

<p>5. General Control Objectives for the incident (include alternatives)</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Provide for the safety of fire suppression forces assigned to the Florida Bugaboo Wildfire, and the general public, by adhering to the "Standard Firefighting Orders", following work/rest guidelines, and maintaining public awareness of risks to the community. 2. Maintain and improve relationships with all cooperators, adjacent landowners, including the GOAL organization and the affected communities, local government, and emergency management officials. Involve them in the planning process, and keep them informed on all fire activities. 3. Provide training opportunities for State, Federal, and Local governments and cooperators, in the areas of Incident Command and Fire Management. 4. Manage the assigned fire and any new starts delegated to the team using unified Command, in a manner consistent with the Florida Division of Forestry and the U.S. Forest Service fire management policies, providing support in Planning, Logistics, and Initial Attack as needed. 5. Provide for a strong commitment to cost containment.

- 8. RETURN TO DEMOB WHEN YOU HAVE COMPLETED CHECKOUT AT ALL UNITS.**
- 9. WHEN YOU HAVE BEEN SUCCESSFULLY DEMOBED, THE INCIDENT COMMANDERS AND TEAMS WISH YOU A SAFE TRIP HOME. THANK YOU AND GOOD-BYE.**

WEATHER DISCUSSION: Strong high pressure over the eastern seaboard will drift to the east coast Thursday and weaken. This will continue an east flow over the area with only little chance of rain. RH's will fall below 35 percent over the fire area this afternoon with durations of 4 hours or more.

WEATHER FORECAST – Wednesday: Partly cloudy. Areas of smoke and fog in the morning.

TEMPERATURES: Highs 87-92 **24 HOUR TREND:** Similar

HUMIDITIES: Min RH's 25-30% west side and 30-40% east side **24 HOUR TREND:** Similar.

20 FT WINDS: Calm or Light E to NE winds early becoming E around 10 mph with gusts to 25 mph in the afternoon.

STABILITY/INVERSION: Strong shallow inversion breaking around 0900L. Mixing heights 7500-8000 ft.
Transport winds East 25 mph. Dispersion index 90

RED FLAG WARNING in effect 1300 to 1900L for humidities below 35 percent

WEATHER FORECAST – Wednesday Night: Mostly clear. Areas of smoke and fog late.

TEMPERATURES: Lows 55-60. **HUMIDITIES:** Max RH's 95-100%.

20 FT WINDS: East winds 10 mph with gusts to 25 mph diminishing after sunset.

FIRE BEHAVIOR

Bugaboo Incident NF in Florida/Florida Div. of Forestry Forecast #34 5/30/2007

General: Winds will start out light but build to 10 MPH with Gusts to 25 by the afternoon. RH will dip down AGAIN to critical levels, so there has been a red flag warning issued. Continue to watch for the increased chance for REBURN along the lines. KBDI at the Olustee (just south of fire) is 712 and ERC is 41. At the Eddy (Division A) RAWs station KBDI was 714 and ERCs is at 41 yesterday.

Daytime - Fires in reburn needles should behave as predicted in the FM 9 until intensity builds. Fires in unburned fuels will build quickly and demonstrate fire behavior best predicted by FM 4.

With winds (20' above ground) of 5-10 MPH with gusts and the predicted Temp. and RH, we could see the following fire behavior. (Same as yesterday, again)

The PROBABILITY OF IGNITION Daytime – 60-80% (depending on shading), Night-time 40 down to 10% at dawn. Spotting distances 0.1-0.2 average, with gusts to 25 it increases to 0.5 miles.

All Divisions: Watch for spots, flare ups and REBURN runs. There are trees that have fallen on most if not all divisions.

Air Operations: Morning smog should burn off by 9 AM

Safety: Heavier fuels and live fuels are still very dry. Watch for intense runs due to gusty winds. Watch for REBURN in all areas.

SAFETY MESSAGE

Major Hazard and Risks:

➤ **Escape Routes and Safety Zones**

➤ **Dehydration**

➤ **Driving**

➤ Now is a good time for you to check where your safety zones and escape routes are in your division. Identify them and clearly marked them so everyone - new and "old" know where they all are.

➤ Start replacing your fluids before you leave for the fireline. The temperature is starting to climb. To mitigate heat emergencies, consume at least 1 l/hr on the line or more depending upon your work load. Alternate water with sports drink. Avoid soda and "energy" drinks.

➤ Driving on this fire will be dangerous everyday. There are long drive times to and from the fire and camp; narrow, sandy roads; congestion and plenty of wildlife especially at night to avoid. Take your time. Driving with your headlights "on" and wearing your seat belt is mandatory for everyone — all the time. Remember to use you turn signals and emergency flashers too.

STANDARD FIREFIGHTING ORDERS

1. Keep informed on fire weather conditions & forecasts
2. Know what your fire is doing at all times
3. Base all actions on current & expected behavior of the fire
4. Identify escape routes & safety zones, and make them known
5. Post lookouts when there is possible danger
6. Be alert. Keep calm. Think clearly. Act decisively.
7. Maintain prompt communications with your forces, your supervisor and adjoining forces.
8. Give clear instructions and insure they are understood.
9. Maintain control of your forces at all times.
10. Fight fire aggressively, having provided for safety first.
