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### WEATHER DISCUSSION for SOUTHEAST TEXAS:

#### \*\*\*STATIC PATTERN TODAY...WARM-DRY-LIGHT WINDS\*\*\*

A static large-scale pattern over the central U.S. will keep today's weather conditions largely similar to those observed yesterday. Relaxed pressure gradients will result in another day of generally light and variable winds. Good RH recoveries this morning will be followed by a second day of low afternoon RH as seasonally warm temperatures promote mixing to lower daytime dewpoints. Moisture will remain limited off the surface, thus skies will be mostly sunny with afternoon fair weather cumulus. A very slight chance remains for an isolated storm along the coast but expect no storms inland. The next frontal boundary arrives Thursday and pushes through Friday with winds that appear to be in the 10 to 20 mph range. Latest models keep this push mostly dry as it passes. The front will be responsible for about 10 degrees of cooling and some drier air...but moisture drops don't look major.

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### TODAY/TONIGHT for SOUTHEAST TEXAS:

Mostly sunny with a scattered fair weather cumulus field in the afternoon. A slight chance of a shower or thunderstorm along the coast. Temperatures seasonally warm. RH dropping low again this afternoon. Winds generally light and favoring from the east.

**MAX TEMPS:** 95 W to 90 E / **MIN TEMPS:** 65 N to 75 S.

**MIN RH:** 25% W to 35% SE / **MAX RH:** 75-80 % N to 90-100% S.

**WINDS:** North to northeast 2-5 mph through the morning...becoming east 4-8 mph. Coastal winds becoming southeast 5-10 mph in the afternoon.

**LAL:** 1

**CHANCE OF SHOWERS & THUNDERSTORMS:** 0% North. 5% Central. 10% Coastal areas.

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### THURSDAY / FRIDAY OUTLOOK for SOUTHEAST TEXAS:

Thursday morning will be pre-frontal with light east and southeast winds and good RH recovery. A few degrees cooler as winds turn north in the afternoon with scattered clouds as the front approaches. The cold front will push into the complex in the evening increasing winds and turning them north. A few showers and thunderstorms may develop on the boundary. Friday cooler and dry behind the front with continued northeast winds

Winds light east to southeast early THU...turning north and increasing Thursday afternoon/evening. Slackening Friday afternoon and staying northeast.

**MAX TEMPS:** THU - 90 W to 85 E. FRI - 72 N to 82 S.

**MIN TEMPS:** THU - 65 N to 75 S. FRI - 58 N to 68 S.

**MIN RH:** 30-40% / **MAX RH:** 80-90%.

**WINDS:** Winds light (2-5 mph) E to SE early THU...turning N and increasing Thursday afternoon/evening (10-12 g 15-20 mph). Slackening Friday afternoon (5-8 g 12 mph) becoming NE.

**LAL:** 1

**CHANCE OF SHOWERS & THUNDERSTORMS:** 20% with a southward advancing frontal passage late THU afternoon into FRI morning.

**FUEL ASSUMPTIONS:** The major fuel type, found in the SE Texas Complex are fuel model TU3 (moderate timber understory) or Fire Behavior Prediction System Fuel model 9. High risk fuels include pine plantations and southern rough brush with yaupon underneath a mature pine canopy.

### WEATHER SUMMARY

*See Individual incident fire behavior forecasts and the fire weather forecast for detailed information.*

**SE Texas Complex General Forecast:** Expect low to moderate fire behavior in all fuels. Fuels greater than one inch are still very dry and will consume. Relative humidity remains low and provides the environment for fire activity to increase. The fine fuels are dry enough to support moderate spread today. If they drop to 6% isolated areas may see 2-5 foot flames depending on fuels. Probability of ignition will range from 40-50%. Direct attack with hand tools should be effective on most fires. Additional support from engines and dozers will be necessary when flame lengths exceed 4 feet. This will occur when brush and ladder fuels begin to actively burn. Mop-up is very important to keep the fire from escaping the control lines. Large dead fuels will continue to burn for extended periods and will burn deep underground. Leaf litter and needle cast continues to provide the fuels necessary to support a re-burn. The effects of the recent rains are diminishing as dryer weather settles in.

**Critical fire behavior thresholds** pine/hardwood mixed timber (**temp >90°**, **RH < 30%**, **winds > 10 mph**).

**Fine Fuel Moisture;** Unshaded 5% Shaded 8%, Probability of Ignition; Unshaded 70%, Shaded 40%.

**Flame Length:** Timber litter and slash – 2'- 5'; Grass – 3' – 5'

**Rate of Spread:** Timber litter and slash – 7-9 feet/min; Grass – 70-94 feet/min

**Spotting Distance:** =0.1 **Forecast: BI 25 ↓6; IC 13 ↓7; ERC 35 ↓2** (Conroe RAWs 415109)

### Specific:

**#851 Riley Road Max Temp Day** 95° Min RH 35% Wind Direction & Speed: SE 5 mph, Gusts 10 mph  
Smoldering will continue around undetected smokes with a reburn threat where needle and leaf litter exist.

**#923 Max Temp Day** 95° Min RH 25% Wind Direction & Speed: E-SE 5 mph, Gusts 10 mph. Fuels on this fire include slash, regeneration, and mature trees. Rates of spread will be a little slower in slash, but the heat generated will prevent suppression resources from getting in close. Dozers can be very successful on this fire. Watch for spots within .1 miles. There may be undetected spots from yesterday's activity. Torching and spotting will occur in areas where ladder fuels enable the fire to reach the crowns.

### Initial Attack Fires

**Max Temp Day:** 94° Min RH:25%, Wind Direction & Speed: E-SE 3-6mph.

Smoldering will continue with a reburn threat where needle and leaf litter exist. Direct attack with hand crews can be successful when flame lengths are 0-4'. If they are greater than 4' request assistance from engines, dozers, and aircraft to be successful. Expect troublesome spotting a couple hundred feet from the fire. Watch for occasional spotting up to .1 miles. Fires will move to the NW or W depending upon location. Fires are expected to actively burn between 1200 and 2000.

## PIPELINE AWARENESS

Please follow these general awareness principles were developed by CIIMT 4 Safety Officer in consultation with on site industry representatives.

- Watch for cleared Right-of Ways, 30-60 feet wide. Pipelines will be in the middle of the cleared Right-of-Way and may be found exposed on the surface or buried one to five feet underground.
- Pipeline location markings are approximately 1,000 feet apart and 3 to 6 feet high and can be located near roads, railroads, fences and along the actual pipeline location.
- Signs may include information such as material transported in the pipeline, name of pipeline operator, and a telephone number where the operator can be reached in the event of an emergency.
- Do not continually cross heavy machinery in the same spot across buried pipelines. Vary the location, or cross at a road junction.
- If there is a suspected breach, look for a pool of liquid, a sheen or fog in the area. There may be a hissing or roaring noise or an unusual chemical odor. If any of these indicators are found, evacuate the area immediately and contact your immediate supervisor with the location of the breach and call 911 or your local emergency response number.

## **Working with TIMO/Timber Company Firefighters on the Fireline Standard Operating Guidelines**

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### **1. FIRE NOTIFICATION**

The TIMO/Timber Company (TTC) will provide updated ownership shape files and contact lists to the TFS, East Texas GIS Coordinator, on a quarterly basis to ensure that all TFS dispatch offices have updated spatial and contact data. The TFS dispatchers will use the shape files to help determine when fires are on TTC property and, to the extent possible, will make immediate notification to the TTC representative.

### **1. RESPONSE PLANNING**

Once contacted, the TTC representative and the TFS representative will determine if TTC firefighters (employees or contractors) are needed on a fire and, if needed, the type and amount of TTC firefighting equipment needed. If needed, the TTC representative will dispatch TTC firefighters to the fire.

1.1. TTC firefighters are paid by TTC and are not under the control of the Texas Forest Service. Because of this they are not to be “staged”. They are either used or not used.

1.2. The TTC representative makes the final determination on use of TTC firefighters. When planning please consider that due to land ownership changes it is likely that TTC firefighters will be limited to working certain parts of the fire.

1.3. The TFS representative has exclusive right to reject or curtail the use of TTC firefighter assistance on a wildfire based on safety concerns, lack of need, improper equipment configuration, or failure to properly execute suppression activities. Rejection or curtailment of TTC firefighter use on a wildfire will be communicated by the TFS representative to the onsite TTC representative.

1.4. As with any firefighter, TTC firefighters and representatives have the right to refuse assignment if it is unsafe or if it exceeds their qualifications or equipment capabilities.

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### **2. DISPATCH AND RESPONSE**

TFS will not directly dispatch TTC firefighters. All dispatching and fire line communications related to TTC firefighters must go through the TTC representative.

2.1. Once dispatched, TTC firefighters are not to be deployed to the fire line without a TTC representative on location.

2.2. Use of TTC firefighters should be limited to mop-up. If necessary to use for initial attack, TTC firefighters, along with the TTC representative, should work in tandem with a TFS dozer or TFS line supervisor. Initial attack operations for TTC firefighters should be limited to working heel and flanks of fire.

2.3. TTC firefighters are being paid by the TTC, and they are not a State of Texas resource, therefore they are not to receive “free” TXDOT fuel when available.

2.4. Release of TTC contractors during or following suppression activities will be the responsibility of the TTC representative, working closely with the TFS representative to ensure effective control of the fire, while also minimizing the cost of the TTC firefighting resource.

### **3. REQUIRED EQUIPMENT**

TTC firefighters and representatives are required to have radio communications with TFS tactical frequencies, and all necessary personal protective equipment including nomex clothing, hardhat, and fire shelter. Additionally firefighting dozers are required to have lights for night operations.

### **4. REQUIRED TRAINING**

Prior to being on the fire line, TTC firefighters and representatives must attend the TFS wildfire training course (1-day). Additionally, within the previous twelve months, TTC firefighters and representatives must have attended a 1-day wildfire refresher course. Wildfire training and refresher courses in other states can be substituted for this requirement. It is the responsibility of the TTC to ensure its firefighters meet these training requirements.
