WEATHER DISCUSSION: High pressure will build across the area through the weekend bringing warmer and drier conditions. The high weakens early next week bringing an increased chance of afternoon thunderstorms.

TODAY: Areas of Fog before 1000, becoming Partly Cloudy.

MAXIMUM TEMPERATURES: 93-97 degrees.

MINIMUM HUMIDITY: 35-40%.

GENERAL FIRE BEHAVIOR

Fuels around the Okefenokee Wildlife Refuge are predominately Fuel Model 7 (Southern Rough). Large to moderate acreage tracts of commercial timberland are mixed in throughout the entire perimeter surrounding the refuge. Fast moving wildfires with extremely high flame lengths and rapid rates of spread occur within the swamp. As fire transitions to the upland, torching and crown fires are common. Long Range spotting is possible.

Indicators/Threshold for Increased Fire Activity

- Relative humidity dropping below 45%
- Winds above 10 mph
- Heavy fuel loadings
- Fine dead fuel moisture 8% or less
- Dispersion above 70

SPECIFIC FIRE BEHAVIOR

- **Fire behavior will continue to increase today due to continued drying of fuels. Expect lower RH's and stronger wind speeds than yesterday.**
- **Pockets of heat near the fire perimeter in Divisions Y & Z will become active by late morning. The fire is burning more intensely each day in the fine and brushy fuels. The possibility for short to mid range spotting continues where these fuels are exposed to stronger winds (generally considered to be 10mph MFWS). EXPECT DRYING TREND TO LAST THROUGH MONDAY.**

One hour fine dead fuel moisture is at 5% for Saturday. 1000 hour fuels are drier than normal for this time of year. Extensive mop up is required. There is reburn potential in all divisions due to the amount of needle cast.

Should a fire run(s) occur, expect winds in the area to potentially increase above predicted levels. This would increase Flame Lengths and ROS above predictions. Heavier firebrands can also be lifted higher and further increasing likelihood of spots to max predictions. In areas where fuels have been herbicided, expect quick ignitions and extreme heat, very fast.

Night Ops – Expect another night of minimal fire behavior activity with patchy fog. Fire behavior will mainly be the hot spots that have continued to smolder in the drier fuels that have not been affected by the rain and any heat near the line in Divisions Y & Z. RH's will recover from 90 – 100%. Winds over the entire fire are forecast from the ESE at 4-8 mph and they will diminish after midnight to 2 mph. Dispersion Index of 2 – really poor for nighttime. **Remain with heads up for Thunderstorms & Lightning – LAL 1.**

Air Operations: Patchy fog before 1000 becoming partly cloudy. Mixing heights will be 7000 feet by 1500.

SAFETY:

WINDS – Stay abreast of changing wx conditions throughout the entire shift. **THUNDERSTORMS** - these severe winds can create extreme fire behavior, with winds gusting over 30 mph. **SNAGS** – Snags are falling in all Divisions – will be influenced by Thunderstorm outflow winds.

FUELS: Reburn is an issue. Watch for pockets of cured shrubs or blankets of red needles beginning to cover the forest floor. 1000 and 10,000 hour fuels as well as deep duff pockets are providing the heat source. Stay focused, and put LCES in place before starting operations. Watch for standing burning snags that can fall without warning. *Energy Release Component (ERC) continues to be above the 90th percentile for this area.*


