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### WEATHER DISCUSSION:

Moist southerly flow will continue aloft ahead of a dissipating trough across eastern Texas this morning but will shift southwesterly and become somewhat drier in the late afternoon. Scattered showers and isolated thunderstorms will accompany this dissipating trough. Wind speeds will be sustained at under 10 mph. Max gusts reaching up to 20 mph are possible with any showers. What little winds there will be will shift from south over eastern areas in the morning to westerly in the afternoon. There will be localized areas of rainfall up to .50 of an inch, but most areas will receive less than 0.15 of an inch.

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### TODAY/TONIGHT for NORTH – Linden Dispatch Zone:

WEATHER: Mostly cloudy in the morning all areas with isolated showers and thunderstorms. By afternoon the western half will become partly cloudy while mostly cloudy conditions with isolated showers continue over the eastern half. Aviation impacts will be low cloud ceilings down to 1000 ft over the zone before scattering and lifting by 1300LST over western portions while low clouds likely to continue over eastern portions..

MAX TEMPS: 80-83 / MIN TEMPS: 62-67.

MIN RH: 55-60% except 65-75% where heavy rain occurred. MAX RH: 85-95%. Excellent recovery.

WINDS: Southeast wind less than 10 mph, becoming light and variable during the afternoon. \*\*\*Winds will be locally higher and variable near showers and thunderstorms\*\*\*

MIXING HEIGHT: 3000 feet.

CHANCE OF THUNDERSTORMS: 20%

LAL: 2

### OUTLOOK: TUESDAY -

Partly cloudy with a 20% chance of showers in the afternoon...eastern portions. Highs around 83. Light and variable winds 3-6 mph with gusts up to 12 mph. Min RH 52-57%.

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### TODAY/TONIGHT for CENTRAL – Henderson Dispatch Zone:

WEATHER: Mostly cloudy in the morning all areas with isolated showers and thunderstorms. By afternoon the western half will become partly cloudy while mostly cloudy conditions with isolated showers continue over the eastern half. Aviation impacts will be low cloud ceilings down to 1000 ft over the zone before scattering and lifting by 1100 LST.

MAX TEMPS: 82-85 / MIN TEMPS: 61-66.

MIN RH: 55-60% except 65-75% where heavy rain occurred. MAX RH: 85-95%. Excellent recovery.

WINDS: Southeast wind less than 10 mph, becoming light and variable during the afternoon. \*\*\*Winds will be locally higher and variable near showers and thunderstorms\*\*\*

MIXING HEIGHT: 4000 feet.

CHANCE OF THUNDERSTORMS: 10%

### OUTLOOK: TUESDAY –

Partly cloudy with a 10% chance of showers and thunderstorms in the afternoon. Highs around 84. Light and variable winds 3-6 mph with gusts up to 12 mph. Min RH 49-54%.

WEATHER: Mostly cloudy, with scattered showers and isolated thunderstorms during the afternoon and evening. Aviation impacts will be low cloud ceilings down to 1000 ft across the west.

MAX TEMPS: 84-86 / MIN TEMPS: 64-68 N and 68-72 S.

MIN RH: 50-58%...except 65-75% where heavy rain occurred. MAX RH: 90-95. Excellent recovery.

WINDS: Light and variable winds 3-6 mph local gusts to 14 mph. \*\*\*Winds will be locally higher and variable near showers and thunderstorms\*\*\*

High risk fuels include pine plantations and southern rough brush with yaupon underneath a mature pine canopy. There are also areas with slash from logging operations. Young pine plantations may react similar to a brush model due to low live fuel moistures.</p>

# TORNADO EVACUATION PLAN

## Southeast Texas Fire Complex

### **TORNADO EVACUATION ORDERS:**

If a tornado evacuation is ordered by the Incident Commander, incident personnel will be instructed as follows:

#### At Lufkin ICP

1) return to motel accommodations for shelter

or

2) shelter in-place in the IC Building, directly south of the Plans-Operations-Logistics building.

#### Outside of Lufkin ICP

1) return to their motel accommodations for shelter

or

2) shelter as directed by chief of party

The IMET will be responsible for informing the Incident Commanders if a tornado WATCH or tornado WARNING has been issued for our area.

When the Incident Commander issues the order for evacuation the following communication will occur:

1) The Incident Commander will inform Command and General Staff and initiate our emergency communication system of phone calls and emails.

2) Command and General Staff will inform all team members across the incident.

### **TORNADO WATCH VS. WARNING:**

A tornado WATCH is when conditions are favorable for tornado development. A WATCH is typically issued as much as 6 hours in advance of a possible WARNING.

A tornado WARNING is when a tornado has been located on radar and a threat is imminent. Seek shelter immediately. Do not expect to see the tornado and then escape. A WARNING may be issued in as little as 1 or 2 minutes in advance of tornado contact.

### **ACCOUNTABILITY:**

Each Command and General Staff member is responsible for knowing where team members are during and following an evacuation incident.

### **COMMUNICATIONS PLAN:**

1. Maintain communication with your supervisor or team leader at all times.
2. Use cell phones and tactical channel 'R8 Fire' to communicate during and after the incident.

### **PREPARATIONS:**

- Maintain a minimum of 48 hour supply of MRE's for the population of the Southeast Texas Fire Complex ICP . (3 MRE's per person per day)
- Maintain a minimum of 48 hours supply of drinking water for the anticipated population of the Southeast Texas Fire Complex ICP. (1 Gal. per person per day)
- All personnel maintain a minimum of 3/4 tank of gas in all vehicles at all times.
- Ensure IC, Command and General Staff has a current list of team members and their cell phone numbers.

### **SAFE PRACTICES FOR TORNADOS:**

1. Seek shelter in basement or interior room on the lower level
2. Stay away from windows, doors, and outside walls. Do not open windows.
3. If not sheltered, lie flat in a ditch or low area with hands covering your head.
4. Avoid buildings with wide span roofs, metal buildings, and any structure that was not built in place.
5. If in a vehicle, get out and seek shelter in a ditch.

### **AFTER THE STORM:**

1. Stay in your protected area until released by your staff.
2. Assist in accounting for all team members.
3. Avoid downed power lines and any water in which they may be lying.
4. Beware of weakened bridges and washed out roads.
5. Watch for broken limbs on trees and damaged overhanging structures.
6. Do not drink tap water or prepare food with tap water until you are certain it is not contaminated.

Be sure to provide personal contact information on the ATR so that the DEMOB UNIT can call in order to give you your flight arrangements. It is expensive and time consuming to change flight arrangements once they have been made, so make sure to provide the correct information on the ATR.


## **IMPORTANT SHUTTLE INFORMATION**

Airport shuttle from the ICP leaves at 0800 and 1800.

If your flight departs before Noon on your travel day, you **MUST** start your DEMOB PROCESS by 1600 on your last work day (the day before your travel day). You will then be transported by the 1800 airport shuttle to a motel in the vicinity of the airport, where you will rest overnight. The motel will provide you a ride to the airport the next morning. You should arrange to be at the airport two hours in advance of your departure time.

If your flight departs after Noon on your travel day, you should start your demob process the evening of your last work day. The next morning, the 0800 airport shuttle will deliver you to the airport in time for your departure flight.

2. Fill in your name, O or E Number, Position, Assignment location, **your cell phone number**, your first day of work on the line, your 14th day on shift, how many shifts (1-14) you are available to extend, last day on shift if the extension is approved and the date you will demob and travel. Approvals of 8-14 additional working days require two days of R&R before your 22<sup>nd</sup> shift following Section Chief, Regional Fire Coordinator, IC and home unit concurrence.

**Note: If you are filling out an extension form for an engine or dozer crew, you must list the name and the request number for each member of the crew who is requesting an extension.**

3. **Sign the form** on the second line (labeled “Resource Signature”).
4. Fill in the fax number, office number, and name of your supervisor at your home unit on the bottom of the form.
5. Deliver or fax the form to the Operations/Resources **fax number at 936-634-8239**
6. At the Lufkin ICP, we will obtain the signature of the Section Chief and the IC and fax it to your home unit. The home unit will get with the resource’s supervisor for approval/disapproval signature and fax it back to Lufkin Demob. As this process will take a day or two, we ask you to start this process five days prior to your 14th day on shift. This is necessary because of the number of approvals required and time needed to order replacement resources if the extension request is denied.
7. After all the required signatures are obtained, we will notify you via your contact phone number and notify the section for which you work.





IAP Day Shift 10/10/2011


