### WEATHER DISCUSSION:

The frontal system that moved through the area is stalling east of the area and will dissipate. High pressure will build on Friday and the weekend bringing slightly drier and warmer conditions and therefore lower afternoon relative humidity values. These conditions will remain through the weekend until Monday evening, when diurnal showers and thunderstorms are possible on the seabreeze boundary.

### WEATHER FORECAST THURSDAY AND THURSDAY NIGHT:

**WEATHER:** Becoming partly cloudy with a 20 percent chance of showers or thunderstorms.  
**TEMPERATURES:** **MAX** 87-92 (24 hour trend = up 2-4 degrees) **MIN** around 70.  
**HUMIDITY:** **MIN** around 45 percent (24 hour trend = down 10 percent). **MAX** Recovery near 100 percent.  
**20 FT WINDS:** **DAY** Light and variable winds in the morning then becoming north to northeast and increasing to 8 to 12 mph with gusts to around 18 mph in the afternoon. **NIGHT** Becoming light northeast.  
**STABILITY/INVERSION:** **DAY** Morning smoke and fog lifting around 0900 then smoke drifting north. Increasing instability through day. Mixing heights around 5500 ft. Dispersion Index 50. **NIGHT** Inversion to 500 feet with localized visibilities reduced to a mile or less in fog/smoke after 0200. Dispersion Index 3.  
**TRANSPORT WINDS:** **DAY** North/northeast 15-20 mph. **LAL** 2

<b>SPECIFIC FIRE BEHAVIOR:</b>				
<p><b>All Divisions:</b> The predicted rates of spread and flame lengths above are based on an established fire on higher ground with max wind speeds in the warmest and driest period of the day outside the current fire perimeter. The most active remaining portion of the fire will be in bay fuels, which will continue smoldering in stump holes, duff and roots. Expect only smoldering and creeping fire behavior in Divisions WE and WF, as fuels dry from the recent precipitation (1 to 2 inches over the past 24 hours). Reburn risk on Thursday and Friday should be minimal, due to high humidity and recent rain.</p> <p><b>Structure:</b> Okefenokee administrative site should not be impacted by fire spread during this operational period.</p> <p><b>IA:</b> Expect minimal fire behavior on Thursday and Friday on any new starts outside of the main fire, in light of recent precipitation and high humidity. Very little lightning occurred with this most recent storm. Any holdovers may take until this weekend to appear. Thunderstorm downdrafts may accelerate any established fire.</p>

<b>SAFETY:</b>				
<p>Maintain situational awareness around snags, especially when wind speeds increase. Practice the 30/30 rule around thunderstorms to prevent exposure to lightning (see pg. 75 of the IRPG)</p> <p style="text-align: center;"><b>Predicted ERC for today is 20 and 25 for Thursday... 90<sup>th</sup> percentile is 35.</b></p>

**Driving** – the roads have become impassable in areas. Scout the road out before committing resources. Continue looking out for the other driver. Wildlife Drive is now open to the public.

**Weather** – warmer and drier trend beginning, expect increased fire activity as the fuels dry out.

**Hazard Trees** – continue identifying and mitigating hazard trees in your work areas.

**Communications** – continue identifying deadspots, provide feedback to the Comm Unit.

**Initial Attack** – remember our IA responsibilities. Ensure LCES is in place before beginning operational tactics.

**Remember, if we are still on the clock we need to be ready and able to respond when called.**

## **INITIATE ALL ACTIONS BASED ON CURRENT AND EXPECTED FIRE BEHAVIOR**

- Can the resources you are replacing give you a thorough briefing? What information will you want to get from resources you are replacing?
- Can you observe the area or use scouts? What information are the scouts looking for?
- Have escape routes and safety zones been thoroughly scouted? List some ways your crew will scout out an area before you begin working
- Are escape routes and safety zones marked for night use? How do you adjust marking safety zones and escape routes for night use?
- Have potential dangers been located and can they be dealt with? List some dangerous fire behavior you may encounter and how you would deal with it.
- Do you have access to weather and fire behavior forecasts? What is your unit's procedure for obtaining forecasts?
- To reduce risk, initiate the following:
  - Post lookouts.
  - Check communications.
  - Retreat if you have doubts about your escape routes or safety zones or if the situation becomes too complex. Discuss fires where you have adjusted your actions based on current and expected fire behavior.
