WEATHER DISCUSSION: ...LOCALLY BREEZY WEDNESDAY...

An approaching frontal system will create locally breezy conditions over the East Branch today. Expect late-morning and afternoon wind gusts up to 25 mph in many areas today. The cold front will move into extreme Northwest Linden zone around 0400 Thursday morning. Some pre-frontal precipitation could begin as early Wednesday evening in Northern Linden zone. The front should reach Henderson zone around 1000 Thursday and into the southern areas in the afternoon. There will be a threat of isolated thunderstorms just ahead and with the front. Showers continue over the entire area Thursday night. Rainfall amounts up to two-tenths are possible in the Linden zone Wednesday night, decreasing to near zero in the far south. Thursday amounts are likely to be 0.25 to 0.75 inches with the higher amounts favoring Linden and Eastern Henderson zones. Much cooler air follows the front Thursday night and Friday. It looks dry Saturday.

TODAY/TONIGHT for NORTH – Linden Dispatch Zone:

WEATHER: Partly cloudy in the morning then mostly cloudy. A slight chance of late-day showers and thunderstorms northwest section.

MAX TEMPS: 77-84 / **MIN TEMPS:** 48-58, warmest south.

MIN RH: 45-55% but to 60% far north. **MAX RH:** Above 85%. Excellent recovery.

WINDS: South 6-12 mph with gusts to 20 mph. SW wind in the afternoon 9-16 mph with gusts up to 25 mph.

HAINES INDEX: 4. **MIXING HEIGHT:** 5000-6000 ft.

OUTLOOK: THURSDAY

Showers and a chance of thunderstorms. Highs in the 50s. Min RH 65-80%. North wind 8-14 mph with gusts to 22 mph. Rainfall amounts 0.50 to 0.75 inches.

TODAY/TONIGHT for CENTRAL – Henderson Dispatch Zone:

WEATHER: Partly cloudy in the morning then mostly cloudy.

MAX TEMPS: 79-84 / **MIN TEMPS:** 57-63.

MIN RH: 45-55%. **MAX RH:** Above 85%. Excellent recovery.

WINDS: South 6-12 mph with gusts to 20 mph.

HAINES INDEX: 4. **MIXING HEIGHT:** 5000-6000 ft.

OUTLOOK: THURSDAY

Scattered morning showers with a slight chance of thunderstorms. Showers likely and a chance of thunderstorms in the afternoon. Highs in the 60s, occurring in the morning. Min RH 60-75%. SW-W 5-10 mph early then NW-N 8-15 mph with gusts to 25 mph.

TODAY/TONIGHT for SOUTH – Livingston/Woodville Dispatch Zone:

WEATHER: Partly cloudy. Patchy morning fog. Increasing clouds in the afternoon.

MAX TEMPS: 80-85 / **MIN TEMPS:** 59-66

MIN RH: 43-53% / **MAX RH:** 80-100%. Good to Excellent recovery.

WINDS: South 6-11 mph. Gusts up to 18 mph.

HAINES INDEX: 4 **MIXING HEIGHT:** 4500-5500 ft.

OUTLOOK: THURSDAY

Mostly cloudy in the morning with a chance of showers and a slight chance of thunderstorms. Scattered showers and a chance of thunderstorms in the afternoon. Highs 65-75, but turning cooler mid to late afternoon. Min RH 55-70%, but rising in the afternoon. SW 7-14 mph with gusts to 25 mph, becoming W-NW mid to late in the day.

FUEL ASSUMPTIONS: The major fuel types found in the SE Texas Complex are fuel model TU3 (moderate timber understory), Fire Behavior Prediction System Fuel model 9 and grass fuel model 1. High risk fuels include pine plantations and southern rough brush with yaupon underneath a mature pine canopy. Young pine plantations may react similar to a brush model due to low live fuel moistures. There are also areas with slash from logging operations.

WEATHER SUMMARY: Also refer to Weather Forecast: Approaching frontal system makes for breezy conditions. The front should enter Linden Zone overnight Wednesday with associated rain/thunderstorms, and continuing Thursday southward to the gulf, with rain continuing to be possible throughout Thursday, across all zones.

SE Texas Complex General Fire Behavior Forecast: Drought condition still persist across the zone. Live fuel moistures continue to be extremely low making the live scrubs and trees available to burn. Be very cautious when critical fire behavior thresholds are exceeded. When thresholds are exceeded fires will become very resistant to control with ground resources and will require the combination of aerial and ground resources to be effective in controlling fires.

**Critical fire behavior thresholds: (Temp >90°, RH < 30%, Winds > 10 mph).
Threshold for Winds met in all zones**

Specific:

Linden, Henderson, Livingston and Woodville Dispatch Zones

Grass fuels are cured and will support high rates of spread. High risk fuels include pine plantations and southern rough brush with yaupon underneath a mature pine canopy. Fire will easily spread into the canopy when latter fuels are present; expect long range spotting when this occurs.

Windy conditions may offer more ignition sources (power lines) – but Starts & Spots will be lessened as the Probability of Ignition decreases due to cloudy conditions and raise in RHs. POIs might not rise above 25% as the clouds fill in.

One hour fine dead fuel moisture might get down to 8% in north & 7% in the south. 100 & 1000 hour fuels are ranging 12 to 18%. KBDI range: 450 (2 counties) - 730, with only 10 counties over 700; Most of the counties are above 575.

Extensive mop up is still required. Most spotting is well less than 100 feet, but could get under rare circumstances up to predicted.

ERCs remain near 90th percentile. Forecasted ERC: Linden ERC 37 (90%-37/97%-40), Conroe ERC 29 (90%-34/97%-38)

AIR OPERATIONS: Possible coastal fog first thing burning off by 0900-1000. Wind gusts.

FIRE BEHAVIOR SAFETY: Stay alert, weather is changing.

All	Indirect Fireline, anchor points, extreme conditions, re-burn potential	Establish LCES. Use Air Attack as lookout if available. Ensure fire line is anchored. All firefighters know current and predicted weather and fire behavior forecast as well as review the Pocket Card for your work area; Line supervisors provide clear, concise briefings. FBAN/IMET to develop weather watch system; Consider at least a two day weather pattern when planning burnout operations. Do not use areas with re-burn potential as safety zones. Ensure that lookout has view of resources constructing fire line. Disengage if conditions are extreme.
All	Thunder storms and tornados	Establish and maintain LCES. Refer to IRPG for lightning safety. Ensure all firefighters know current and predicted weather and fire behavior forecast. Contact IMET for current satellite weather information. Monitor NOAA weather channel. Do not try to outrun a tornado. Abandon your vehicle and seek shelter in the interior of a building. Get more local information at your staging area.
All	Night operations	Use blinking or strobe lights or glow sticks on back of helmets or backpack so as to be seen by equipment operators. Maintain 200 feet or 2.5 times the tree height clearance in front of dozers. Disengage if conditions are present that are unsafe such as rough steep terrain, gullies, etc.
All	Insects, bees, snakes	Look up, look down, look around. Use insect repellent with deet on skin (not on nomex). Permethrin can be used on nomex clothing. Try to identify the snake, but do not try to catch or kill the snake. Different snakes have different anti-venom. Bees – cover head and face, seek shelter in building or cab of vehicle.
All	Hazardous materials	Recognize, communicate and avoid hazmat situations. Utilize Hazmat Response Teams. Utilize pg 24-26 of IRPG. Line personnel are required to have an oil/gas infrastructure hazard briefing by safety upon arriving for duty. Avoid trash dumps in line construction and avoid smoke from trash dumps. Cover surface pipelines with dirt before tracking over with dozers.
All	Driving	Address defensive driving at briefings. Observe all traffic signs and signals and speed limits. Use spotter when backing vehicles. Watch out for wildlife on highways. Use care when driving off road for sharp rocks and thorns that can cause flat tires. Know where your jack and spare are located. Maintain safe following distances. Cross railroad tracks only at designated crossing locations. Beware of raised railroad crossings and high centering low boys. Be aware of bridge limitations with the heavy equipment haulers. Beware of distracted drivers when approaching the incident site.
All	Frontal assault on fires	Avoid frontal assault at all times. Use anchor and flank tactics to stop the head. Attack from the black.
All	High temperatures, dehydration	Drink fluids before, during and after shifts. Try to limit time spent in direct sunlight. Use sun block and lip balm. Pace yourself and keep an eye out for fellow firefighters. Observe work rest guidelines. Limit or avoid caffeine intake. It is recommended that FFTR's drink 1 qt of water per hour. Gatorade should be consumed at a 3 to 1 ratio.
All	Working along Highways	If traffic flow is affected by the incident contact the jurisdictional law enforcement agency for assistance. Conduct all operations as far from roadway as possible. When working in traffic & not involved with fire suppression, high visibility vests must be worn. Park all vehicles on the same side of road utilizing vehicles with warning lights on both ends of the Task Force. Exit vehicle away from traffic if practical. Post lookouts to watch for and control traffic in both directions. Use road flares or other traffic warning signs. Operate pumps from the non-traffic side. Keep all hose, fire tools & equipment out of traffic lanes.
All	Multiple aircraft	Utilize Air Attack to coordinate aircraft use. Monitor and use air to ground frequency. Stay clear of water and retardant drops. Ensure that firefighters know how to program radios to scan function. Establish LCES.

All	WUI/Structure Protection	Never commit to stay & protect a structure without a safety zone for firefighters & equipment. Firefighters with a safety zone can safely defend structures with some challenges. Refer to Wildland Urban Interface watch-out situations in IRPG (Page 10). Beware of panicked public during evacuations as well as pets during size up & triage. Beware of Haz-Mat anytime you are fighting fire near structures. Site considerations include; Adequate safety zone based on fire behavior predictions, Have lookout and communications, Have adequate defensible space. Utilize VFD's for structure protection.
All	Equipment operations	Incident protocols require 200' or 2.5 times the tree height distance if working around heavy equipment. Use blinking or strobe lights or light sticks on back of helmet or backpack at night. Do not work down slope of heavy equipment. Establish communications with operator.
All	Hazardous plants	Avoid cactus, cat claw, mesquite, and poison ivy. Remove thorns or needles as soon as possible. Disinfect wounds. Seek medical treatment if needed. Notify medical unit leader and comp/claims at ICP.
All	Pipelines	Look up look down look around. Lightly blade or use hand crews to construct fireline across pipelines. Notify Texas Commission on Environmental Quality 1-800-255-3924 on all fires when Oilfield operations are present.
All	Cyanide ejectors (predator control devices)	Main gates to ranches where located are signed at all gates with red and white signs. Ejector sites are marked with red and white signs. Ejectors are located on the ground with a piece of bait connected to them. Avoid the hazard.
All	Boggy Conditions	Establish LECS; Look up, Look down, Look around; ensure fireline is anchored; ensure all firefighters know current weather, predicted weather and fire behavior.
All	Unburned areas	Establish LCES; Look Up, Look Down, Look Around; Use air attack as lookout when available; ensure fireline is anchored; all firefighters know current weather and predicted weather and fire behavior.
All	Terrain	Establish LCES; Look Up, Look Down, Look Around; Use air attack as lookout when available; keep informed on weather and fire behavior; carry the black when possible, ensure any burnout operations have been clearly communicated to all prior to burning; use downhill checklist in IRPG; line supervisors will provide clear, concise briefings; use swamper if possible to flag line. Be aware of loose rocks and rough terrain, watch footing.
All	Air Operations	Establish communications air to ground with incident aircraft on your fire; stay safe distance from drop zones of tankers and helicopters; ensure that VFD's also have communication with aircraft or are with someone who does.
All	Communications	Ensure that all personnel have radios cloned to incident communications plan. Line supervisors need to ensure that all personnel are able to scan appropriate channels in hand held radios.
All	Multiple Jurisdiction	Resources from multiple jurisdictions frequently respond to the same fire. Coordination and communication between all agencies is critical to efficient and effective operations.
All	Work/Rest ratio	If IA resources exceed 2 to 1 work/rest ratio, mitigate by starting next operational cycle later to ensure adequate rest is taken.
All	Domestic and Wild Animals	Use caution around both domestic and wild animals. Cattle and horses can be a hazard on all roads. Feral hogs and deer can cause serious damage to vehicles. Wild animals can be dangerous if cornered. Avoid sick or dead animals, rabies could be present.
All	Power lines and fences	Power lines and fences are both a driving and walking hazard. Burnt poles can become a snag like hazard. Treat all downed power lines as charged and use caution when on foot especially at night. Fences and down lines can become a serious tripping hazard.
All	Pine Plantations (extreme fire behavior)	Establish LCES prior to engaging. Ensure fireline is anchored. Use air attack if available. All resources need to be informed prior to burnout. Holding resources are necessary due to drought conditions. Plow no further than you can hold behind. Be prepared to disengage if conditions are or become extreme.
All	Snags	Hazard trees, both dead and live green trees are a common risk encountered on our fires. All firefighters should frequently survey their work area for potential hazard trees. Eliminate hazards with qualified sawyers or designating "No Work Zones". Consider modifying suppression tactics, posting lookouts, modifying travel routes, and being aware of wind conditions and aerial resource work.

DEMOB PROCEDURES FOR THOSE THAT TRAVEL BY AIR

Check the Demob list in the IAP. Verify with your supervisor that your TRAVEL DAY is correct. If not, coordinate with the DEMOB UNIT. Five days prior to your TRAVEL DAY, submit the completed "Air Travel Request" (ATR) to the DEMOB UNIT in person or by FAX (936-632-1372). The ATR is provided in the IAPs or through the DEMOB UNIT. Be sure to provide personal contact information on the ATR so that the DEMOB UNIT can call in order to give you your flight arrangements. It is expensive and time consuming to change flight arrangements once they have been made, so make sure to provide the correct information on the ATR.

IMPORTANT SHUTTLE INFORMATION

Airport shuttle from the ICP leaves at 0800 and 1800.

If your flight departs before Noon on your travel day, you **MUST** start your DEMOB PROCESS by 1600 on your last work day (the day before your travel day). You will then be transported by the 1800 airport shuttle to a motel in the vicinity of the airport, where you will rest overnight.

The motel will provide you a ride to the airport the next morning. You should arrange to be at the airport two hours in advance of your departure time.

If your flight departs after Noon on your travel day, you should start your demob process the evening of your last work day. The next morning, the 0800 airport shuttle will deliver you to the airport in time for your departure flight.


