6. Weather Forecast for Period ...Be on the lookout for erratic, gusty winds and cloud-to-ground lightning with any thunderstorm. Areas of dense smoke early. Partly cloudy with a 30% chance for showers and thunderstorms. Highs in 80-85 with minimum humidity 40-45%. NW winds at 3-6 mph in th morning , then 4-8 mph in the afternoon.			
7. General Safety Message  Keep your guard up for changing conditions and react accordingly. Maintain situational awareness at all times. Think ahead and have a contingency plan. Know escape routes and safety zones.  <p style="text-align: center;"><u>Road Construction Alert</u></p> The Department of Transportation has advised us that road construction is scheduled for the section of Hwy. 441 between Hwy. 90 and the junction with Hwy. 100A beginning on Tuesday May 15. Traffic delays can be expected in this area over the next several days. If you need to travel to Deep Creek, it is advisable to turn right off Hwy. 90 onto Hwy. 100A just past the airport (as you enter Lake City from the east )and travel Hwy. 100A to Hwy. 441 and then North on Hwy. 441 to Deep Creek. This route will avoid the construction area. You can also access Hwy. 441 from I-10 and then North to Deep Creek.

**WEATHER DISCUSSION:**

***Relative Humidity***

A cold front will move over the fire area today bringing a chance for showers and thunderstorms and turning winds around to a northerly direction by afternoon. Strong high pressure will then build over the southeastern U.S. through the weekend along with an unseasonably dry airmass, which will be accompanied by breezy north to northeasterly winds.-----

**WEATHER FORECAST: *Be on the lookout for erratic, gusty winds and cloud-to-ground lightning with any thunderstorm***

**GENERAL:** Areas of dense smoke early. Partly cloudy with a 30% chance for showers and thunderstorms.

**TEMPERATURES:** Lows 80 to 85. **HUMIDITY:** 40-45%.  
**24 HOUR TREND:** 6 degrees cooler. **24 HOUR TREND:** 5% wetter  
**20 FT WINDS:** Northwest 3 to 6 mph in the morning, then north 4 to 8 mph in the afternoon.

**STABILITY/INVERSION:** Morning inversion mixing out by 0900. Mixing height rising to around 6000 ft. Transport winds northwest early becoming northerly during the afternoon with speeds around 10 mph. Dispersion index 35

**OUTLOOK FOR THURSDAY NIGHT SHIFT:** A 20% chance for an evening shower, otherwise partly cloudy. Lows 56 to 59. Humidity recovering to between 80 and 90%. 20 ft winds from the north 4 to 8 mph.

**GENERAL FIRE BEHAVIOR:**

Type of fire - ***Wind-dominated surface***  
 FL – **8 ft**  
 ROS – **52 ch/hr**  
 SPOTTING – **0.4 mi**  
 POI – **60%**  
 CROWN – ***Passive when distance between surface and aerial fuel < 16 ft.***

**SPECIFIC FIRE BEHAVIOR:**

***All Divisions:*** : Bay laurels and cypress support surface fire intense enough to scorch overstory, but generally not intense enough to initiate passive crowning (torching) of these overstory trees. However, incorporated pines may torch and respond with ember wash.  
***Divisions A/B/C/D/E:*** ***Divisions A/B/C/D/E:*** Pockets of heat near available fuel may still respond to wind, become active, and throw embers across control line. As desiccated pine needles fall to surface and accumulate reburn potential increases. Thick root mat, with duff, gives ground fire an opportunity to retain heat over an extended time period unless dug out. Berms containing burning vegetation will need to be spread out and mopped up appropriately.  
***Divisions AA/BB/CC Structure N and S:*** Excellent opportunity for burnout and mop up operations most of this operational period. Winds from NW-to-N will push against any control line aligned perpendicular to its direction of flow. Watch for downwind ember wash and spot fire initiation. Thick root mat, with duff, gives ground fire an opportunity to retain heat over an extended time period unless dug out. Berms containing burning vegetation will need to be spread out and mopped up appropriately.

**AIR OPERATIONS:** Dense smoke from smoke and fog may interfere with early morning aircraft use.

**SAFETY:** Identify escape routes and safety zones, and make them known.

**☐ SAFETY MESSAGE**

**PAY ATTENTION TO THE SMALL DETAILS**

**Fire Order of the Day – *Cannot see main fire, not in contact with anyone who can***

**\*DOZER OPERATIONS** – maintain good communications with other ground units and aircraft in your area. Dozers need to stay out of the swamps. DO NOT plow lines in the swamps in these extreme fire conditions. Several incidents have occurred recently where dozers have gotten stuck on high stumps with heavy fire activity in very close proximity.

**\*AIR OPERATIONS** - maintain good communications with other ground units and aircraft in your area. Ground crews must maintain a safe distance (200' in brush or 400' in timber) during retardant drops for not only personal safety, but to allow the pilot an opportunity to do his job in a safe and effective manner. Be aware of non-incident personnel during air-ops, especially if using heavy air tankers. Use air resources as lookouts when appropriate.

**\*FATIGUE, DEHYDRATION** -Take care of yourself by getting adequate rest and eating regularly. Drink plenty of clean water and electrolyte drinks like Gatorade (3:1 water:electrolyte ratio). Drink enough to urinate at least every 3 hours. Never drink unfiltered water from springs, streams or from an unknown source.

**\*TRANSPORTATION – WHEN TRAVELING BETWEEN INCIDENT AND ICP**, lights on, use seatbelts, & obey all traffic laws. Don't allow fatigue to control your vehicle. Those of you that are driving home, please drive safely and watch out for the other vehicle. Share driving responsibilities between licensed operators. Watch out for livestock, wildlife and pedestrians. You may encounter smoke and areas being evacuated...Drive Defensively!

**\*STRUCTURAL PROTECTION/HAZARDOUS MATERIALS** – Please read the message below and pages 11-17 of the Incident Response Pocket Guide.

**\*POTENTIAL THUNDERSTORM ACTIVITY** – Watch out for development of thunderheads in the afternoon. Refer to page 75 of the Incident Response Pocket Guide.

**Urban/Wildland Watch Outs**

- ≈ Wooden construction and wood shake roofs;
- ≈ Poor access and narrow one-way roads;
- ≈ Inadequate water supply;
- ≈ Natural fuels 30 feet or closer to structures;
- ≈ Extreme fire behavior;
- ≈ Strong winds;
- ≈ Evacuation of public (panic);
- ≈ Bridge load limits.



12. CANNOT SEE MAIN FIRE, NOT IN CONTACT WITH ANYONE WHO CAN

**Powerline Safety**

- ≈ Downed wire on vehicle – don't leave vehicle until power company arrives. If vehicle is on fire, or fire is near, don't hang on to door. Keep feet together and bunny hop away;
  - ≈ Don't operate heavy equipment under powerlines;
  - ≈ Don't make water drops on live powerlines;
  - ≈ Don't drive with long antennas under powerlines;
  - ≈ Don't fuel vehicles/equipment under powerlines;
  - ≈ Don't stand near powerlines during water drops or retardant drops;
  - ≈ Don't park under powerlines;
  - ≈ Don't apply straight streams to powerlines;
  - ≈ Thick, heavy smoke can cause arcing.
- Do use caution when working around powerlines and in interface situations
