Involve them in the planning process, and keep them informed on all fire activities. 3. Provide training opportunities for State, Federal, and Local governments and cooperators in the areas of Incident Command and Fire Management. 4. Manage the assigned fire and any new starts delegated to the team using unified command in a manner consistent with the Florida Division of Forestry and the U. S. Forest Service fire management policies. 5. Provide a strong commitment to cost containment.

Maintain suppression resources to a level manageable by a Type III organization that will provide continued patrol, mop up and rehab on the Florida Bugaboo Fire and support local agency needs.

Major Hazards and Risks

Driving- Seat belts and lights on, drive within speed limits.

Dehydration- Continue to drink fluids. Supplement with Gatorade.

Heavy equipment-Make eye contact before approaching.

Firefighters and Heat Stress

COFFEE, POP, Caffeine in these products act as diuretics (meaning they make you urinate) and interfere with the body's ability to absorb carbohydrates. Carbonated drinks decrease the amount of fluids that can be consumed and depletes calcium levels.

ELECTROLYTE DRINKS What's bad about it? When sustaining continued fluid loss, such as exercise or firefighting, reliance on electrolyte drinks will further rob the body of moisture as it seeks a chemical balance.

WHAT SHOULD I DO?

Everyone should drink 1 oz. water for every 2 pounds of body weight. This is a daily minimum of water. Prior to work or exercise you should pre-hydrate by drinking equal parts of water and electrolyte drink. Expect to lose 1.5 to 2 pounds of body weight during each hour of work. To keep hydrated you should be drinking water and electrolyte at a 3: 1 ratio. You will need to drink 16 ounces of fluid for every pound of weight lost or about 3 cups of water and 1 cup of electrolyte every hour.

Okay, so let's say you goof, and don't get quite enough water. What are some of the signs and symptoms? The common ones are headache, fatigue, reduced hunger and thirst; you will be less mentally and physically sharp. Also add nausea, light-headedness and a decrease in sweating to the list.

If you recognize any of these signs or symptoms, suspect some level of dehydration. Start drinking water. Shoot for one quart per hour for 2 hours. At first you won't feel thirsty, but as you get the first 1 or 2 cups down, you'll notice how much easier it is to get the rest down. Even your appetite will start to return!

If you should vomit after starting to drink water, that's OK. Notice that the volume of vomit is not even close to the volume of water that you drank. The difference is what your body has already retained! Keep up the water therapy. Once you have crashed, expect that you will need to be on light duty for 24 - 36 hours. If you don't take it easy, you are likely to blow it again the next day, or be relatively nonproductive, and a safety and welfare concern. If you become severely dehydrated. Hospitalization and intravenous fluid replacement is required.
