Communicate planned tactics and strategies to incoming resources using IRPG Briefing Checklist. 4. Limit staging of resources along roadways by promptly providing tactical assignments after briefing. Release excess resources as soon as possible. 5. TFS overhead must establish communications with air resources and maintain control throughout the incident. 6. Always be prepared to justify your tactical decisions.

WEATHER DISCUSSION for EAST TEXAS:

Dry and cool northeast flow at the surface will continue following the cold front passage on Friday. This will continue low relative humidity in the afternoon with areas of poor humidity recovery Saturday night. Northeast winds will also continue although mostly below 10 mph. Near or slightly above normal temperatures and dry conditions will continue from Sunday into Tuesday with high pressure aloft and at the surface maintaining clear skies.

FUEL ASSUMPTIONS: The major fuel types found in the SE Texas Complex are fuel model TU3 (moderate timber understory) or Fire Behavior Prediction System Fuel model 9 and grass fuel model 1. High risk fuels include pine plantations and southern rough brush with yaupon underneath a mature pine canopy. There are also areas with slash from logging operations. Young pine plantations may react similar to a brush model (SH5).

WEATHER SUMMARY Another day of cooler temperatures are forecasted for today. Winds will be lighter than yesterday with NE up to 6 mph in the north, 5-10 central, and NE 5 in the south with gust of 12 north zone, 15 central zone and 10 along the coast. RH will range from the upper teens to mid 20s across all the zones
READ the weather forecast—

SE Texas Complex General Fire Behavior Forecast: Poor RH recovery again last night will allow fire activity to increase early again today. Peak burning period remains from 0900-2200. Live fuel moisture values remain in the critically dry levels. Consumption of all ranges of fuels (1, 10, 100 and 1000 hr) is expected. Fuel conditions along with forecasted weather will support very active fire spread today. Probability of ignition in unshaded fuels is in the 80% range. **Leaf litter and needle cast continues to increase on previous fires increasing the probability of a re-burn. Mop-up** is very important to keep the fire from escaping the control lines. **Lightning fires in the Woodville/Livingston are very likely for the next several days.**

Critical fire behavior thresholds (temp >90°, RH < 30%, winds > 10 mph).

Forecasted ERC for Saturday 10/1 Conroe -47 ↑6 (RAWS 415109) Linden -51 ↑2 (RAWS 411102)

Specific:

Extended burn period for the day with poor humidity recovery last night and tonight. Evaluate suppression tactics in plantations due to predicted flame lengths. Long range spotting distance is reduced from yesterday. Short range spotting in plantations is very likely with probability of ignition at 80%.


Lightning Strikes – Thursdays storm left a trail of lightning strikes across the Livingston Zone. Seventeen new fires, many from lightning, occurred on Friday. There is a high probability that more new fires will develop over the weekend. Fires may occur anywhere...in front of you, behind you, and where you may not be expecting new ignitions. Maintain your situational awareness at all times, but especially if you are engaged on an active fire. Take every assignment seriously.

Pine Plantations – Pine plantations dominate the parts of Texas we are assigned to protect. As you all know, fire behavior in pine plantations can be extreme and our weather conditions for Saturday will contribute to dangerous conditions. Evaluate the situation carefully before you commit your resources. Consider indirect as well as direct suppression strategies before you take action. Fire in pine plantations are fast, hot, and dangerous. Be in the right place at all times when engaged in pine plantations. Review you fire weather and fire behavior forecasts carefully. Take weather observations throughout the day. Keep track of wind and relative humidity.

Long Shifts – Expect fire activity start earlier in the day this weekend. Wind and low RH, along with poor recovery in the night hours, have the potential to create early fire activity. Be prepared for longer more active days. Pay attention to hydration issue throughout the day. Take appropriate breaks. As always, when you are behind the wheel, driving is your job.

Standard Firefighting Order #2. Know what your fire is doing at all times.

Watch Out Situation #4. Unfamiliar with weather and local factors influencing fire behavior.






IAP Day Shift 10/01/2011
