WEATHER DISCUSSION: An upper level ridge will shift west and allow an upper level trough to dig along the east coast. Upper level disturbances moving into the trough and afternoon seabreezes should serve as a focus for scattered showers and thunderstorms from Monday night into Thursday, with the best chance for rain coming on Tuesday and Wednesday. In fact, some of the storms on Tuesday could be strong. Generally, easterly or northeasterly winds are expected through midweek with improvement in minimum relative humidities.

WEATHER FORECAST DAY SHIFT MONDAY: (See table for specific incident forecasts)

WEATHER: Mostly sunny, with some cumulus developing in the afternoon. A slight chance for a shower or a thunderstorm after 1500. Chance of measurable rain 20%.

MAX TEMPERATURES: 95-100 (24 hour trend: 2 degrees warmer)

MIN HUMIDITY: 28 to 33% (24 hour trend: 5% lower)

WEATHER FORECAST FOR MONDAY NIGHT:

WEATHER: Variable cloudiness with isolated showers and thunderstorms possible early, and then scattered Showers and thunderstorms possible overnight. Chance of measurable rain 40%.

MIN TEMPERATURES: 69-72

MAX HUMIDITY: 95-100%

20 FT WINDS: Southeast 5 to 10 mph through 0200, then southeast 2-4 mph.

STABILITY/INVERSION: A nocturnal low level inversion is expected around 700 feet, with localized visibilities of a mile or less in fog/smoke after 0200. Smoke drift N. Dispersion 4.

OUTLOOK FOR TUESDAY:

Partly to mostly cloudy. A 50 percent chance for mainly afternoon showers and thunderstorms. Highs 87-91. ESE winds 3 to 5 mph, becoming Northeast 5 to 10 mph, with gusts up to 20 mph. Min RH 43 to 48%. Mixing height 6000 feet, dispersion index 50, transport winds NNW 15-20 mph.

****TODAY'S FIRE BEHAVIOR WILL BE MODERATE****

Fire activity along the breaks in WW, WY, WX, WF, WS & WG is expected where burnout operations took place. Pockets of unburned fuels internally will continue to require evaluation during reburn. Direct attack with Dozer/Tractor Plows should be effective today exercising caution during winds over 10 mph.

Ease 3-5 mph through 1000, increasing with gust to 15mph. When Sea-breeze passes @1800 winds will become more SE.

RH – 28% to 31% / Temp - 97 to 100

Rates of Spread – Fuel Model 4 (heavy shrub) ROS - 23 – 70 ft/min / Flame lengths – 11’ to 19’

Fuel Model 7 (Southern Rough) ROS - 9 to 27 ft/min / Flame lengths – 4’ to 6’

Probability of Ignition: 54% / KBDI: 371

Mixing heights today will push 6000’

SAFTEY: Monitor weather conditions on the fireline – low RH's are predicted. If you are getting thirsty, you have waited too late to hydrate up. No foreseen problems with air ops for today.

Temperature is rising nearing 100 degrees, Drink plenty of water and remember the 4 to 1 ratio of water and sports drinks. Use **Sun Screen** to protect your skin from sun burn, and take frequent breaks.

Trigger Points Exceeded: Wind, RH, Mixing height. May cause extreme fire behavior (rapid rate of spread, spotting, long flame lengths).

Help prevent **Camp Crud!!! Wash Your Hands** often, and **Sanitize** your cooler with 1 capful of **bleach**.

As equipment and personnel are moved around use caution in **Congested Areas** and apply **Defensive Driving** measures and always **obey local Traffic Laws** and use **Head Lights** on the fire scene.

Demob and Traveling home? Follow the Travel Regulations in the NWCG Fire Business Handbook and your Agency Policies regarding travel.

Insure that **Communication** are in place before you engage on a fire.

Directing Retardant and Bucket Drops

- Give general location on incident.
- Finalize location with:
 - Clock direction - straight in front of the aircraft is 12 o'clock, out the right door is 3 o'clock, the tail is 6 o'clock, and the left door is 9 o'clock. When giving directions, remember that helicopters and air attack generally orbit in a right-hand pattern and air tankers in a left-hand pattern.
 - Position on slope - lower 1/3, upper 1/3, midslope, top of ridge, etc.
 - Aspect - direction slope is facing.
 - Describe prominent landmarks - don't say "I have a red hardhat, I'm wearing a yellow shirt, I'm waving, I'm by the big rock," etc. Visualize what the pilot sees from the air and describe target.
 - Use signal mirrors - use smoke or fusee if mirror unavailable. Stand in drop location (when safe) for ID and move away before drop.
- Describe target from your location and explain mission. The pilot will decide drop technique and flight path.
- Assure pilot all personnel are safe and know aircraft intentions before the drop.
- Give feedback to pilot about drop accuracy. Be honest and constructive. Let pilot know if drop is early, late, uphill, downhill, on target, too high, too low, etc. Report low drops immediately.
