<p>5. General Control Objectives for the incident (include alternatives)</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Provide for the safety of fire suppression forces assigned to the Florida Bugaboo Wildfire, and the general public, by adhering to the "Standard Firefighting Orders", following work/rest guidelines, and maintaining public awareness of risks to the community. 2. Maintain and improve relationships with all cooperators, adjacent landowners, including the GOAL organization and the affected communities, local government, and emergency management officials. Involve them in the planning process, and keep them informed on all fire activities. 3. Provide training opportunities for State, Federal, and Local governments and cooperators, in the areas of Incident Command and Fire Management. 4. Manage the assigned fire and any new starts delegated to the team using unified Command, in a manner consistent with the Florida Division of Forestry and the U.S. Forest Service fire management policies, providing support in Planning, Logistics, and Initial Attack as needed. 5. Provide for a strong commitment to cost containment.

<p>7. General Safety Message</p> <p>Keep up your guard for changing conditions, and react accordingly. Maintain situational awareness at all times. Think ahead and have a contingency plan. Know escape routes and safety zones.</p> <p style="text-align: center;"><u>Road Construction Alert</u></p> <p>The Department of Transportation has road construction scheduled for the section of Hwy. 441 north of Hwy. 90 to Hwy. 100A. Traffic delays can be expected. For travel to Deep Creek from the ICP, it is advisable to turn right off Hwy. 90 onto Hwy. 100A just past the airport (as you enter Lake City from the east). Travel 100A to 441 and then North on 441 to Deep Creek. You can also access 441 from I-10 and then North to Deep Creek.</p>

WEATHER FORECAST

Bugaboo Incident NF in Florida/Florida Div. of Forestry Forecast #29 5/25/2007

WEATHER DISCUSSION: Strong high pressure will drift to the Carolina coast for Friday and continue through Saturday but weaken. East flow will continue over the fire area but weaker than the past 2 days. Any chances for showers or thunderstorms will remain small.

WEATHER FORECAST – Friday:

WEATHER: Partly cloudy. A slight chance of showers and thunderstorms. Chance of wetting rain 20%.

TEMPERATURES: Highs 81-85.

HUMIDITIES: Minimum humidities 37-42%.

24 HOUR TREND: Similar.

24 HOUR TREND: Plus 5%.

20 FT WINDS: Light northeast becoming east 7 to 12 mph with gusts to 20 mph.

STABILITY/INVERSION: Weak inversion breaking by 0900L. Mixing height around 6000 ft. Transport winds East 20-25 mph. Dispersion index around 80.

WEATHER FORECAST – Friday Night:

WEATHER: Slight chance of showers and thunderstorms early...then clearing. Chance of wetting rain less than 20%.

TEMPERATURES: Lows 58-62.

HUMIDITIES: Max humidities near 100%.

20 FT WINDS: East 7 to 12 mph with gusts to 20 until mid evening then becoming light northeast.

STABILITY/INVERSION: Inversion developing late. Dispersion index 4.

EXTENDED FORECAST:

Saturday: Partly cloudy. Highs 82-85. Min RH's 36-42%. E to NE winds 5 to 10 mph with gusts to 18 mph.

Sunday: Partly cloudy. Lows around 60. Highs in the mid 80s. East winds 5 to 10 mph.

Monday and Tuesday: Partly cloudy. A 20 percent chance of showers and thunderstorms. Lows in the lower 60s. Highs in the mid to upper 80s. East winds 5 to 10 mph.

Wednesday and Thursday: Mostly cloudy with a 30% chance of showers and thunderstorms. Lows in the mid 60s. Highs in the mid 80s. Southeast winds 5 to 10 mph.

FIRE BEHAVIOR

Bugaboo Incident NF in Florida/Florida Div. of Forestry Forecast #29 5/25/2007

General: Winds will be a little weaker today but still brisk at times. RH will stay above critical levels, so there is NO red flag warning for today. Continue to watch for the increased chance for REBURN along the lines. Also, be alert to new starts from lightning and other sources. Fuels are still very dry so if a fire gets rolling, expect fire behavior to be similar to that predicted by the FM 4 – Very Heavy Rough model.

Daytime- Fires should behave as predicted by FM 7 or FM 9 until intensity builds. Fires over the past several weeks have burned with behavior best predicted by FM 4.

With winds (20' above ground) of 7-12 MPH and the predicted Temp. and RH, we could see the following fire behavior.

PROBABILITY OF IGNITION Daytime - 60%, Night-time 40 down to 10% at dawn. Spotting distances during the gust can be .3 miles.

All Divisions: Watch for spots, flare ups and REBURN runs. There are trees that have fallen on most if not all divisions.

Air Operations: Morning smog should burn off by 9 AM

Safety: Heavier fuels and live fuels are still very dry. Watch for intense runs due to gusty winds. Watch for REBURN in all areas. 20% chance of THUNDERSTORMS.

SAFETY MESSAGE

Major Hazard and Risks:

- Road Conditions
- Complacency
- Tragedy and Near-Miss Wildland Fires

➤ Forest roads are not in very good shape. Roads are dusty, wash boarded, have deep ruts with high crowns, and areas of deep sugar sand. *Slow down.* Show courtesy and respect to your fellow firefighters and the others you share the roads with. Be mindful of your speed on Hwy 441 and Hwy 90.

➤ How complacent are you and your crew? Do you “forget” to wear your seat belt? Are you failing to wear all your PPE just because the fire activity has moderated some? Have you checked the condition (or presence) of the hand tools on your unit lately? Being recognized as a professional firefighter means you will not accept complacency from yourself or others around you.

- Four Major Common Denominators of Fire Behavior on Tragedy Fires:
- Most incidents happen on *small fires* or on *isolated sections* of large fires.
 - *Flare-ups* generally occur in deceptively *light fuels*, such as grasses and light brush.
 - Most fires are innocent in appearance before unexpected shifts in *wind direction and/or speed* result in “flare-ups.” Sometimes, tragedies occur in the mop-up stage.
 - Fires respond to large-and small-scale *topographical conditions*, running uphill surprisingly fast in chimneys, gullies, and on steep slopes. *In Florida, this could also include: vegetation breaks, lakes, highways and power lines right-of-ways.*
