Narrative:

*** Situational Awareness:** Keep your guard up for changing conditions and react accordingly. Maintain situational awareness at all time. Think ahead and have a contingency plan. Know escape routes and safety zones.

*** Traffic:** When you are stopping on the roads in the fire area, make sure you pull over enough for other traffic to get by. Drive cautiously when approaching these areas and be heads up for personnel in the area. Watch your speed, drive with lights on and seatbelts fastened.

*** Night Operations:** Make sure you have fresh batteries for headlamps. Check the areas that you are working for powerlines, structures, hazard trees and other hazards. Know where everyone is before moving equipment or vehicles. Get a good briefing from day operations.

*** Work/Rest:** Always adhere to the 2:1 work/rest ratio. Supervisors must ensure that work/rest guidelines are followed.

Identify escape routes and safety zones, and make them known.

WEATHER DISCUSSION: The remnants of tropical system Andrea will continue to weaken as it drifts south off the east coast of Florida today. As it weakens, so will the northeasterly winds which have plagued the fire area over the last few days. Otherwise, temperatures will warm and relative humidity will lower this afternoon as drier air wraps in behind Andrea. A weak frontal boundary will drift south over the fire area by the end of the weekend bringing an increase in the chances for thunderstorms by Sunday.

WEATHER FORECAST:

...Warmer and Drier Today...

WEATHER: Partly cloudy and smoky.

TEMPERATURES: High near 89, 4 degrees warmer.

HUMIDITY: Minimum afternoon humidity near 35%, 6 percent drier.

20 FT WINDS: Northeast 6 to 9 mph with a few gusts to 18 mph during the afternoon.

MIXING HEIGHT: 7200 ft.

TRANSPORT WINDS: Northeast at 10 mph, becoming east at 14 mph late in the afternoon.

HAINES INDEX: 5, or moderate potential for large fire growth.

OUTLOOK FOR FRIDAY NIGHT SHIFT: Partly cloudy above dense smoke. Low near 62. Max RH 100%. Light east winds.

EXTENDED FORECAST:

Saturday: Partly cloudy with a 20% chance for a thunderstorm in the afternoon and overnight. High near 90 with the low near 63. Minimum RH 38%. Light east winds.

Sunday: Partly cloudy with scattered thunderstorms, mainly in the afternoon and evening. High near 88 with the low near 65. Minimum RH 43%. Light winds. Chance for wetting rains 50%.

Monday: Partly cloudy with scattered thunderstorms, mainly in the afternoon and evening. High near 88 with the low near 65. Minimum RH 44%. Light winds. Chance for wetting rains 40%.

SPECIFIC FIRE BEHAVIOR:			
<p><i>Divisions A/B/C/D/E/F: Strong gusty afternoon winds from NE will continue to push against any control line aligned near perpendicular to its direction of flow. Spotting will continue to be an issue. Control lines aligned in a NE-to-SW direction will experience flanking fire. Expect some spotting from flanking fire as vortices spin column containing embers across control line. Pay attention to extreme fire behavior that may create its own local wind in-drafts that can develop vortices capable of lying across control lines and entrapping personnel.</i></p> <p><i>Structure: Probable encounters with unconventional wildland fuels (i.e., ammunition; noxious smoke from burning plastics and metals; exterior propane gas tanks; treated utility poles; etc. Avoid inhaling smoke from these fuels as much as possible. Adequate space between incoming fire front and structure should be assessed to determine if structure can be safely defended by fire personnel. Expect increased fire behavior when structure becomes involved with fire.</i></p>
