<p>6. Weather Forecast for Period ...Gusty Winds with Near Critical Relative Humidity This Afternoon... Mostly sunny early, then becoming partly cloudy. Highs at 84-87 degrees and relative humidities from 34-39%. Winds will be northeast at 3 to 7 mph through 1100 hrs. then becoming east at 9 to 15 mph with gusts up to 24 mph.</p>																		
<p>7. General Safety Message</p> <p>Keep your guard up for changing conditions and react accordingly. Maintain situational awareness at all times. Think ahead and have a contingency plan. Know escape routes and safety zones.</p> <p style="text-align: center;"><u>Road Construction Alert</u></p> <p>The Department of Transportation has advised us that road construction is scheduled for the section of Hwy. 441 between Hwy. 90 and the junction with Hwy. 100A beginning on Monday May 21. Traffic delays can be expected in this area. If you need to travel to Deep Creek, it is advisable to turn right off Hwy. 90 onto Hwy. 100A just past the airport (as you enter Lake City from the east)and travel Hwy. 100A to Hwy. 441 and then North on Hwy. 441 to Deep Creek. This route will avoid the construction area. You can also access Hwy. 441 from I-10 and then North to Deep Creek.</p>

WEATHER FORECAST

WEATHER DISCUSSION: *High pressure will build down the east coast through the rest of the week resulting in gusty easterly winds today and again on Thursday. The stiff onshore flow will bring more moisture inland keeping relative humidity values higher for the rest of the week, however, rain chances will be slight at best through early next week.*

WEATHER FORECAST: *Gusty Winds with Near Critical Relative Humidity This Afternoon*

GENERAL: Mostly sunny early, then becoming partly cloudy.

TEMPERATURES: Highs 84-87. **HUMIDITY:** Minimum humidity 34-39%.

24 HOUR TREND: 2 degrees cooler 24 HOUR TREND: 4% wetter

20 FT WINDS: Northeast 3 to 7 mph through 1100, then becoming east 9 to 15 mph with gusts up to 24 mph.

STABILITY/INVERSION: Morning inversion around 500 ft mixing out by 0900, then mixing height rising to around 6800 ft. Transport winds east 12 mph early, increasing to 25 mph in the afternoon. Dispersion index 100, or very good.

HAINES INDEX: 4, or low potential for large plume dominated fire growth.

OUTLOOK FOR WEDNESDAY NIGHT SHIFT: Partly cloudy. Lows 59 to 62. Humidity recovering to around 95%. 20 ft winds from the east 8 to 14 mph with gusts to 20 mph through 2200, then decreasing to 2 to 6 mph.

EXTENDED FORECAST:

Thursday: Partly cloudy and breezy. Lows 59-62. Highs 82-85. Minimum RH 35-40%. East winds 8 to 14 mph, with gusts up to 22 mph.

Friday through Sunday: Partly cloudy. Lows 59-62. Highs 83-88. Minimum RH 35-40%. East winds 5 to 12 mph.

Monday and Tuesday: Partly cloudy with a 20% chance for showers and thunderstorms. Lows 60-65. Highs 85-90. Minimum RH 38-43%. East to southeast winds 6 to 12 mph.

GENERAL FIRE BEHAVIOR (outside fire perimeter):

Type of fire: <i>Wind-dominated surface</i>	FL – 15 feet
ROS – 118 ch/hr	SPOTTING – 0.1 – 0.3 average some greater distance possible
POI – 66% and above	ERC - 40 – Extreme (Consult pocket card for local fire behavior thresholds)

CROWN– *Passive crown fire possible in areas of moderate to heavy shrub fuels with over story.*

SPECIFIC FIRE BEHAVIOR:

Extreme fire behavior if fire gets outside perimeter. Fuels are extremely dry and RHs have been at red flag levels for the past five days, further drying the fuels. Two local thresholds: wind > 10 mph (East 9-15 with gusts to 24), and Keetch-Byram Drought Index > 500 (600-700 today) will be met this evening. ERC of 40 is well above 90% percentile.

All Divisions: Extremely dry conditions have made all sources of ignition very dangerous. Should a fire start outside the containment area, it will build rapidly with high intensities. ERCs are at record levels. Fire behavior has been best modeled by using the most extreme model (Fuel model 4 - Chaparral). Treat all new starts with great care. There will be a fair chance of torching in unburned fuels. Watch for gusty winds causing rapid rates of spread and higher flame lengths.

Spotting Distance from torching trees is predicted at 500' to 1,500 feet. Probability of Ignition is predicted at 66%. Both Spotting Distance and Probability of Ignition are likely under estimated due to our extremely dry and gusty conditions.

Watch for REBURN in the black. Dried leaves have fallen off many of the trees and pose a threat of making runs in previously burned areas.

AIR OPERATIONS: Morning inversion should break around 0900. Dispersion levels will be very high, leading to turbulent conditions.

SAFETY MESSAGE

SAFETY starts with *YOU*
We are **ALL** accountable for **SAFE** behaviors

Fire Order of the Day – *Maintain prompt communications with your forces, your supervisor and adjoining forces.*
Watch Out Situation – *Cannot see main fire; not in contact with someone who can.*

Major Hazards and Risks:

- **Driving** – SEAT BELTS are mandatory! All occupants of the vehicle must have seat belts fastened while the vehicle is in motion – no exceptions! Drive defensively with lights on at all times. Maintain distance between vehicles, anticipate oncoming traffic. Use spotters when backing up especially with heavy equipment/engines. Beware of public traffic on Hwy 441, and for children and schoolbuses as well as increased logging traffic.
- **Complacency** – Stay vigilant and expect the unexpected. Work hard, keep moving but remember to look up, look down, and look around – maintain your situational awareness.
- **Weather/fuels** – Weather is getting hotter and drier. While RH's may increase some, the fuels are getting drier and drier. With increasing moisture comes a better chance for thunderstorms – review pg 75 in your IRPG. Insure that escape routes and safety zones are known and communicated to all personnel on the line.
- **Fatigue/dehydration/personal welfare** – Take care of yourself by getting adequate rest, eating properly, and drink plenty of water. STAY HYDRATED! Remember the hydration ratio is 3:1 (3 water/1 gatorade).
- **Wildlife** – Be alert for alligators, snakes, bears, and other wildlife out there that can hurt you – be especially vigilant around any water. Don't feed the wildlife

REMEMBER – LCES: Lookouts, Communications, Escape Routes, and Safety Zones.

Maintain situational awareness – work aggressively but provide for SAFETY FIRST and initiate all actions based on Safety. It is easier to avoid than get out of a bad situation!
