Provide for the safety of fire suppression forces assigned to the Florida Bugaboo Wildfire, and the general public, by adhering to the "Standard Firefighting Orders", following work/rest guidelines, and maintaining public awareness of risks to the community. 2. Maintain and improve relationships with all cooperators, adjacent landowners, including the GOAL organization and the affected communities, local government, and emergency management officials. Involve them in the planning process, and keep them informed on all fire activities. 3. Provide training opportunities for State, Federal, and Local governments and cooperators, in the areas of Incident Command and Fire Management. 4. Manage the assigned fire and any new starts delegated to the team using unified Command, in a manner consistent with the Florida Division of Forestry and the U.S. Forest Service fire management policies, providing support in Planning, Logistics, and Initial Attack as needed. 5. Provide for a strong commitment to cost containment.

- 3. IF YOU REQUIRE A FLIGHT FOR TRAVEL TO YOUR HOME UNIT, TRAVEL ARRANGEMENTS WILL HAVE TO BE MADE AT LEAST 48 HOURS IN ADVANCE OF ACTUALLY BEING DEMOBED.**

- 6. ON THE DAY FOR YOUR DESIGNATED DEMOB, PLEASE REPORT TO THE DEMOB UNIT IN THE ICP AND PICK UP DEMOB FORM.**
- 7. REPORT TO THE DESIGNATED UNITS AS LISTED ON THE DEMOB FORM.**
- 8. RETURN TO DEMOB WHEN YOU HAVE COMPLETED CHECKOUT AT ALL UNITS.**
- 9. WHEN YOU HAVE BEEN SUCCESSFULLY DEMOBED, THE INCIDENT COMMANDERS AND TEAMS WISH YOU A SAFE TRIP HOME. THANK YOU AND GOOD-BYE.**

General: Winds will start out light but build to 10 MPH with Gusts to 15 by the afternoon. RH will NOT dip down to critical levels, so there should not be a red flag warning issued. Continue to watch for the increased chance for REBURN along the lines. KBDI at the Olustee (just south of fire) is 716 today, 713 yesterday and ERC is 42 today and 48 yesterday. At the Eddy (Division A) RAWS station KBDI is 717 today, 713 yesterday and ERC is 44 today and 48 yesterday **Daytime** - Fires in reburn needles should behave as predicted in the FM 9 until intensity builds. Fires in unburned fuels will build quickly and demonstrate fire behavior best predicted by FM 4. With winds (20' above ground) of 5-10 MPH with gusts and the predicted Temp. and RH, we could see the following fire behavior. (Same as yesterday, again)

The PROBABILITY OF IGNITION Daytime – 50-70% (depending on shading), Night-time 40 down to 10% at dawn. Spotting distances 0.1-0.2 average, with gusts to 15 it increases to 0.3 miles.

All Divisions: Watch for spots, flare ups and REBURN runs. **CAUTION:** There is a 30% chance of thunderstorms.

Air Operations: Morning smog should burn off by 9 AM

Safety: Heavier fuels and live fuels are still very dry. Watch for intense runs due to gusty winds. Watch for REBURN in all areas.

SAFETY MESSAGE **June 1, 2007 0700-0700**

Major Hazard and Risks:

- **Use of Seat Belts**
- **Thunderstorms and Lightning**
- **“Energy” Drinks, Sodas, and Snack Foods**

- FL Statue 316.613 or “Florida Seat Belt Law” is a primary traffic law. This means any law enforcement officer can stop you, if you are not buckled in. If ticketed, it is a minimum \$50 fine + court cost & maybe points + notifying your insurance company. *So Buckle Up!*
- Thunderstorms may occur this weekend. WATCHOUT for downdrafts that can drastically alter intensity and direction of the fire without warning. Lightning can also be associated with T-storms. Seek shelter in wheeled vehicles or structures when lightning occurs. Post lookouts and communicate weather information with everyone. *Florida is the world's lightning capitol!*
- While fried pork rinds, candy bars and “energy” drinks might be part of your everyday diet at home — caffeinated drinks dehydrate you; designer drinks (with ephedrine, guarana, etc) speed your heart rate; and pork rinds and candy which are just saturated fat and simple sugars, are not good nutrition sources. Eat right. Fire wildfire right!

STANDARD FIREFIGHTING ORDERS

1. Keep informed on fire weather conditions & forecasts
2. Know what your fire is doing at all times
3. Base all actions on current & expected behavior of the fire
4. Identify escape routes & safety zones, and make them known
5. Post lookouts when there is possible danger
6. Be alert. Keep calm. Think clearly. Act decisively.
7. Maintain prompt communications with your forces, your supervisor and adjoining forces.
8. Give clear instructions and insure they are understood.
9. Maintain control of your forces at all times.
10. Fight fire aggressively, having provided for safety first.
