WEATHER DISCUSSION:

A westerly flow aloft will tend to gradually dry the air mass across the region. Residual moisture across northern areas will be sufficient enough for a slight chance of light rain showers across the Linden zone today while it should be dry elsewhere. A weak cold front will move across Linden and northern portions of Henderson zones Wednesday bringing another threat of showers and isolated thunderstorms. In the wake of this front a ridge of high pressure will build in over the region for the end of the week. Generally clear skies with a trend of lowering RHs will be the main message with RH readings into the 20s by Friday and Saturday. Winds will continue to be light.

TODAY/TONIGHT for NORTH – Linden Dispatch Zone:

WEATHER: Partly cloudy with isolated afternoon light rain showers. Aviation impacts will be scattered low cloud ceilings down to 3000 ft before scattering and lifting by 1100 LST.

MAX TEMPS: 84-87 / MIN TEMPS: 61-65.

MIN RH: 41-47% MAX RH: 75-85%. Excellent recovery.

WINDS: Light and variable. ***Winds will be locally higher and variable near showers and thunderstorms***

MIXING HEIGHT: 9000 feet.

CHANCE OF THUNDERSTORMS: 10%

LAL: 1

OUTLOOK: WEDNESDAY -

Mostly cloudy with a 30% chance of showers and thunderstorms in the afternoon...mainly eastern portions. Highs around 83. Light and variable winds 3-6 mph with gusts up to 12 mph. Min RH 40%.

Communication Responsibilities

Successful incidents have good communications. Poor communications are a major risk to safe and effective incident management.

All firefighters have five communication responsibilities:

Brief others as needed.

Debrief your actions.

Communicate hazards to others.

Acknowledge messages.

Ask if you do not know.

These are simple and basic, but very complete. How are you doing with these?

Does necessary communication decline just because fire activity declines?

What can you do to maintain good communications?

TORNADO EVACUATION PLAN

Southeast Texas Fire Complex

TORNADO EVACUATION ORDERS:

If a tornado evacuation is ordered by the Incident Commander, incident personnel will be instructed as follows:

At Lufkin ICP

1) return to motel accommodations for shelter

or

2) shelter in-place in the IC Building, directly south of the Plans-Operations-Logistics building.

Outside of Lufkin ICP

1) return to their motel accommodations for shelter

or

2) shelter as directed by chief of party

The IMET will be responsible for informing the Incident Commanders if a tornado WATCH or tornado WARNING has been issued for our area.

When the Incident Commander issues the order for evacuation the following communication will occur:

1) The Incident Commander will inform Command and General Staff and initiate our emergency communication system of phone calls and emails.

2) Command and General Staff will inform all team members across the incident.

TORNADO WATCH VS. WARNING:

A tornado WATCH is when conditions are favorable for tornado development. A WATCH is typically issued as much as 6 hours in advance of a possible WARNING.

A tornado WARNING is when a tornado has been located on radar and a threat is imminent. Seek shelter immediately. Do not expect to see the tornado and then escape. A WARNING may be issued in as little as 1 or 2 minutes in advance of tornado contact.

ACCOUNTABILITY:

Each Command and General Staff member is responsible for knowing where team members are during and following an evacuation incident.

COMMUNICATIONS PLAN:

1. Maintain communication with your supervisor or team leader at all times.
2. Use cell phones and tactical channel 'R8 Fire' to communicate during and after the incident.

PREPARATIONS:

- Maintain a minimum of 48 hour supply of MRE's for the population of the Southeast Texas Fire Complex ICP . (3 MRE's per person per day)
- Maintain a minimum of 48 hours supply of drinking water for the anticipated population of the Southeast Texas Fire Complex ICP. (1 Gal. per person per day)
- All personnel maintain a minimum of 3/4 tank of gas in all vehicles at all times.
- Ensure IC, Command and General Staff has a current list of team members and their cell phone numbers.

SAFE PRACTICES FOR TORNADOS:

1. Seek shelter in basement or interior room on the lower level
2. Stay away from windows, doors, and outside walls. Do not open windows.
3. If not sheltered, lie flat in a ditch or low area with hands covering your head.
4. Avoid buildings with wide span roofs, metal buildings, and any structure that was not built in place.
5. If in a vehicle, get out and seek shelter in a ditch.

AFTER THE STORM:

1. Stay in your protected area until released by your staff.
2. Assist in accounting for all team members.
3. Avoid downed power lines and any water in which they may be lying.
4. Beware of weakened bridges and washed out roads.
5. Watch for broken limbs on trees and damaged overhanging structures.
6. Do not drink tap water or prepare food with tap water until you are certain it is not contaminated.

DEMOB PROCEDURES FOR THOSE THAT TRAVEL BY AIR

Check the Demob list in the IAP. Verify with your supervisor that your TRAVEL DAY is correct. If not, coordinate with the DEMOB UNIT. Five days prior to your TRAVEL DAY, submit the completed “Air Travel Request” (ATR) to the DEMOB UNIT in person or by FAX (936-632-1372). The ATR is provided in the IAPs or through the DEMOB UNIT. Be sure to provide personal contact information on the ATR so that the DEMOB UNIT can call in order to give you your flight arrangements. It is expensive and time consuming to change flight arrangements once they have been made, so make sure to provide the correct information on the ATR.

IMPORTANT SHUTTLE INFORMATION

Airport shuttle from the ICP leaves at 0800 and 1800.

If your flight departs before Noon on your travel day, you **MUST** start your DEMOB PROCESS by 1600 on your last work day (the day before your travel day). You will then be transported by the 1800 airport shuttle to a motel in the vicinity of the airport, where you will rest overnight. The motel will provide you a ride to the airport the next morning. You should arrange to be at the airport two hours in advance of your departure time.

If your flight departs after Noon on your travel day, you should start your demob process the evening of your last work day. The next morning, the 0800 airport shuttle will deliver you to the airport in time for your departure flight.






