Protect key resources including threatened and endangered species and their habitat, over-night canoe shelters, and other resources. 5. Protect the integrity of the Okefenokee Wilderness. 6. FORECAST ISSUED: 05/07/2007

WEATHER DISCUSSION: A strong pressure gradient between a high pressure ridge over the eastern U.S. and a low pressure system off the South Carolina coast will maintain a breezy north flow over the entire refuge Tuesday through Wednesday. The low will be moving west allowing Atlantic moisture to spread inland over southeast Georgia late Tuesday and Wednesday.

The **main concern is:**

1. A strong gusty north wind.

WEATHER FORECAST DAY SHIFT Tuesday:

WEATHER: Increasing cloudiness...breezy and dry.

MAX TEMPERATURES: 72-75 (24 hour trend = no change)

MIN HUMIDITY: 35-40 percent (24 hour trend ~ 20 percent higher)

20 FT WINDS: North at 14 to 18 mph with gusts to 25 mph increasing to 17 to 21 mph with gusts to 30 mph in the afternoon.

STABILITY/INVERSION: Shallow early morning inversion around 500 ft dissipating by 8AM. Mixing heights around 5600 ft in the afternoon. Dispersion Index around 62. Haines 4.

WEATHER FORECAST NIGHT SHIFT Tuesday night:

WEATHER: Mostly cloudy...breezy and not as cool. A 20 percent chance of light showers after midnight.

MIN TEMPERATURES: 57-60. (24 hour trend = 9 deg higher)

MAX HUMIDITY: Recovery to 70 percent near the fire and near 85 percent elsewhere.

20 FT WINDS: North at 14 to 18 mph with gusts to 25 mph in the evening decreasing to 10 to 15 mph after midnight.

STABILITY/INVERSION: Shallow inversion setting up around 400 ft. Dispersion Index around 16.

OUTLOOK FOR Wednesday: Cloudy with a 30 percent chance of showers. High temperatures 74 to 77. Minimum RH values 60 to 65 percent. North wind at 12 to 17 mph with gusts to 25 mph.

SUNRISE/SUNSET: Tuesday May 8th...0638/2011

EXTENDED...Thursday through Sunday: The low pressure system off the South Carolina coast will drift west toward the southern Atlantic coast and gradually weaken. Partly cloudy to mostly cloudy Thursday through Sunday with a 20 percent chance of showers each day. RH values remain above critical levels in the afternoons. Highs in the low to mid 80s and lows in the low to mid 60s through the extended period.
