<p>6. Weather Forecast for Period</p> <p style="text-align: center;">...Red Flag Warning in Effect from 11 am to 7 pm Today for Low Relative Humidity...</p> <p>Sunny, warm and dry. Pockets of smoke early in Divisions BB and CC. Highs from 86 to 89 and relative humidities from 20-25%. Winds will be 2 to 4 mph in the morning, then becoming east to southeast at 5 to 9 mph with a few gusts up to 14 mph in the afternoon.</p>																		
<p>7. General Safety Message</p> <p>Keep your guard up for changing conditions and react accordingly. Maintain situational awareness at all times. Think ahead and have a contingency plan. Know escape routes and safety zones.</p> <p style="text-align: center;"><u>Road Construction Alert</u></p> <p>The Department of Transportation has advised us that road construction is scheduled for the section of Hwy. 441 between Hwy. 90 and the junction with Hwy. 100A beginning on Monday May 21. Traffic delays can be expected in this area. If you need to travel to Deep Creek, it is advisable to turn right off Hwy. 90 onto Hwy. 100A just past the airport (as you enter Lake City from the east)and travel Hwy. 100A to Hwy. 441 and then North on Hwy. 441 to Deep Creek. This route will avoid the construction area. You can also access Hwy. 441 from I-10 and then North to Deep Creek.</p>

WEATHER FORECAST Tony Edwards – Incident Meteorologist
Bugaboo Incident NF in Florida/Florida Div. of Forestry Forecast #22 5/21/2007 Day

WEATHER DISCUSSION: - High pressure will gradually shift east from Tennessee into the western Atlantic by mid-week. This will cause an increase in the easterly onshore flow and corresponding increase in humidity levels by Wednesday. Another very dry day is anticipated today, however, with a Red Flag Warning in effect for an extended period of low relative humidity late this morning and this afternoon.

WEATHER FORECAST: - **Red Flag Warning in Effect from 11am to 7 pm Today for Low Relative Humidity**

GENERAL: Sunny, warm and dry. Pockets of smoke early in Divisions BB and CC.

TEMPERATURES: Lows 86 to 89. **HUMIDITY:** minimum 20-25%
24 HOUR TREND: 2 degrees warmer. **24 HOUR TREND:** 4% wetter

20 FT WINDS: Variable 2 to 4 mph in the morning, then becoming east to southeast 5 to 9 mph with a few gusts up to 14 mph in the afternoon.

STABILITY/INVERSION: Morning inversion around 300 feet mixing out by 0900, then mixing height rising to around 6500 ft. Transport winds south around 5 mph through 1100, then becoming southeast around 12 mph. Dispersion index 48.

HAINES INDEX: 5 or moderate potential for large plume dominated fire growth.

OUTLOOK FOR MONDAY NIGHT SHIFT: Clear and cool. Lows 51 to 54. Humidity recovering to around 100%. 20 ft winds from the southeast 3 to 6 mph early, then becoming calm.

EXTENDED FORECAST:

Tuesday: Partly cloudy. Highs 86-89. Minimum RH 28-33%. East winds 7 to 12 mph, with gusts up to 16 mph.
Wednesday: Partly cloudy with a 20% chance for an afternoon shower or thunderstorm. Lows 58-61. Highs 84-87. Minimum RH 34-39%. East winds 7 to 12 mph.
Thursday: Partly cloudy with a 30% chance for afternoon showers and thunderstorms. Lows 59-62. Highs 82-85. Minimum RH 35-40%. East winds 7 to 12 mph.
Friday through Sunday: Partly cloudy with scattered afternoon and evening thunderstorms. Lows 60-65. Highs 83-88. Winds 10 mph or less from the east through the period

GENERAL FIRE BEHAVIOR (outside fire perimeter):

Type of fire: <i>Wind-dominated surface</i>	FL – 10 to 13 feet
ROS –72 to 128 <i>chains per hour</i>	SPOTTING – 0.5 to 0.8 miles
POI – 90%	ERC - 40 – <i>Extreme (Consult pocket card for local fire behavior thresholds)</i>

CROWN – Passive when distance between surface and aerial fuel < 21 ft through 9 mph, then < 31 ft through 15 mph.

SPECIFIC FIRE BEHAVIOR:

Extreme fire behavior if fire gets outside perimeter. Three local thresholds: wind > 10 mph (14 today), RH < 25 (<25% today), and Keetch-Byram Drought Index > 500 (600-700 today) will be met today. Temperature is forecasted to be just one degree below the > 90°F threshold.

All Divisions: While interior fine fuels (1-hr), within a chain of the fire's perimeter, are becoming scarce and this scarcity reduces the probability of embers crossing the perimeter, a possibility still exists that embers may cross the perimeter and find available fuel that supports fire. This probability increases as desiccated pine needles fall to surface, accumulate, and increase reburn potential (presently east side of fire). Links between surface and latter fuels are almost severed. But, there is a possibility that pockets of heat near available fuel may still respond to wind and low relative humidity, become active, and throw embers into wind stream. Although, the probability is low that torching will produce embers that cross perimeter, the possibility still exists.

Cont.

Thick root mats, with duff, give ground fire an opportunity to retain heat over an extended time period, or interact with recently deposited pine needles, unless dug out. Bay laurels and cypress may support surface fire intense enough to scorch overstory, but generally will not support passive crowning (torching) of overstory trees.
Divisions A/B/C/D/E: (Night) See comments under "All Divisions."

AIR OPERATIONS: Dense smoke from smoke and fog may interfere with early morning aircraft use.

SAFETY MESSAGE

SAFETY starts with *YOU*

Fire Order of the Day – *Keep informed on fire weather conditions and forecasts.*
Watch Out Situation – *Fight fire aggressively, having provided for safety first.*

Major Hazards and Risks:

- **Driving** – Drive defensively with lights on at all times. Maintain distance between vehicles, anticipate oncoming traffic, and always fasten your seatbelt. Use spotters when backing up especially with heavy equipment/engines. Beware of increased public traffic on Hwy 441 and children in the area.
- **Complacency** – Stay vigilant and expect the unexpected. It is during this winding down stage of the fire that personnel tend to become complacent and let their guard down – maintain LCES at all times.
- **Weather** – Red flag conditions will be possible for the next several days. Insure that escape routes and safety zones are known and communicated to all personnel on the line.
- **Fatigue/dehydration/personal welfare** – Take care of yourself by getting adequate rest, eating properly, and drink plenty of water. Watch for cumulative fatigue effects on personnel.
- **Wildlife** – Be alert for alligators, snakes, bears, and other critters out there that can hurt you – be especially vigilant around any water. Don't feed the wildlife and make sure all garbage and food scraps are removed from the line.

REMEMBER – LCES: Lookouts, Communications, Escape Routes, and Safety Zones.

Maintain situational awareness – work aggressively but provide for SAFETY FIRST and initiate all actions based on Safety.
