WEATHER DISCUSSION for EAST TEXAS:

...Hotter, Drier and More Unstable Today...

...Winds increasing from the North Tonight with poor humidity recovery...

A critical fire weather situation will be developing later today and persist into Friday.

A large low pressure trough to the northeast will bring a cold front from the northwest into the northeast Texas – Linden dispatch area Thursday night. Maximum temperatures will increase today ahead of the front contributing to hot, dry and unstable conditions with relative humidity values dipping into the teens in the north. The front will also contribute to poor humidity recoveries Thursday night. Strongest winds will be on Friday with continued low, daytime relative humidity values. North winds on Friday will range from 10 mph south to 15 mph northern dispatch areas which will equate to a critical fire weather watchout situation on Friday. Isolated thunderstorms are possible along the frontal boundary between Linden and Henderson dispatch zones this afternoon as well as the southern portion of the Livingston and Woodville areas.

TODAY/TONIGHT for NORTHEAST TEXAS – Linden Dispatch Area:

...Hotter, Drier and More Unstable Today...

...Winds increasing from the North Tonight with poor humidity recovery...

Hot, Dry and unstable today ahead of an approaching cold front. There will be a wind shift around 1600 from **SOUTH to NORTH**. Strongest winds will be in the evening and then slack a bit after sunset but north winds will continue overnight contributing to poor humidity recovery.

MAX TEMPS: 94-97 / MIN TEMPS: 65-69.

MIN RH: 18-23% / MAX RH: 55-65%.

WINDS: South wind in the afternoon 5 mph turning north around 1600 and increasing to 10 mph.

LAL: 1

CHANCE OF SHOWERS & THUNDERSTORMS: 10% around 1600 until sunset.

OUTLOOK: FRIDAY –

...Critical Fire Weather Day!!!!...

Breezy and very dry. Highs around 83. Lows around 62. North wind around 15 mph becoming northeast and diminishing toward evening. Min RH 16-22%.

TODAY/TONIGHT for EAST TEXAS – Henderson Dispatch Area:

**...Hotter, Drier and More Unstable Today...
...Winds increasing from the North Tonight with poor humidity recovery...**

Hot, Dry and unstable today ahead of an approaching cold front. There will be a wind shift in the late evening hours around 2200 from **SOUTH to NORTH**. Strongest winds will be in the evening and then slack a bit after sunset but north winds will continue overnight contributing to poor humidity recovery.

MAX TEMPS: 96-100 / MIN TEMPS: 65-69.

MIN RH: 22-28% / MAX RH: 60-70%.

WINDS: Variable wind to 5 mph turning south in the afternoon. Winds shifting from **SOUTH to NORTH** around 2200 hours north part with the wind shift progressing southward overnight.

LAL: 1

CHANCE OF SHOWERS & THUNDERSTORMS: 10% around 1600 until sunset.

OUTLOOK: FRIDAY –

...Critical Fire Weather Day!!!!...

Breezy and very dry. Highs around 85. Lows near 64. North wind 15 gusting to 23 mph becoming northeast and diminishing toward evening. Min RH 20-25%.

TODAY/TONIGHT for EAST TEXAS – Livingston/Woodville Dispatch Areas:

**...Hotter and Drier Today and Tonight...
...Winds Increasing from the North Toward Friday Morning...**

Hot and dry today ahead of an approaching cold front due in the area toward very early Friday morning. Isolated showers and thunderstorms will be possible today and tonight.

MAX TEMPS: 98 W to 91 E / MIN TEMPS: 72 N to 80 S.

MIN RH: 28% W to 35% Central to 45% E / MAX RH: 85% N to 100% S.

WINDS: South 5 to 10 mph with gusts to 14 mph along the coast.

LAL: 1-2

CHANCE OF SHOWERS & THUNDERSTORMS: 20%.

OUTLOOK: FRIDAY –

FUEL ASSUMPTIONS: The major fuel types found in the SE Texas Complex are fuel model TU3 (moderate timber understory) or Fire Behavior Prediction System Fuel model 9 and grass fuel model 1. High risk fuels include pine plantations and southern rough brush with yaupon underneath a mature pine canopy. There are also areas with slash from logging operations.

WEATHER SUMMARY Another day with temperatures exceeding 90 degrees in all dispatch zones. RH values will vary from a low of 18 in the Linden Dispatch area to 45% in southeast part of the Livingston/Woodville Dispatch zone. READ the weather forecast—Frontal passage is moving winds in the Linden dispatch area from 5 mph during the burning period to northerly at 10 mph around 1700. Henderson dispatch area will have variable winds switching to the south and the Livingston/Woodville zone will have winds SW 5-9 with gust to 14 influenced by the sea breeze.

SE Texas Complex General Forecast: Today is another day with active fire behavior potential. Live fuel moisture values remain in the critically dry levels. Consumption of all ranges of fuels (1, 10, 100 and 1000 hr) is expected. The fine fuels will support active fire spread today. Probability of ignition will range from 50 to >80% Mop-up is very important to keep the fire from escaping the control lines. Leaf litter and needle cast continues to increase on previous fires increasing the probability of a re-burn. Peak burning period remains from 1200-2100.

Critical fire behavior thresholds (temp >90°, RH < 30%, winds > 10 mph).

Forecasted ERC for Thursday 9/29 Conroe --41(RAWS 415109) Linden -45(RAWS 411102)

Specific:

REBURN, REBURN, REBURN—This potential continues to increase with each day of needle cast.

Due to poor humidity recovery, fires activity can be very active into the evening.

Initial Attack Fires

Direct attack with engines, dozers, and aircraft will be successful when FL is 8' or less. Short range spotting is very probable especially in plantation fires. Long range spotting should be less than 0.1 mile. Fires are expected to actively burn between 1200 and 2100.

NORTHEAST-TEXAS-Linden Dispatch Area

Fine Fuel Moisture: Unshaded 4% Shaded 7%, Probability of Ignition; Unshaded >80% Shaded 50%.

Flame Length (FL): Timber litter, slash and grass— 2' to 6 and up to 10 after the wind increase late in the day

Rate of Spread (ROS): Timber litter and slash – 3-15 chains/hour increasing to 35 chains per hour after the wind shift and increase in winds; Grass 17-20 chains/hour increasing to 60 chains per hour after the increase in winds around 1700.

Spotting Distance: up to 0.1 mile

Initial attack fire size in 1 hour can grow to 30 acres and up to 150 acres after winds increase late in day.

EAST TEXAS-Henderson Dispatch Area

Fine Fuel Moisture: Unshaded 4% Shaded 7%, Probability of Ignition; Unshaded >80% Shaded 50%.

Flame Length (FL): Timber litter, slash and grass— 2-6'

Rate of Spread (ROS): Timber litter and slash – 3-15 chains/hour; Grass 17-20 chains/hour

Spotting Distance: up to 0.1 mile

Initial attack fire size in hour up to 30 acres.

SOUTHEAST TEXAS- Livingston/Woodville Dispatch Area

Fine Fuel Moisture: Unshaded 5% Shaded 8%, Probability of Ignition; Unshaded >70% Shaded 50%.

Flame Length (FL): Timber litter, slash and grass– 2' to 10'

Rate of Spread (ROS): Timber litter and slash – 2-15 chains/hour; Grass 17-20 chains/hour. As much as three times these rates of spread can occur when impacted by the sea breeze.

Spotting Distance: up to 0.1 mile

Initial attack fire size in one hour can exceed 150 acres when influenced by sea breeze winds otherwise around 30 acres.

AIR OPERATIONS: No issues with air operations identified

FIRE BEHAVIOR SAFETY:

Weather conditions continue to dry fuels: *Watch for indicators of change as the fire responds to changing environmental and fuel conditions.*

*For reference 80 chains = 1 mile

Major Hazards and Risks:

Transition Complacency Fatigue

Transition – Lets continue to talk about transition. Communication and coordination are big factors in successful transitions. So are attitude and professionalism. Transition does not mean diminishing danger, risk, or threat. It is a change in management not a change in conditions. Don't relax at transitions. Don't let things go wrong. Remain professional no matter what the environment. Take every assignment seriously.

Complacency – Transitions can lead to complacency for some firefighters. Don't allow yourself to lose focus. Multiple shifts without significant fire activity may lead to complacency. Accidents and injury are more likely to occur when we are disengaged, distracted, and inattentive to the daily mission.

Fatigue – It has been a long season for everyone and we still have time to go. Long term fatigue is a real thing. Take full advantage of off duty time to get needed rest. The 2 to 1 work/rest ratio is for every person assigned to the incident. If you do have to work past this ratio be sure to mitigate by starting later the next shift thus allowing for adequate time off for rest.

Standard Firefighting Order #1. Keep informed of fire weather conditions and forecasts.

Watch Out Situation #15. Wind increases and/or changes direction.
