WEATHER DISCUSSION:

...Elevated Fire Weather Danger Friday Afternoon for Gusty Winds and Low Relative Humidity...

Moderate southeast wind will continue ahead of a slow moving cold front moving through west Texas. Winds will again lead to elevated fire weather conditions throughout the day into the evening hours. Wind speeds will be sustained at 12 to 18 mph with max gusts reaching up to 25 mph. The stronger gusts will occur across the western sections of all zones and along the coast. Moisture from the Gulf will generally keep minimum relative humidity above 25% with higher values along and near the coast in Livingston and Woodville.

TODAY/TONIGHT for NORTH – Linden Dispatch Zone:

...Elevated Fire Weather Danger on Friday Afternoon for Gusty Winds and Low Relative Humidity...

MAX TEMPS: 87-91 / MIN TEMPS: 55-63.
MIN RH: 24-30% / MAX RH: 75-85%. Good Recovery.
WINDS: Southeast wind 13-18 mph gusts to 25 mph.
MIXING HEIGHT: 7000 feet.

OUTLOOK: SATURDAY -

Continued breezy and Dry. Highs around 87-91. Lows around 62. Southeast wind 10 to 15 with gusts up to 22 mph. Min RH 30-35%.

TODAY/TONIGHT for CENTRAL – Henderson Dispatch Zone:

...Elevated Fire Weather Danger on Friday Afternoon for Gusty Winds and Low Relative Humidity...

MAX TEMPS: 87-91 / MIN TEMPS: 57-64.
MIN RH: 30-38% / MAX RH: 85-95%....Locally higher in low lying areas. Excellent Recovery.
WINDS: Southeast 11-16 mph gusts to 23 mph.
MIXING HEIGHT: 6000 feet.

OUTLOOK: SATURDAY -

Continued breezy especially west parts of the zone. Dry. Highs around 90. Lows around 60. Southeast wind 10 to 14 mph with gusts up to 22 mph. Min RH 31-38%.

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TODAY/TONIGHT for SOUTH – Livingston/Woodville Dispatch Zone:

Moist flow off the Gulf will bring some morning cloud cover as far north as Longview with broken clouds 1500 feet above ground level in the morning becoming scattered in the afternoon. Cloud cover will be more persistent south toward the coast and Houston with overcast sky in the morning with some sun-breaks in the afternoon. An isolated shower or thunderstorm will be possible especially by afternoon.

MAX TEMPS: 85-90 / MIN TEMPS: 57-63 N and 64-69 S.

MIN RH: 36-43% all areas North from Conroe to Lufkin. Around 45% south of Conroe except 55-60% near the Gulf Coast.

MAX RH: 90-100. Excellent Recovery.

WINDS: Southeast wind 13-18 mph gusts to 25 mph W and near the coast. Locally lower along the Louisiana border. .

Mixing Height: 5500 feet.

LAL: 1

Chance of Thunderstorms: 20% from Madisonville-Cleveland southward.

OUTLOOK: SATURDAY –

Partly Cloudy with a 20% chance of showers and thunderstorms. . Highs 85-90. Lows around 60 North and 70 along the coast. Southeast wind 12 to 15 with gusts up to 22 mph. Min RH 40-48% except near 58% from Interstate 10 to the coast.

FUEL ASSUMPTIONS: The major fuel types found in the SE Texas Complex are fuel model TU3 (moderate timber understory), Fire Behavior Prediction System Fuel model 9 and grass fuel model 1. High risk fuels include pine plantations and southern rough brush with yaupon underneath a mature pine canopy. There are also areas with slash from logging operations. Young pine plantations may react similar to a brush model due to low live fuel moistures.

WEATHER SUMMARY

Take time to READ the weather forecast— Across the zone temps range from 87-91, RH low ranges from 25 north to a low of 55 along the coast. Winds will be 13-18 with gust to 25.

SE Texas Complex General Fire Behavior Forecast: The peak burn period for today will be between 1300-1800. Fuel moistures are still low and ignition of 10 and 100 hour fuels will take place and create mop up and control problems. **Very active** fire behavior can be expected with any ignition that occurs today. Probability of ignition in unshaded fuels will range from 70% in the north to a low of 30% in the south. We will meet the critical fire behavior thresholds in the Linden Dispatch Zone today.

Rate of Spread (ROS): North of I-10 Timber litter(FM9) 10 chains per hour; Grass, plantations and TU3 up to 50 chains/hour

South of I-10 Timber litter (FM9) 5-8 chains/hour; Grass, plantations and TU3 up to 40 chains/hour.

Flame Length (FI): Entire zone: Timber litter and grass– 3'-9', plantations >18'

Maximum Spotting Distance: up to 2000 feet with 25 mph gust.

North and South of I-10 the size of initial attack fires in one hour can grow up to 125 acres in grass, TU3 fuel model and pine plantations; Less than 10 acres in FM9.

AIR OPERATIONS: Wind gust to 25 mph during the day This could impact effectiveness of aircraft support.

Branch	Hazard	Mitigation
All	Indirect Fireline, anchor points, extreme conditions, re-burn potential	Establish LCES. Use Air Attack as lookout if available. Ensure fire line is anchored. All firefighters know current and predicted weather and fire behavior forecast; Line supervisors provide clear, concise briefings. FBAN/IMET to develop weather watch system; Consider at least a two day weather pattern when planning burnout operations. Do not use areas with re-burn potential as safety zones. Ensure that lookout has view of resources constructing fire line. Disengage if conditions are extreme.
All	Thunder storms and tornados	Establish and maintain LCES. Refer to IRPG for lightning safety. Ensure all firefighters know current and predicted weather and fire behavior forecast. Contact IMET for current satellite weather information. Monitor NOAA weather channel. Do not try to outrun a tornado. Abandon your vehicle and seek shelter in the interior of a building. Get more local information at your staging area.
All	Downhill fire line	Use downhill check list in IRPG before engaging in downhill line construction. Bring fire with you. Ensure lookout can see entire area.
All	Night operations	Use blinking or strobe lights or glow sticks on back of helmets or backpack so as to be seen by equipment operators. Maintain 200 feet clearance in front of dozers and 100 feet behind. Disengage if conditions are present that are unsafe such as rough steep terrain, gullies, etc.
All	Insects, bees, snakes	Look up, look down, look around. Use insect repellent with deet on skin (not on nomex). Permethrin can be used on nomex clothing. Do not try to catch or kill snakes. Bees – cover head and face, seek shelter in building or cab of vehicle.
All	Hazardous materials	Recognize, communicate and avoid hazmat situations. Utilize Hazmat Response Teams. Utilize pg 24-26 of IRPG. Line personnel are required to have an oil/gas infrastructure hazard briefing by safety upon arriving for duty. Avoid trash dumps in line construction and avoid smoke from trash dumps. Cover surface pipelines with dirt before tracking over with dozers.
All	Driving	Address defensive driving at briefings. Observe all traffic signs and signals and speed limits. Use spotter when backing vehicles. Watch out for wildlife on highways. Use care when driving off road for sharp rocks and thorns that can cause flat tires. Know where your jack and spare are located. Maintain safe following distances. Cross railroad tracks only at designated crossing locations. Beware of raised railroad crossings and high centering low boys. Be aware of bridge limitations with the heavy equipment haulers. Use traffic control when engines or transports are parked on public roads or park and unload well off travel surface. Be alert to traffic when suppressing fire along public roads. Provide for traffic control.
All	Frontal assault on fires	Avoid frontal assault at all times. Use anchor and flank tactics to stop the head. Attack from the black.
All	High temperatures, dehydration	Drink fluids before, during and after shifts. Try to limit time spent in direct sunlight. Use sun block and lip balm. Pace yourself and keep an eye out for fellow firefighters. Observe work rest guidelines. Limit or avoid caffeine intake.
All	Multiple aircraft	Utilize Air Attack to coordinate aircraft use. Monitor and use air to ground frequency. Stay clear of water and retardant drops. Ensure that firefighters know how to program radios to scan function. Establish LCES.
All	WUI	Refer to Wildland Urban Interface watchout situations in IRPG.
All	Equipment operations	Incident protocols require 200' distance if working in front of the dozer and 100' if following. Use blinking or strobe lights or light sticks on back of helmet or backpack at night. Do not work downslope of heavy equipment. Establish communications with operator.
All	Hazardous plants	Avoid cactus, cat claw, mesquite. Remove thorns or needles as soon as possible. Disinfect wounds. Seek medical treatment if needed. Notify medical unit leader and comp/claims at ICP.
All	Pipelines	Look up look down look around. Lightly blade or use hand crews to construct fireline across pipelines. Notify Texas Commission on Environmental Quality 1-800-255-3924 on all fires when Oilfield operations are present.

All	Cyanide ejectors (predator control devices)	Main gates to ranches where located are signed at all gates with red and white signs. Ejector sites are marked with red and white signs. Ejectors are located on the ground with a piece of bait connected to them. Avoid the hazard.
All	Boggy Conditions	Establish LECS; Look up, Look down, Look around; ensure fireline is anchored; ensure all firefighters know current weather, predicted weather and fire behavior.
All	Unburned areas	Establish LCES; Look Up, Look Down, Look Around; Use air attack as lookout when available; ensure fireline is anchored; all firefighters know current weather and predicted weather and fire behavior.
All	Terrain	Establish LCES; Look Up, Look Down, Look Around; Use air attack as lookout when available; keep informed on weather and fire behavior; carry the black when possible, ensure any burnout operations have been clearly communicated to all prior to burning; use downhill checklist in IRPG; line supervisors will provide clear, concise briefings; use swamper if possible to flag line. Be aware of loose rocks and rough terrain, watch footing.
All	Border Security	Establish LCES: Review border security DVD; Line supervisors will provide clear, concise briefings.
All	Air Operations	Establish communications air to ground with incident aircraft on your fire; stay safe distance from drop zones of tankers and helicopters; ensure that VFD's also have communication with aircraft or someone who does.
All	Communications	Ensure that all personnel have radios cloned to incident communications plan. Line supervisors need to ensure that all personnel are able to scan appropriate channels in hand held radios.
All	Multiple Jurisdiction	Resources from multiple jurisdictions frequently respond to the same fire. Coordination and communication between all agencies is critical to efficient and effective operations.
All	Structure Protection	Utilize VFD's for structure protection. Brief personnel on WUI hazards.
All	Work/Rest ratio	If IA resources exceed 2 to 1 work/rest ratio, mitigate by starting next operational cycle later to ensure adequate rest is taken.
All	Domestic and Wild Animals	Use caution around both domestic and wild animals. Cattle and horses can be a hazard on all roads. Feral hogs and deer can cause serious damage to vehicles. Wild animals can be dangerous if cornered. Avoid sick or dead animals, rabies could be present.
All	Power lines and fences	Power lines and fences are both a driving and walking hazard. Burnt poles can become a snag like hazard. Treat all downed power lines as charged and use caution when on foot especially at night. Fences and down lines can become a serious tripping hazard.
All	Pine Plantations (extreme fire behavior)	Establish LCES prior to engaging. Ensure fireline is anchored. Use air attack if available. All resources need to be informed prior to burnout. Holding resources are necessary due to drought conditions. Plow no further than you can hold behind. Be prepared to disengage if conditions are or become extreme.

Call ground support. We will help you with proper paper work and locations to have work done.

If repair is minor and does not affect the vehicles ability to safely work on the fire, wait for down time and use "fleet card" to have work done.

If it affects the vehicles' ability to operate safely. Call ground support. Fill out Modified 213 with explanation of damage how it happened and estimated cost, also have next line supervisor (Division Sup, Task Force Leader etc.) include a statement as to whether or not the damage was fire related. Have repairs done BUT remember that there is no guarantee that the incident will pay for the damage until and unless an S# is approved. You can either use "fleet card" or go to one of the "standing S#'s " and have work done there.

If you use the "fleet card" remember to check with home unit it you expect the cost to exceed per approved maximums.

RENTALS:

Call Ground Support. If practical take vehicle to a Firestone station and advise them that it is an Enterprise rental on TFS Contract. They know how to process.

If no Firestone station is available, you can take to any shop and have them to call the 800# on the back of the rental agreement for Enterprise to arrange payment.






