towards Hwy 2. For the fire in the Three Point's area, expect the fire to back very actively to the north under the influence of the SE winds. There is a remote chance the fire could make a strong push up the Chileno Canyon and further north possibly spreading into the West Fork Bear Canyon. With the potential for vary active fire behavior, convection column development is possible with gusty and erratic winds.

AIR OPERATIONS

- Smoky conditions likely across the fire area until 1000-1200 especially on the eastern side.

SAFETY

- Fuel type and terrain makes it difficult to find natural safety zones. Don't compromise.

Scene manager (DIVS or ranking overhead) shall make notifications, determine appropriate EMS response (BLS, ALS), and recommend the most appropriate method of transport (Medivac, Ground). Establish a back-up plan. For serious or life threatening injuries, the DIVS or OPBD shall contact the Com Unit to advise nature and location of the incident and request appropriate additional resources. The Com Unit will notify the IC, Med Unit, Safety Officer, and OPSC. Monday Day Shift -

09/07/2009 0600-1800

MAJOR HAZARDS:

- **EXTREME FIRE BEHAVIOR** – especially if fire becomes established in canyon bottoms
- **FIRING OPERATIONS**
- **DRIVING** on highways and roads within Incident

Fire Order of the Day – Base all actions on current and expected behavior of the fire.

- **Fire Behavior** – Although we are experiencing lower temperatures over the fire we are also experiencing lower humidity's along with gusty southwest winds. Fuel loadings can be heavy and combined with the prolonged drought can result in extreme fire behavior. The terrain is fractured and broken as a result of the many faults in the area and rather than an alignment of topography, wind, and fuels we are seeing more of a venturi effect with good venting and active fire behavior especially when fire becomes established in canyon bottoms.
- **Firing Operations/LCES** – We will probably continue firing operations in Branch XX. There is a degree of risk that the fire could cross our control line and not be caught. Therefore all personnel need to be aware of escape routes and safety zones! In addition, post experienced lookouts and verify command and tactical frequencies. Insure LCES is in place prior to firing.
- **Hydration** – is critical and continues to be one of the main sources of health issues. Begin drinking liquids before your shift. Avoid energy drinks which act as a diuretic. Drink sports drinks such as Gator Aide at the rate of 3 waters per sports drink. Be alert to heat stress in yourself and others.

Symptoms & Signs of Heat Illness

Heat Exhaustion: Victim will have cool, clammy skin; pale coloring; feel weak, dizzy and/or nauseous.

Treatment – Have individual sit in shade or cool area; administer fluids; loosen clothing and assure rest.

Heat Stroke: This is a life-threatening medical emergency!!

Victim will have hot, dry, red skin and possible convulsions. These symptoms can progress to unconsciousness and death!

Treatment – Initiate emergency medical procedures outlined in incident Med Plan. Immediately cool individual's body by pouring water over them, especially the head and upper body. Monitor the victim and provide whatever medical support necessary. Placing ice around the neck, groin and armpits can help speed the cool down.

L.C.E.S

- **Lookouts-** Post experienced lookouts at good vantage points. Insure they know the crew locations and have a are knowledgeable about trigger points, escape routes and safety zones.
- **Communications-** Confirm radio frequencies. Provide updates on any changes.
- **Escape Routes-** Have more than one escape route that have been scouted. Time for the slowest person on the crew.
- **Safety Zones-** Use the black when possible. Consider rocky areas, water, and meadows. Evaluate for size and hazards.







