





WEATHER DISCUSSION: An area of low pressure will move across portions of Southern California through early Tuesday morning bringing cooler temperatures...higher humidities and gusty southwest winds to the upper slopes and ridges of the fire.

WEATHER FORECAST:

TODAY:

WEATHER: Mostly cloudy in the morning with areas of dense fog and drizzle...mainly below 4500 feet over southern portions of the fire. Partial clearing at mid-day...becoming mostly sunny by the afternoon.

MAX TEMPERATURES: 71-81 degrees (below 4500 feet).
64-70 degrees (above 4500 feet).

MIN HUMIDITY: 35-45 percent (below 4500 feet)
25-33 percent (above 4500 feet)

20 FT WINDS:

RIDGETOP –Southwest in the morning 5-10 mph with gusts to 12 mph...
becoming 15-20 mph with gusts up to 30 mph in the afternoon.

SLOPE/VALLEY – Downslope winds favoring Southeast 3-7 mph in the early morning...
becoming Southwest/upslope 10-15 mph with gusts to 25 mph upper slopes.

STABILITY/INVERSION: Mostly stable with low morning clouds and fog persisting until around 1230 hours.

MONDAY NIGHT FORECAST:

WEATHER: Mostly clear in the evening...becoming cloudy with patchy fog after midnight in higher valleys and drainages.

MIN TEMPERATURES: 52-65 degrees...down to 45 degrees at highest elevation sites.

MAX HUMIDITY: lower elevations 65-80%...higher elevation 50-65%.

20 FT WINDS:

RIDGETOP – West-Southwest in the evening 12-18 mph with gusts up to 25 mph...becoming
North-Northwest 15-20 mph with gusts to 25 mph late.

SLOPE/VALLEY – Southwest in the evening 10-15 mph with gusts up to 25 mph...becoming
North-Northeast 10-15 mph with occasional gusts to 25 mph along upper slopes
and aligned drainages.

Extended Outlook Tuesday through Friday: The area of low pressure will move off to the east early Tuesday. Skies will be mostly clear and temperatures will gradually warm Tuesday through the end of the week. Daytime humidity levels will begin to trend down...and winds will continue to be gusty each afternoon over the upper slopes and aligned drainages.

INPUTS

WEATHER SUMMARY

Refer to Weather Forecast for details: Some clouds in the morning with partly cloudy in the afternoon.

DAY WEATHER: Max Temp: 65-80° Min RH: 25-50% 20' Ridgetop Winds – SW 10-20, Gusts to 30 mph.

NIGHT WEATHER: Min Temp: 45-60°. Max RH: 50-90%. 20' Ridgetop Winds – SW to NW 5-10, G to 15 mph.

FUELS

Heavy brush w/ a pine overstory on the most aspects between 3500 to 5500' (FM 2 mostly). Mixed conifer w/ a light brush understory on the N aspects above 5500' (FM 8). Moderate brush loading w/ grass on the S aspects below 4000' (FM 4). Minimum fine fuel moisture: 3-5%, 1000 hour: 5-8%, Live fuel moisture: 60-65%. ERC's above 90%.

OUTPUTS - FIRE BEHAVIOR

GENERAL: Predicted BI for today 50 (down 99) – LOW

For today expect the fire behavior to be generally low across the entire fire with the exception of low to moderate activity in the burnout area of DIV W. For most of the fires perimeter, the only remaining heat will be in the heavy fuels generally found in the drainages and at the higher elevations in the timber fuel types. Day time observed fire behavior will be limited to smoldering and creeping fire with just smoldering during the nighttime. Any green islands, open line, spot fires or new start have the potential for low fire behavior and could reach a size of 10-20 acres in an hour. Nighttime humidity recoveries will be good in the drainages and fair on the upper slopes. Mid slope and ridges may exhibit a mild thermal belt. Potential for active fire at night will be very low and confined primarily to DIV W.

DAY MAX FIRE BEHAVIOR POTENTIAL – BRUSH: ROS 30-60 c/h, FL 10-20, Spotting Distance 1/3 mile, Probability of Ignition 60% **Backing fire:** ROS 5-15 c/h, FL 4-10. **TIMBER w/ Brush:** ROS 6-15 c/h, FL 2-6.

BRANCH I, IV & V – For the divisions along the Foothill Drive corridor, Little Tujunga, Soledad Canyon and Bare Mt, the fire activity has diminished. Expect little heat.

BRANCH II – DIV W: As a result of the burnout operations, you can expect low to moderate fire behavior isolated to the burn area diminishing some into the night. With the increased wind speeds today, expect very gusty and erratic winds. Smoke in the drainage overnight will be light.

BRANCH III – In the **San Gabriel Wilderness (DIV Q, P & O)**, expect only isolated areas of heat confined to the heavier fuels within the interior. Below Mt Waterman, expect areas of heavy fuels to hold heat for several days, low potential for isolated area of active burning.

BRANCH XX - In **Squaw Canyon** expect only isolated areas of heat confined to the heavier fuels within the interior. Some isolated heat is possible along perimeter of the large green island below Alder Saddle.

AIR OPERATIONS

► Generally clear. Smoke from the burn operations should not be an issue.

SAFETY

- The fire weakened green trees and snags are getting weaker as each day passes. The increase in wind speeds will encourage them to come down. Be aware of them before they make their presence known.
- As the fire behavior wanes, don't let your guard down, focus on the mission and your crews attitude.

Transition.....Another watch-out situation!

- **Transition** - Mike Dietrich's team will begin a transition with ABC Team 3 (Wakoski) tomorrow. The transfer of command will occur at 0600 on Tuesday, Sept. 15th. This should be a seamless change. You can help make this happen smoothly by getting to know all of the new players with whom you'll be interacting and making sure all your questions are answered.
- **Driving on the Incident** – Forest System Roads are frequently narrow, winding and have few wide spots for turning around or getting by opposing traffic. Be alert for rock fall in burned areas across the incident. Inattention, distracted driving, or nodding off due to fatigue could easily result in tragedy. Keep your speed down. Drive with headlights on. Make sure drivers are well-rested. Increase following distances on dusty roads. **Maintain Situational Awareness!**
- **Hazardous Terrain** - Steep terrain is one of the most serious hazards on this incident. Rolling material is a major issue. Rocks and trees have been loosened or dislodged by the fire. Evaluate your work area closely before entering. Spread workers out farther than 10 feet apart. Stagger workers so they are not working or walking directly below each other.
- **Hydration & Fatigue** - Heat stress problems will continue as the weather is moderating. The higher humidities reduce the effectiveness of the body's heat regulating system since sweat doesn't evaporate as well. Monitor yourself and those you supervise for symptoms. Be alert for signs of fatigue and take breaks as necessary. Maintain 2:1 work/rest ratio. Pace yourselves.


